We were engaged to perform audits of the financial statements of Access: Supports for Living Inc. 403(b) Retirement Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Access: Supports for Living 403(b) Retirement Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Disclaimer of Opinion

We do not express an opinion on the accompanying financial statements of Access: Supports for Living Inc. 403(b) Retirement Plan referred to in the first paragraph. Because of the significance of the matters described in the Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion section of our report, we have not been able to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to provide a basis for an audit opinion on the financial statements.

Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion

Access: Supports for Living Inc. 403(b) Retirement Plan has not maintained sufficient accounting records and supporting documents relating to certain annuity contracts and custodial accounts issued to current and former employees prior to January 1, 2009. Accordingly, we were unable to apply auditing procedures sufficient to determine the extent to which the accompanying financial statements may have been affected by these conditions.

Further, as described in Note 2 to the financial statements, the Access: Supports for Living Inc. 403(b) Retirement Plan has excluded from investments in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits certain annuity contracts and custodial accounts issued to current and former employees prior to January 1, 2009, as permitted by the Department of Labor's Field Assistance Bulletin No. 2009-02, Annual Reporting Requirements for 403(b) Plans. The investment income and distributions related to such accounts have also been excluded in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. The amount of these excluded annuity contracts and custodial accounts and the related income and distributions are not reasonably determinable. Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that these accounts and the related income and distributions be included in the accompanying financial statements.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Access: Supports for Living Inc. 403(b) Retirement Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our responsibility is to conduct an audit of Access: Supports for Living Inc. 403(b) Retirement Plan's financial statements in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and to issue an auditor's report. However, because of the matters described in the Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion section of our report, we were not able to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to provide a basis for an audit opinion on these financial statements.

We are required to be independent of Access: Supports for Living Inc. 403(b) Retirement Plan, and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

1. THE PLAN

The following brief description of Access: Supports for Living Inc. 403(b) Retirement Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the plan document for more complete information.

General

The Plan, which became effective July 1, 1996, is a contributory defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Access: Supports for Living Inc. (the Sponsor or Access). Effective January 1, 2022, the following entities were added as participating employers in the Plan: The Guidance Center of Westchester, Inc.; New York Families for Autistic Children, Inc.; and Meaningful NY Initiatives for People with Disabilities, Inc. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Eligibility

Employees of the Sponsor are eligible to make salary deferral contributions to the Plan immediately upon hire. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan, unless they affirmatively elect not to participate, with a default deferral rate set at 1% of eligible compensation. Contributions are automatically invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. All employees other than union employees, leased employees and independent contractors and are at least 21 years of age and have completed at least two years of service are eligible to receive employer matching contributions.

Contributions

Participants may contribute to the Plan up to an annual limit set by the IRS. A participant may direct contributions in a variety of investment options. Participants may change their investment options at any time. The Plan does accept rollovers and transfers from other qualified plans, but only for those employees eligible to participate in the Plan.

Access' guaranteed matching contribution under the Plan is 100% on the first 2%, plus 50% on the next 4%, that an eligible employee defers (with a maximum guaranteed matching contribution of 4% of compensation if the eligible employee defers at least 6% of compensation). Total matching contribution paid to the plan for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 amounted to approximately \$1,338,000 and \$1,337,000, respectively.

Access also makes a non-elective contribution designated as the "contract contribution" which is considered a prevailing wage contribution made to non-highly compensated contract workers and only for and with respect to their prevailing wage hours of service. Total non-elective "contract contributions" paid to the plan for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 amounted to approximately \$849,000 and \$852,000, respectively.

The Plan also allows for a discretionary bonus contribution at an amount and allocation determined by Access, if any. Access is not required to make a bonus contribution for any year. There were no discretionary bonus contributions in 2024 or 2023.

1. THE PLAN (Continued)

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocation of Access' matching contributions and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Investment Options

The Plan currently offers several mutual fund accounts, variable annuity contracts, fixed annuity contracts, and a pooled separate account. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participant loans are permitted under the Plan from accounts held at Empower Trust Company, LLC, a custodian. Under the terms of the Plan, participants may not borrow from their fund accounts held with Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association and College Retirement Equities Fund (TIAA and CREF). Participants may obtain loans, subject to various requirements set forth in the Plan, in amounts up to 50% of their contributed account balance with a maximum loan of \$50,000 and a minimum loan of \$1,000. The interest rate charged is based on interest rates on the date of the loan. Interest is fixed for the term of the loan at the Wall Street Journal Prime Rate plus 1% at the date of the loan. Loan payments are made through payroll deductions over a period that may not exceed five years unless the loan is for the purchase of a participant's primary residence.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to disability or retirement, a participant (or a designated beneficiary) may elect to receive the interest in his or her account in either a lump-sum amount or annual installments (including interest) for life. If the participant dies before distribution begins, the entire interest earned in the Plan will be distributed to the spouse or the named beneficiary by December 31 of the calendar year immediately following the calendar year of the participant's death.

A participant may also request a withdrawal upon attainment of age 59 1/2 or upon demonstration by the participant to the Sponsor that the participant is suffering from "hardship". Hardship is defined by the Plan as a certain, immediate, and heavy financial need for specific qualifying expenses. Hardship distributions are only available from participant contributions. All hardship withdrawals must comply with the rules relating to hardships, which are uniformly applicable to all participants.

Participants may request a withdrawal from their rollover funds at any time.

Vesting

Participants are immediately fully vested in all contributions.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures relate to compliance testing failures as a result of overfunding employer contributions. Forfeitures may be used to reduce the employer contribution or pay for administrative expenses of the Plan. There were no forfeitures used to reduce employer contributions during 2024 or 2023. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts approximated \$2,330 and \$2,235, respectively.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) except for the excluded contracts as described below.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive fixed annuity contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The Plan's investment in the TIAA Traditional Benefit-Responsive Annuity Contract and Empower Life & Annuity Insurance Company of New York Guaranteed Interest Fund are recorded at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus a minimum rate of interest earned, at a rate determined by TIAA and Empower Life & Annuity Insurance Company of New York (ELANY), less withdrawals and transfers to other accounts. These accounts do not have any liquidity restrictions, are fully benefit-responsive, and have been classified as fixed annuity contracts. See Note 4 for a further discussion.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Estimates also affect the reported amounts of additions and deductions during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Excluded Contracts

These financial statements do not include certain annuity and custodial accounts issued to current and former employees prior to January 1, 2009, as permitted by the Department of Labor's Field Assistance Bulletin No. 2009-02, Annual Reporting Requirements for 403(b) Plans. The amount of these excluded annuity and custodial accounts and the related income and distributions is not determinable. Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that these accounts and the related income and distributions be included in the accompanying financial statements.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive fixed annuity contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. As applicable, interest income is recorded on the accrual basis and dividend income is accrued on the ex-dividend date. The income or loss of each investment option, including the change in market value of investments, is allocated to participant accounts based on each participant's proportionate interest in the investment option. Net appreciation in investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Risk and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, currency and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amount reported in the financial statements.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there was no allowance for uncollectible accounts. Delinquent participant loans are deemed as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by Access, which is the Plan's Sponsor, while certain other administrative expenses are paid by the Plan from participant accounts. Expenses that are paid by the Plan Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements.

3. CERTIFIED INVESTMENT INFORMATION

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Trust Company, LLC, ELANY, TIAA, and CREF have certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate as of and for the years ended December 31:

4. FIXED ANNUITY CONTRACTS

The Plan entered into a fully benefit-responsive fixed-dollar annuity contract with TIAA and CREF totaling \$639,228 and \$631,233 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. This contract is credited an interest rate, which generally varies with each deposit. There is no specific formula used to credit interest rates, and the interest rates are not tied to the performance of a set of assets. The interest rates are credited based upon a number of factors, including, but not limited to, the level of net investment income that the company can earn on its newly purchased general account assets, the absolute level of interest rates, the shape of the yield curve, how interest rates have moved since the inception of the contract and the minimum guaranteed interest rate.

The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than 1%-3% in accordance with the provision of the various contracts. The fixed-dollar annuity contract issuers are contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

In addition, the Plan entered into a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed interest fund with ELANY, totaling \$2,179,855 and \$1,924,804 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Annually an interest rate is established for all money, regardless of when it was deposited. The credited interest rate may stay the same or change each year. The minimum guaranteed interest rate is 1%. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the interest rates were 1.85% and 1.75%, respectively. Participants may transfer their account balance to any other investment option offered under the plan at any time with no restrictions or penalties. If a participant transfers out of the guaranteed interest fund, ELANY reserves the right to restrict transfers for 30 days. These transactions are processed after the resolution of closed or disrupted financial exchanges or markets.

The fixed-dollar annuity contract and guaranteed interest fund meet the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria, and therefore are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligation. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligation may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers. These events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

- The Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code) or the failure of the trust to be tax-exempt under Section 501(a) of the Code
- Premature termination of the contracts
- Plan termination or merger
- Changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options
- Bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (e.g., divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations

4. FIXED ANNUITY CONTRACTS (Continued)

In addition, certain events allow the issuers to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

- An uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines
- A breach of material obligation under the contract
- A material misrepresentation
- A material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

The fixed-dollar annuity contract and guaranteed interest fund do not permit TIAA and CREF or ELANY to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

5. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) Section 820 establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair market value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC Section 820 are described below:

- Level 1 - Valuations based on quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan has the ability to access. Valuation adjustments are not applied to Level 1 instruments. Since valuations are based on quoted prices that are readily and regularly available in an active market, valuation of these products does not entail a significant degree of judgment.
- Level 2 - Valuations based on quoted prices in markets that are not active or for which all significant inputs are observable, directly or indirectly.
- Level 3 - Valuations based on inputs that are unobservable and significant to the overall fair value measurement.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

There were no changes in valuation methodologies during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

5. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value.

Mutual funds: Valued at the net asset value of shares held at year end based on quoted prices in active markets.

Variable annuity contracts: Unit values are based on the fair value of the underlying assets of the fund derived from inputs principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means, although are not based upon quoted market prices in an active market.

Fixed annuity contract, non-benefit responsive: Value is calculated as accumulated cash contributions and interest credited to the Plan's contracts, less any withdrawals.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Investments Measured using the Net Asset Value per Share Practical Expedient

The Plan has financial instruments which are recorded at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits.

Pooled separate accounts: Valued using net asset value ("NAV") as a practical expedient to estimate fair value where NAV is based on the value of the underlying investment assets held through sub-accounts of a separate account of an insurance company. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the account will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. There are currently no redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments on these investments. The pooled separate accounts are privately managed through investment companies and are not publicly quoted. Pooled separate accounts are comprised primarily of shares of registered investment companies.

6. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are products of Empower Trust Company, LLC, ELANY, TIAA, and CREF. As such, transactions between the participants investing in these funds and the Plan qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

The Plan also allows participants of the Plan to receive participant and plan loans under specific circumstances. As such, transactions between the participants that have notes receivables with the Plan qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

7. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan is designed through a prototype plan to qualify under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code ("Code"). The prototype plan has received an opinion letter, dated March 31, 2017, from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") which stated that the prototype plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt. The prototype plan opinion letter has been relied upon by this Plan. The prototype sponsor as well as the Plan's sponsor believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and has no income subject to business income tax.

8. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed intent to do so, the Sponsor has the right to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will remain 100% vested in their accounts, including employer contributions.

9. PLAN LOANS

Under the terms of the Plan, participants may not borrow from their fund accounts held with TIAA and CREF, but are able to enter into a separate contract with TIAA and CREF. These loans are not part of the plan assets. Plan loans are collateralized using a participant's TIAA Traditional account balance in an amount equal to 110% of the outstanding loan balance. Loan terms range from one (1) to five (5) years in one-year increments. Principal and interest are paid ratably by the participant to TIAA and each payment will reduce amounts collateralized by the borrowing participant's TIAA Traditional account balance. Interest is paid monthly or quarterly at an interest rate ranging between 5.15% and 7.62%.

Total plan loans as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$51,453 and \$48,823, respectively. Plan loans in default at December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$51,453 and \$48,823 and are included as a benefit responsive fixed annuity contract on the statements of net assets available for benefits.

10. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 13, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
