NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the All American Dairy Products, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of All American Dairy Products, Inc. (“AADP”) and its affiliate PhytogenX, Inc. (“Phyto”) (AADP and Phyto combined referred to as the “Company”) who have completed six months of service. There is no age restriction for participation. The Plan excludes collective bargaining employees, non-resident aliens of the employer who have no U.S. sourced income, and leased employees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as amended. The management of AADP are the Plan’s named trustees and are responsible for oversight of the Plan and monitoring the Plan’s investment offerings.

Trustee and Recordkeepers

For the period January 1, 2023 to December 26, 2024, the custodian and recordkeeper of the Plan was Nationwide Trust Company, FSB (“Nationwide”). Atlantic Pension Services, Inc. provided administrative services to the Plan. For the period December 27, 2024 to December 31, 2024, the custodian and recordkeeper of the Plan was Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Corporation (“Voya”). Stalker and Associates, Inc. provided administrative services to the Plan.

Plan Restatement

In conjunction with the custodian transfer, the Plan was restated effective January 1, 2024. There were no significant changes to the Plan.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other pretax qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company contributes a safe harbor match of 100% of the salary deferral up to the first 3% of Plan compensation plus 50% of salary deferrals up to the next 2% of Plan compensation. Additional discretionary contributions to the Plan are also authorized, which are made at the option of the Company.

It is the Company’s policy to fund employee and employer contributions after each payroll in compliance with Department of Labor regulations. There have been no changes in the funding policy at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The Plan currently offers various mutual funds and a guaranteed investment contract as investment options for participants. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company contributed \$255,407 to the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as an allocation of Plan earnings or losses, administrative expenses, investment management fees and specific participant transaction fees. Allocations are based on participant earnings or losses, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (continued)

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and the Company's safe harbor contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$0. The Company may decide, at its discretion, how forfeitures may be used to reduce future employer contributions or to pay plan expenses. For the year ended December 31, 2024, plan expenses paid from forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$0.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$500 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime interest rate plus one percent. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, unless another form of payment is selected by the participant. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may (a) elect to defer payment until normal retirement age or April 1 of the calendar year following the attainment of age 73 if the balance is greater than \$5,000, (b) receive the value of the vested account as a lump-sum distribution, or (c) rollover the vested balance to another authorized plan. Absent instructions, balances over \$5,000 will remain in the Plan. Accounts with a balance over \$1,000 but less than \$5,000 will automatically be rolled over into an individual retirement account. Accounts under \$1,000 will be paid as a lumpsum distribution.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of distributions and notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account. Following is a summary of administrative expenses paid by the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If an asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measured.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds:

Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The following table sets forth, within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan's level 1 assets at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Plan has no investments classified within levels 2 or 3 of the valuation hierarchy.

NOTE 4 – GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Nationwide Life Insurance Company (Nationwide Life). Nationwide Life maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. On December 26, 2024, the Nationwide guaranteed investment contract was transferred to Voya. The crediting interest rate is set quarterly by Nationwide. During the plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the annual Nationwide interest rate was as follows:

On December 27, 2024, the Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (Voya). Voya maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting interest rate for the period of December 27, 2024 to December 31, 2024 was approximately 1.48%.

Because the guaranteed investment contracts meet the criteria to be considered fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. The guaranteed investment contract is presented on the face of the statements of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Nationwide and Voya, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The contract value of the investment contract at December 31, 2024 and 2023, was \$55,886 and \$106,235, respectively.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with the issuer, as defined. Such events include the Plan terminating the contract. The custodian transfer from Nationwide to Voya caused a forfeiture of \$2,654 as a result of cancelling the Nationwide Fixed Select account. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events subsequent to the transfer to Voya that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Plan participants or the issuer are probable of occurring.

The guaranteed investment contract has no scheduled maturity date and does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to all assets being distributed.

NOTE 5 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 6 - TAX STATUS

The Company has adopted a non-standardized pre-approved plan document that has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020, stating that the form of the pre-approved plan document was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since adopting the pre-approved plan document, the plan administrator believes the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 7 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 8 – RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain investments in the Plan are shares of mutual funds and investment contracts managed by Nationwide. Nationwide was the custodian and record-keeper as defined by the Plan for the period of January 1, 2023 to December 26, 2024 and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred for trust administration and recordkeeping were paid directly to Nationwide.

Certain investments in the Plan are shares of mutual funds and investment contracts managed by Voya. Voya was the custodian and record-keeper as defined by the Plan for the period of December 27, 2024 to December 31, 2024 and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred for trust administration and recordkeeping were paid directly to Voya.

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no amounts due to or due from related parties.

NOTE 9 – ADMINISTRATIVE ERRORS

Deemed Loan Distribution

A participant loan of a terminated employee was not reported as a deemed distribution due to an administrative oversight. Plan management believes this was an isolated incident and is reviewing internal procedures to address the issue. The financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2024 have been adjusted to reflect the deemed distribution in compliance with Plan rules. As a resolution, the participant will be issued a 1099-R tax statement in the year ending December 31, 2025 and the plan sponsor will also remit, on the employee's behalf, the tax withholding required with the distribution.

Rollover Contribution

A rollover contribution of a new employee, which was authorized by the plan rules, was not timely transferred to the participant's account due to not having an account setup at the time the rollover was executed. Plan management is initiating the transfer and intends to make a corrective contribution representing lost earnings.

NOTE 10 – INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEES

The Plan's investments are held by a third party. On December 27, 2024, the Plan changed the third party holding the assets from Nationwide Trust Company, FSB, the custodian of the Plan, to Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Corporation, the custodian of the Plan.

The following information included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules was obtained from data that has been prepared and certified to as complete and accurate by the custodians.

The summary has been compiled based on information included in the statements furnished to the plan administrator by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Corporation for the period of December 27, 2024 to December 31, 2024 and Nationwide Trust Company, FSB for the period of January 1, 2023 to December 26, 2024. The plan administrator has obtained certification from the custodians that such information is complete and accurate.
