1. Description of the Plan

The following brief description of the Chicken N Pickle LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for complete information. The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan covering all eligible employees of Chicken N Pickle LLC (the “Company”). Other employers that have adopted the plan are CNP Management Company LLC, CNP San Antonio LLC, CNP Kansas LLC, CNP Grand Prairie LLC, CNP Overland Park LLC, CNP Oklahoma LLC, CNP Grapevine LLC, CNP Glendale LLC, CNP St Charles, and CNP Webster LLC. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”) and qualifies under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (the “IRC”). The custodian of the Plan is Mid Atlantic Trust Company (“Mid Atlantic”).

SECURE 2.0

An expansion of Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 (“SECURE 2.0”) was signed into law on December 29, 2022, as part of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023. The effective dates of provisions within SECURE 2.0 vary through 2026. The Company has until December 31, 2026 to amend the Plan for the changes related to SECURE 2.0. The Plan has not been formally amended to adopt these provisions as of the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Eligibility

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan upon attainment of age 21 and the completion of one month of service. Union employees and nonresident aliens are not eligible to participate. The entry date upon meeting eligibility is the first day of the first day of each quarter.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute a flat dollar amount or percentage of their eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan, on both a pre-tax basis and after-tax (“Roth”) basis, not to exceed the annual limit established by the IRC. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

The Company makes safe harbor matching contributions equal to 100% of participant contributions up to 3% of compensation plus 50% of participant contributions in excess of 3% up to 5% of compensation.

Notes to Financial Statements (continued)

1. Description of the Plan (continued)

The Company may also make additional discretionary profit sharing contributions for eligible participants with one year of service that are employed on the last day of the Plan year, although none were made in 2024. Participants direct the investment of the contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each Plan participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's contribution and Plan earnings and losses, and is charged with withdrawals and applicable administrative expenses. Plan earnings are allocated based on the participant's share of the net earnings or losses of their respective elected investment options. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their salary deferral, safe harbor matching contributions, employer matching contributions, profit sharing contributions and rollover contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Payment of Benefits

Vested benefits are paid to participants upon death, disability, retirement or termination of employment by either arranging for a rollover to another plan or lump sum payment. For terminated participants' account balances that are less than \$5,000, the plan administrator may distribute the entire amount in a lump sum without the participant's consent. If the participant's vested portion is greater than \$5,000, the participant may elect to maintain the vested portion in the Plan.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures by participants of unvested Company contributions are used to reduce future employer contributions or pay administrative expenses. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited unvested account balances totaled \$0.

1. Description of the Plan (continued)

Administrative Expenses

All reasonable expenses of administration of the Plan may be paid from the assets of the Plan. The Company may, at its discretion, pay such expenses.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants are permitted to borrow the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The minimum that can be borrowed is \$1,000 and one loan can be outstanding at a time. Notes receivable from participants are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a reasonable rate. Loan applicants are charged a one-time loan fee payable when the loan is originated. Loan repayments are automatically deducted through after-tax payroll deductions over a period generally not to exceed five years.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the balances of all individual accounts will be distributed as soon as administratively practicable after the Plan terminates.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements are reported on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States. Benefits are recorded when paid to participants.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan holds various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near-term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and participant account balances.

Accounting Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain amounts reported in the financial statements and the accompanying notes and schedules. Accordingly, actual results could differ from these estimates.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

Investments held by the Plan are stated at fair value. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (an exit price). See Note 4 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded as earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when incurred. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

3. Investments

All investment information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements, notes and schedules, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments and interest and dividend income for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Mid Atlantic.

4. Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (“FASB”) Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”), *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1—Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.

Level 2—Inputs to the valuation methodology include

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liabilities;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability

Level 3—Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liabilities fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

4. Fair Value Measurements (continued)

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The Plan's investments in shares of mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumption to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Plan investments are managed by Mid Atlantic. Transactions such as these qualify as party-in-interest transactions. These transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

6. Income Tax Status

The underlying non-standardized prototype plan has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) dated August 31, 2020, stating that the form of the plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the IRC, and therefore, the related trust is tax exempt. The Company has determined that it is eligible to and has chosen to rely on the current IRS prototype plan opinion letter. Subsequent to receiving the IRS opinion letter, the Plan was amended. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualification. The plan administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan, as amended, is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

7. Delinquent Participant Contributions

During the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company inadvertently failed to deposit \$5,122 and \$11,918 of participant contributions, respectively, within the required timeframe prescribed by the Department of Labor Regulation 29 CFR 2510.3-102. The delayed contributions are considered prohibited, or nonexempt, transactions. As of December 31, 2024, the Plan administrator is in the process of taking corrective action, including payment of lost interest and related taxes and penalties.

Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2024

1. Description of the Plan

The following brief description of the Chicken N Pickle LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for complete information. The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan covering all eligible employees of Chicken N Pickle LLC (the “Company”). Other employers that have adopted the plan are CNP Management Company LLC, CNP San Antonio LLC, CNP Kansas LLC, CNP Grand Prairie LLC, CNP Overland Park LLC, CNP Oklahoma LLC, CNP Grapevine LLC, CNP Glendale LLC, CNP St Charles, and CNP Webster LLC. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”) and qualifies under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (the “IRC”). The custodian of the Plan is Mid Atlantic Trust Company (“Mid Atlantic”).

SECURE 2.0

An expansion of Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 (“SECURE 2.0”) was signed into law on December 29, 2022, as part of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023. The effective dates of provisions within SECURE 2.0 vary through 2026. The Company has until December 31, 2026 to amend the Plan for the changes related to SECURE 2.0. The Plan has not been formally amended to adopt these provisions as of the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Eligibility

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan upon attainment of age 21 and the completion of one month of service. Union employees and nonresident aliens are not eligible to participate. The entry date upon meeting eligibility is the first day of the first day of each quarter.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute a flat dollar amount or percentage of their eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan, on both a pre-tax basis and after-tax (“Roth”) basis, not to exceed the annual limit established by the IRC. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

The Company makes safe harbor matching contributions equal to 100% of participant contributions up to 3% of compensation plus 50% of participant contributions in excess of 3% up to 5% of compensation.

1. Description of the Plan (continued)

The Company may also make additional discretionary profit sharing contributions for eligible participants with one year of service that are employed on the last day of the Plan year, although none were made in 2024. Participants direct the investment of the contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each Plan participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's contribution and Plan earnings and losses, and is charged with withdrawals and applicable administrative expenses. Plan earnings are allocated based on the participant's share of the net earnings or losses of their respective elected investment options. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their salary deferral, safe harbor matching contributions, employer matching contributions, profit sharing contributions and rollover contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Payment of Benefits

Vested benefits are paid to participants upon death, disability, retirement or termination of employment by either arranging for a rollover to another plan or lump sum payment. For terminated participants' account balances that are less than \$5,000, the plan administrator may distribute the entire amount in a lump sum without the participant's consent. If the participant's vested portion is greater than \$5,000, the participant may elect to maintain the vested portion in the Plan.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures by participants of unvested Company contributions are used to reduce future employer contributions or pay administrative expenses. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited unvested account balances totaled \$0.

Administrative Expenses

All reasonable expenses of administration of the Plan may be paid from the assets of the Plan. The Company may, at its discretion, pay such expenses.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants are permitted to borrow the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The minimum that can be borrowed is \$1,000 and one loan can be outstanding at a time. Notes receivable from participants are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a reasonable rate. Loan applicants are charged a one-time loan fee payable when the loan is originated. Loan repayments are automatically deducted through after-tax payroll deductions over a period generally not to exceed five years.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the balances of all individual accounts will be distributed as soon as administratively practicable after the Plan terminates.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements are reported on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States. Benefits are recorded when paid to participants.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan holds various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near-term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and participant account balances.

Accounting Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain amounts reported in the financial statements and the accompanying notes and schedules. Accordingly, actual results could differ from these estimates.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

Investments held by the Plan are stated at fair value. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (an exit price). See Note 4 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded as earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when incurred. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

3. Investments

All investment information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements, notes and schedules, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments and interest and dividend income for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Mid Atlantic.

4. Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (“FASB”) Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”), *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1—Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.

Level 2—Inputs to the valuation methodology include

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liabilities;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability

Level 3—Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liabilities fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

4. Fair Value Measurements (continued)

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The Plan's investments in shares of mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumption to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Plan investments are managed by Mid Atlantic. Transactions such as these qualify as party-in-interest transactions. These transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

Notes to Financial Statements (continued)

6. Income Tax Status

The underlying non-standardized prototype plan has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) dated August 31, 2020, stating that the form of the plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the IRC, and therefore, the related trust is tax exempt. The Company has determined that it is eligible to and has chosen to rely on the current IRS prototype plan opinion letter. Subsequent to receiving the IRS opinion letter, the Plan was amended. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualification. The plan administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan, as amended, is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

7. Delinquent Participant Contributions

During the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company inadvertently failed to deposit \$5,122 and \$11,918 of participant contributions, respectively, within the required timeframe prescribed by the Department of Labor Regulation 29 CFR 2510.3-102. The delayed contributions are considered prohibited, or nonexempt, transactions. As of December 31, 2024, the Plan administrator is in the process of taking corrective action, including payment of lost interest and related taxes and penalties.
