Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Baylor College of Medicine Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our ethical responsibilities in accordance with the ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the Financial Statements section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgement made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. - Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

Note 1 - Description of Plan

General

The Baylor College of Medicine Retirement Plan (the Plan) was established by the Baylor College of Medicine (the College) to provide employees with additional savings for retirement on a tax deferred basis. The Plan is a defined contribution retirement plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). The following summary is provided for general information purposes only. Unless otherwise noted, this information is as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024. Participants should refer to the Plan document for more complete information.

Administration

The Board of Trustees has appointed the College's Sr. Vice President for Finance and CFO to serve as Trustee for the Plan. The Plan is administered by the Benefits Administrative Committee (the Committee) consisting of the Trustee and seven employees of the College. The Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan and determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance. The Committee has appointed a Plan Administrator to coordinate the day-to-day administration of the Plan. Fidelity Management Trust Company, Lincoln National Life Insurance Company, Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association of America (TIAA) and College Retirement Equities Fund (CREF) are the Custodians of the Plan's assets. The Custodians hold all of the Plan's assets and execute transactions. Fidelity Workplace Services LLL, TIAA and Lincoln National Life Insurance Company are the recordkeepers for the Plan.

Eligibility

The Plan is available to all covered employees of the College who are at least 18 years of age. Excluded employees include union employees, post-doctoral fellows, residents, students, adjunct professors, visiting professors, leased employees, student helpers and project interns. Employees are automatically enrolled after satisfying the eligibility requirements.

Contributions

Effective January 1, 2024, the employer contributes 4% of base annual earnings, along with a 50% match of the employee's contribution each payroll period into the Baylor College of Medicine 403(b) Tax Deferred Investment Plan (limited to 4% of base annual earnings) for a total maximum employer contribution of 8% of base annual earnings. Under the current provisions of the Plan, employee contributions are not permitted. Rollover contributions from other qualified retirement plans and conduit individual retirement accounts are permitted.

Effective for the 2024 Plan year, as soon as administratively feasible after the end of each Plan year, the College shall make a true-up contribution into the Plan for matching contributions that would have been earned by the employee had they been calculated on an annual basis rather than a payroll period basis.

Vesting

A participant becomes fully vested in his or her employer contribution account after completion of three full years of vesting service. Participants are fully vested in their rollover contributions. If a participant terminates employment with the College prior to becoming vested, the entire balance of the participant's account (except for rollover amounts) is forfeited. A participant becomes fully vested in his or her entire account balance upon normal retirement age, total disability or death, as defined in the Plan document. Employees who transfer from Helis Foundation to the College count their service towards the Plan's vesting requirements, provided that the employee transferred directly from Helis Foundation to the College without intervening employment elsewhere. Service with the Hughes Medical Institute shall be counted as Vesting Service, limited to a maximum of three years, if the individual performed research or other services on an Employer's premise while being assisted by or while assisting one or more of an Employer's Employees.

Participant Accounts

Separate accounts are maintained for each participant. Each participant account is credited with the College's contribution and a proportional allocation of net earnings of the applicable investment funds and any participant specific administrative fees. Each participant is entitled to the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants may direct their accounts to any of the investment options offered through the Plan.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures may be used to offset future contributions of the College. During 2024, forfeitures of approximately \$4,388,447 were used to reduce employer contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, remaining forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$932,939 and \$399,926, respectively.

Benefit Payments

Distributions are payable upon termination, death, or retirement. Participants and their beneficiaries have the option to leave their vested account balances in the Plan and share in the Plan's investment earnings and losses unless the account balance is less than \$1,000, in which case it is automatically distributed. Upon submission of a distribution request, a participant's vested account balance is distributed when practicable. Distributions are based on the valuation date applicable to the investment chosen following the distribution request. The form of distribution is selected by the participant at time of request.

The available distribution options are lump sum cash distribution, systematic distributions, life annuity, and various joint survivor annuities. A participant who is employed for at least ten years of active service may elect to receive a distribution of all or a portion of their account upon the later of attainment of age 62 or normal retirement age as defined in the Plan document, while working a part-time schedule of less than 20 hours per week. Required minimum distributions are made in accordance with Internal Revenue Service (IRS) requirements.

Notes Receivable from Participants

While this Plan does not normally allow loans, due to the provisions of the Disaster Tax Relief Act of 2017, there are loans outstanding that were permitted between October 4, 2017 and December 31, 2018, allowing participants to borrow from their account balance a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$100,000 or 100% of their vested account balance. Effective March 2020, the Plan implemented certain requirements permitted by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), which allowed certain eligible individuals to elect temporary relief for loan repayments due between March 27, 2020 through December 31, 2020 and allowing participants to borrow from their account balance a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$100,000 or 100% of their vested account balance from the Plan. Participant loans are secured by the borrower's vested account balance and are permitted upon the Committee's approval. The term of the loan may not exceed five years; however, the loan terms may have been extended for one year related to the suspension of loan repayments under the CARES Act. An interest rate will be specified in each agreement. Principal and interest is paid monthly to Fidelity or TIAA. A participant is allowed a maximum of two loans outstanding at one time.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting and present the net assets available for benefits and changes in those net assets in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

Preparation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. Delinquent participant notes receivable are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Contributions

The employer contributions are recorded in the year in which the participant compensation is earned.

Benefit Payments

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Administrative Fees and Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the College. Expenses that are paid by the College are excluded from these financial statements. Investment expenses are included in the net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of the respective investment.

Subsequent Events

The financial statements and related disclosures include evaluation up through October 14, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - Unaudited Information Certified by Custodians

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted under such election, the following information has been certified by either Fidelity Management Trust Company, Lincoln National Life Insurance Company, TIAA or CREF as to its completeness and accuracy and was not subject to any auditing procedures performed by the Plan's independent auditor:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and notes to financial statements.
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments, investment interest and dividend income, and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024 and notes to financial statements.
- All investment and participant loan information included in the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows.

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; or inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Mutual funds and money market funds: Valued at the publicly quoted daily closing price as reported by the fund. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded. These investments are deemed to be Level 1.

Fixed annuity contract: Valued at fair value by adding the accumulated cash contributions and interest credited to the Plan's contracts, less any withdrawals. Liquidity restrictions apply to this contract resulting in it not being fully-benefit responsive. This contract is guaranteed by TIAA and carries a rate of interest between 1% to 3%. TIAA maintains the contributions in a general account and there are no reserves against contract value. This investment is deemed to be Level 3.

Common collective trust: The collective trust fund is not publicly traded and represents a stable value collective investment trust for which net asset value (NAV) is used as the practical expedient for determining fair value. Investments in the common collective trust fund (Fidelity Managed Income Portfolio II) include short term bonds, fixed income securities, and derivative instruments. Participant transactions may occur daily.

Pooled separate account: Valued based on the underlying investments or the fair value of the underlying pool of securities, using NAV as the practical expedient. This investment seeks long-term returns primarily through rental income and appreciation of real estate.

The methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while management of the Plan believes the valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5 - Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract

The Plan holds a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Lincoln National Life Insurance Company and as such, it is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Lincoln National Life Insurance Company, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. As of December 31, 2024, and 2023, the contract value of this investment was \$837,768 and \$836,199, respectively.

This contract is fully and unconditionally guaranteed by Lincoln National Life Insurance Company. During the accumulation phase, the account provides a guarantee of principal and a minimum interest rate of 3.50%, with the potential for additional interest if declared by Lincoln National Life Insurance Company. The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the issuer or otherwise.

Certain events may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with Lincoln National Life Insurance Company. Such events include termination of the contract, spinoffs, divestitures, layoffs, corporate relocation, partial or total plan termination, retirement incentive programs, and the liberalization of plan withdrawal or transfer rules. Upon occurrence of any of these events, a market value adjustment may apply. The Plan Administrator believes that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value are remote.

Note 6 - Federal Income Tax Status

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter on March 13, 2015 in which the IRS stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). Although the Plan has been amended and restated since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) and that the related trust is tax-exempt.

GAAP requires the Plan's management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

During 2023 and 2024, the Plan implemented the mandatory provisions of the SECURE Act 2.0. Written amendments to the Plan document to reflect these operational changes will be executed at a later date in accordance with deadlines pursuant to applicable laws and IRS regulations.

Note 7 - Plan Termination

The College has the right to discontinue contributions and terminate the Plan at any time, although the College has not expressed any intent to do so. In the event the Plan is terminated, each participant shall become 100% vested in their employer contributions, plus any earnings accrued thereon, as of the date of termination.

Note 8 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options which in general, are exposed to risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility risk. Some of the Plan's investment options may involve investments in securities with contractual cash flows, such as asset backed securities, collateralized mortgage obligations and commercial mortgage-backed securities. The value, liquidity and related income of these types of securities are sensitive to changes in economic conditions, including real estate value, delinquencies or defaults, or both, and may be adversely affected by shifts in the market's perception of the issuers and changes in interest rates. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net asset available for benefits.

Note 9 - Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Plan investments are managed by TIAA-CREF and affiliates of Fidelity Management Trust Company and Lincoln National Life Insurance Company. TIAA-CREF, Lincoln National Life Insurance Company and Fidelity Management Trust Company are the Custodians of the Plan. These investment transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions as defined by ERISA; however, these transactions are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are not considered prohibited transactions under 29 CFR 408(b) of the ERISA regulations. The Plan has entered into revenue sharing agreements with the Custodians, with such revenue rebated to the participant account that generated the revenue credit. During the year ended December 31, 2024, revenue credits of \$480,172 are reflected as other income on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Certain costs of administering the Plan are borne directly by the College. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, revenue credits available for future use were \$316,344 and \$38,075, respectively.
