Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Pinnacle Health System 401(k) Plan (Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan’s financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor’s Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with U.S. GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024 is presented for the purpose of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements, but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves and other additional procedures in accordance with U.S. GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following brief description of the Pinnacle Health System 401(k) Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - The Plan was established effective April 10, 2011. It is a defined contribution plan covering certain employees of UPMC Pinnacle (formerly Pinnacle Health System) (Company or Plan Sponsor) as of the date their employment commences, except for those employees of the Company who are collective bargaining employees, non-resident aliens, independent contractors, 403(b) eligible employees who are common-law employees of tax-exempt employers in the control group, and any other common law employee of tax-exempt employers in the Company control group not otherwise excluded from the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Company's board of directors has charged the Pinnacle Health System Retirement Committee (Committee) with responsibility for the oversight of the Plan. The Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance, and reports to the board of directors.

Effective December 31, 2019, the Plan was amended to freeze employee contributions, matching contributions and employer contributions to the Plan, with respect to eligible compensation paid after December 31, 2019. In addition, the Plan was amended to cease enrollment of new participants, future loans and hardship withdrawals to participants and all transfers and rollovers to the Plan effective December 31, 2019.

To comply with the requirements of current laws and regulations, effective January 1, 2022, the Plan was amended and restated via adoption of the Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan With Cash or Deferred Arrangement (CODA), a prototype plan sponsored by The Prudential Insurance Company of America. This prototype plan replaced the Prototype Non-Standardized Profit Sharing Plan With CODA previously adopted by the Plan.

Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with allocations of Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined in the Plan agreement. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Participants were vested immediately in their contributions, employer matching contributions and prior transition credit contributions (for grandfathered participants) plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's nonelective contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of service. A participant becomes 100% vested after three years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Prior to the Plan freezing, participants could borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans were secured by the balance in the participant's account. Interest rates were determined in accordance with the Plan document. Loan terms could not exceed five years, unless the loan was for the purchase of a principal residence, in which case the loan repayment term could not exceed 12 years. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

Payment of Benefits - Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, or for termination of service for other reasons, a participant, or his/her assigned beneficiary in the case of death, may elect to receive a single lump-sum amount, a distribution of some or all of the participant's Plan accounts or various annuity options. Provisions are available to allow withdrawals of benefits prior to termination of employment as defined in the Plan agreement and in compliance with the Internal Revenue Code (IRC).

Forfeitures - Participants who leave the Company and incur a break in service forfeit the nonvested portion of their accounts. Such forfeitures are used to offset Plan expenses. There were approximately \$85,000 and \$70,000 of forfeitures available at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. There were no forfeitures used to reduce administrative expenses during the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A summary of significant accounting policies consistently applied in the preparation of the accompanying financial statements follows:

Basis of Accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - Investments held by the Plan (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts) are stated at fair value, which is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (an exit price). See Note 4 for further discussion and disclosures related to fair value measurements and Note 5 for the discussion of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date, and interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable From Participants - Notes receivable from participants represent participant loans that are recorded at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as distributions on the basis of the terms of the Plan agreement.

Payments of Benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses - The Plan's administrative expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company as provided by the Plan document. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events - Subsequent events are defined as events or transactions that occur after the statement of net assets available for benefits date, but before the financial statements are issued or available to be issued. Management has evaluated subsequent events through October 14, 2025, the date that the financial statements were issued, and determined that there have been no events that have occurred that would require adjustments to disclosures in the financial statements.

NOTE 3 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIANS (UNAUDITED)

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Trust Company, LLC and Empower Annuity Insurance Company, custodians and qualified institutions, have certified that the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Interest and dividends, net appreciation in fair value of investments, other income, net, and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Investment information included in the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, as shown on the ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

At the request of the Plan administrator, the Plan's independent auditor did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENT

The fair value framework establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The fair value hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below.

- Level 1 - Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible to the reporting entity at the measurement date for identical assets and liabilities.
- Level 2 - Inputs other than quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities that are observable either directly or indirectly for substantially the full term of the asset or liability. Level 2 inputs include the following:
 - Quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active
 - Observable inputs other than quoted prices that are used in the valuation of the asset or liabilities (e.g., interest rate and yield curve quotes at commonly quoted intervals)
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means
- Level 3 - Unobservable inputs for the asset or liability (i.e., supported by little or no market activity). Level 3 inputs include management’s own assumption about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability (including assumptions about risk).

The asset’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value:

Mutual Funds - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and transact at that price. Mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts - As of December 31, 2024 these consist of mutual funds and as of December 31, 2023 these consist of interest-bearing cash and mutual funds. The carrying value of interest-bearing cash approximates fair value. Mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Funds held in these accounts are open-end funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The funds held in these accounts are deemed to be actively traded.

NOTE 5 - FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACTS

The Plan invests in the Guaranteed Interest Fund, a fully benefit-responsive investment contract (a traditional investment contract) with Empower Annuity Insurance Company. The issuer maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings or losses on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than the minimum guaranteed rate specified by the Plan's contract. It is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The crediting rate will never be less than 1.00% and never be greater than 3.00%.

The contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower Annuity Insurance Company, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings or losses, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

NOTE 5 - FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACTS (Continued)

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations, which may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer as noted in the contract. Such events include the termination of the contract by the Plan Sponsor. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

There is no maturity date on the contract.

NOTE 6 - RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan holds investments that are issued and managed by the custodians, in addition to a certain investment held by Empower Trust Company LLC, a custodian of the Plan, who holds PGIM. Additionally, the Plan holds loans to participants, that are secured by the participants' account balances.

Fees incurred by the Plan for investment management services and recordkeeping services are paid through revenue sharing, rather than direct payment, pursuant to the administrative services agreement. If revenue received by the custodian exceeds the amount owed under the administrative services agreement, the custodian remits the excess to the Plan's trust on a quarterly basis. Such amounts may be applied to pay Plan administrative expenses or allocated to the accounts of participants, as defined in the administrative services agreement. During 2024, the excess revenue sharing generated other income of approximately \$6,000 and was utilized to pay administrative expenses of approximately \$172,000. The Plan or Plan Sponsor may make a payment to the custodians for administrative expenses not covered by revenue sharing. Expenses paid by the Plan Sponsor are not material.

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officers or employees received compensation from the Plan.

These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions however they are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules under ERISA.

NOTE 7 - PLAN TERMINATION

The Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their entire account.

NOTE 8 - TAX STATUS

The Plan uses a Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan with CODA sponsored by The Prudential Insurance Company of America. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined by a letter dated September 16, 2022 that the form of the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Profit Sharing Plan with CODA has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

NOTE 9 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities that are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities could occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported on the statements of net assets available for benefits.
