Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Tampa Bay Buccaneers 401(k) Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by qualified institutions agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by institutions that management determined meet the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Note 1 **Description of Plan**

The following brief description of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers 401(k) Savings Plan (the Plan), which is sponsored by Buccaneers Team LLC (the Company), provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. The Plan is subject to the applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Administration

During December 2024, the Plan's trustee changed from PNC Bank to Empower Trust Company, LLC (Empower). Empower also serves as the Plan's recordkeeper. The Plan is administered by the Company.

Prior to December 2024, the Plan's investment securities were included in the National Football League Reciprocal Trust (the Trust), which was established and maintained for the collective investment of contributions by plans of the National Football League member clubs and other league entities. The assets of the Trust were maintained by PNC Bank, the former trustee of the Plan.

Contributions

The Plan provides that each participant may make elective contributions (Pre-Tax and Roth) up to the maximum contribution provisions imposed by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company will match the lower of:

- a. Fifty percent (50%) of the participant's contributions for the year;
- b. Two and one-half percent (2.5%) of the participant's compensation for the plan year; or
- c. Three thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$3,750).

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan changed its contribution formula to provide for employer safe harbor matching contributions equal to 100% of the participant deferrals that do not exceed 1% of compensation plus 50% of participant deferrals between 1% and 6% of compensation for the plan year.

In addition to the employer safe harbor matching contributions, the Company may make a discretionary nonelective contribution to participants.

Rollover Contributions

With the Company's prior written consent, an eligible employee may make one or more rollover contributions to the Plan if the employee demonstrates, to the Company's satisfaction, that the contribution qualifies as a rollover contribution under the appropriate section of the IRC.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, an allocation of the Company's contribution and Plan earnings (losses) and charged with the participant's withdrawals. Company matching contributions are allocated to investment funds in the same proportion as the participant's investment election. Plan earnings (losses) are allocated by fund based on the ratio of each participant's account invested in a particular fund to all participants' investment in that fund.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in all employee contributions plus actual earnings thereon. The vesting schedule for employer contributions is provided on page 6.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime rate on the first business day of the month in which the loan application is received. The notes are to be repaid over a period not to exceed five years, or longer for the purchase of a primary residence. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Benefit Payments

Upon termination of service, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of his/her account or a deferred lump sum distribution, as defined in the Plan agreement. If the value of a terminated participant's vested benefit balance does not exceed \$1,000, the entire amount shall be paid to the participant in a single lump sum. Starting December 1, 2024, distributions of amounts exceeding \$1,000 up to \$5,000 will be directly rolled over to an IRA for the terminating participant if no election is made to either receive or roll over the distribution. In addition, the Plan allows hardship withdrawals and in-service withdrawals after age 59½ for participants who qualify. The amount of hardship and in-service withdrawals shall not exceed the value of the participant's tax deferred and Roth accounts. All distributions are subject to the provisions of the Plan agreement.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Plan. Prior to December 1, 2024, the expenses were covered by the Company.

Note 2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the accrual method of accounting.

Subsequent Events

In preparing the financial statements, management has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through October 14, 2025 the date that the financial statements were available to be issued.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the Plan's financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in investment securities which are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as inflation, a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with these investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in their values will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments are recorded when paid to the participant.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Note 3 Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

The Plan follows the fair value measurement guidance required by accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America for financial and nonfinancial assets and liabilities. This guidance defines fair value and provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Pooled separate accounts are valued using the Net Asset Value (NAV) of units held by the Plan at year end. The NAV is determined by the custodian of the fund and is based upon the fair value of the underlying assets held by the fund. NAV is used as a practical to estimate fair value. There are no participant redemption restrictions for these investments, the redemption notice period is applicable only to the Plan.

Common Collective Trusts: These investments are valued using the NAV based on the underlying assets of the trust. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The fair value of the underlying assets is obtained from information provided by the investment advisor at year end. There are no restrictions on redemptions of these investments.

Registered Investment Companies: Registered investment companies are valued at the NAV of shares held by the Plan at year end based on quoted market prices in an active market.

Money Market: This investment is valued using the NAV provided by the administrator of the fund. The NAV is based on the value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. The NAV is a quoted price in an active market.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Note 4 Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contracts

The Plan has entered into a guaranteed investment contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (EAICA). This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established in a contract between the Plan and the contract issuer, which will not fall below 0.10%. The crediting rate is reviewed annually for resetting.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. These events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. The Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code or the failure of the trust to be tax-exempt under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code;
2. Premature termination of the contracts;
3. Plan termination or merger;
4. Changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options;
5. Bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations.

No events are probable that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

Note 5 Financial Information Certified by the Trustee

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the United States Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the Plan Administrator has obtained certifications from Empower and PNC Bank for the completeness and accuracy of all investments, notes receivable from participants and accrued interest reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, and the net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest income, other income and interest income on notes receivable from participants reflected on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 6 Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan agreement to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

Note 7 Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Company, by a letter dated November 14, 2022, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8 Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by Empower, the trustee of the Plan, and therefore, transactions involving these investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions.
