We have performed audits of the financial statements of ARCO/Murray Construction Company Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets (deficit) available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statement of changes in net assets (deficit) available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Emphasis of Matter—Investments in Common Stock

As discussed in Note 5, the financial statements include an investment representing approximately 95% and 89% of total assets respectively as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, whose fair value has been estimated by an independent appraisal, in the absence of readily ascertainable fair values, with the assistance of management and approved by the trustee. Because of the inherent uncertainty of the valuation, the estimated value may differ significantly from the value that would have been used had a market for the investment existed, and the difference could be material. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations or the override of internal control. Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1. Plan Description and Basis of Presentation

The following brief description of ARCO/Murray Construction Company Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

ARCO/Murray Construction Company, Inc. (the Company) established the Plan effective as of January 1, 2021. The Plan was designed and operates as a leveraged employee stock ownership plan (ESOP) designed to comply with section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code) of 1986, as amended (the Code), and is subject to the applicable provisions of Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan is administered by the ESOP Stock Ownership Committee, which is appointed by the Board of Directors of the Company, who acts as the Plan Administrator and as the Plan's agent for service of legal process and performs the day-to-day administration of the Plan as provided in the plan documents. An individual member of an independent trust company serves as the Plan's Trustee.

On December 31, 2021, the Plan purchased 100,000 shares of the Company's common stock with a loan of \$38,039,841. The borrowing is collateralized by the unallocated shares of common stock and is guaranteed by the Company. The lender has no rights against shares of common stock once they are allocated to participants in accordance with the terms of the ESOP. Accordingly, the financial statements of the Plan present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to: (a) the accounts of employees with rights in allocated common stock (allocated) and (b) common stock not yet allocated to employees (unallocated).

Eligibility: Employees of the Company are generally eligible to participate in the Plan after they worked at least 1,000 hours during such plan year and are at least 18 years of age.

Contributions: The Company is obligated to make contributions in cash to the Plan that, when aggregated with the Plan's dividends and interest earnings, equal the amount necessary to enable the Plan to make its regularly scheduled payments of principal and interest due on its term loan. Employee contributions are not permitted.

Payment of benefits: Distributions on account of death, permanent disability or retirement are made in a lump sum in the plan year following the event. Distributions for other separations from service depend on the vested balance of the participant's account. If the participant's vested account does not exceed \$7,000, the participant's account will be paid out in a lump sum as soon as administratively practicable in the first plan year following in which the participant terminates employment. If a participant's vested balance exceeds \$7,000, distributions are paid at the earlier of: (a) the end of the fifth plan year following the termination of employment or (b) the end of the plan year in which the participant attains normal retirement age. The amount to be distributed is based upon the immediately preceding valuation date. Distributions are made in cash or in the form of company common stock plus cash for any fractional share of common stock. Under the provisions of the Plan, the Company is obligated to repurchase participant shares under certain conditions as prescribed by the Plan.

Administrative expenses: As provided in the plan agreement, administrative expenses may be paid either by the Plan or by the Company. To date, the Company has paid the operating expenses, which are excluded from these financial statements.

Note 1. Plan Description and Basis of Presentation (Continued)

Participant accounts: The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant's account is credited as of the last day of each plan year with an allocation of shares of the Company's common stock released by the Trustee from the unallocated account and forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts. Only those participants who are eligible employees of the Company as of the last day of the plan year will receive an allocation. Allocations are based on a participant's eligible compensation relative to total eligible compensation. Plan earnings are allocated to each participant's account based on the ratio of the participant's account balance to total participant balances.

Voting rights: Each participant (under certain circumstances that are mandated by the Code) is entitled to exercise voting rights attributable to the shares allocated to his or her account and is notified by the trustee prior to the time that such rights are to be exercised. The Trustee is not permitted to vote any allocated shares for which instructions have not been given by a participant. The Trustee is required, however, to vote any unallocated shares on behalf of the collective best interest of plan participants and beneficiaries.

Vesting: If a participant's employment with the Company ends for any reason other than retirement, permanent disability or death, he or she will vest in the balances in his or her account based on total years of service with the Company. A year of service is defined as a plan year during which an employee works at least 1,000 hours. The vesting schedule for participants is as follows:

Years of Service	Vested Percentage
Less than one year	0%
One year	20%
Two years	40%
Three years	60%
Four years	80%
Five years	100%

All participants shall become 100% vested upon the attainment of normal retirement age, death or permanent disability.

Put option: Under federal income tax regulations, employer securities held by the Plan and its participants that are not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations, include a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the fair market value of the stock. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

Diversification: Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in company common stock into investments that are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 with at least 10 years of participation in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a six-year period. In each of the first five years, a participant may diversify up to 25% of the number of shares allocated to his or her account, less any shares previously diversified. In the sixth year, the percentage changes to 50%. The election to diversify is made subsequent to year-end based upon the shares of company stock in the participant's account at year-end.

Forfeitures: Plan forfeitures may be used to pay plan expenses or allocated to eligible participants in the same manner as company contributions to eligible participants, at the discretion of the ESOP Committee. The amount of forfeitures as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, were insignificant, and the forfeitures used in 2024 were also insignificant.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Use of estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets (deficit) available for benefits and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Allocations: The financial statements of the Plan present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to: (a) the accounts of employees with rights in allocated stock (allocated) and (b) stock not yet allocated to employees (unallocated), including shares that are committed to be released. Shares are released from collateral and become allocated generally in the period in which debt service is actually paid.

Investment valuation and income recognition: The shares of company common stock are reported at fair value. See Note 5 for a discussion of the fair value measurements. Dividend income is accrued on the ex-dividend date. Dividend income consists primarily of S corporation distributions from the Company. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Realized gains and losses from security transactions are reported on the average-cost method. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Payment of benefits: Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Debt service transfer: During 2024, the prior year accrued allocated company contributions receivable and allocated dividends receivable were applied to debt service. This is reported as a transfer from the allocated accounts to the unallocated accounts on the statement of changes in net assets (deficit) available for benefits.

Company dividends: The Company declared no dividends to the ESOP during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Subsequent events: Management has evaluated potential subsequent events through October 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 5. Fair Value Measurements

Accounting guidance on fair value measurements and disclosures, establishes a framework for measuring the fair value of assets and liabilities using a hierarchy system, and expands disclosures about fair value measurement. It clarifies that fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants in the market in which the reporting entity transacts business.

The Plan's statements of net assets (deficit) available for benefits contains plan investments that are recorded at fair value on a recurring basis. The three-level valuation hierarchy for disclosure of fair value is as follows:

Level 1: Valuations are derived from quoted prices (unadjusted) for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access as of the measurement date.

Level 2: Valuations are derived from significant other observable inputs other than Level 1 prices such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3: Valuations are derived from significant unobservable inputs that reflect the Plan's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability.

When available, quoted market prices are used to determine the fair value of investments held in the Plan and such items are classified within Level 1 of the fair value hierarchy. A description of the valuation methodology used for instruments measured at fair value, as well as the general classification of such instruments pursuant to the valuation hierarchy, is set forth below. The level to which an asset or liability is classified is based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurements. There were no transfers in or out of Level 3 assets during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Common stock, ARCO/Murray Construction Company, Inc.: The fair value of shares of stock in ARCO/Murray Construction Company, Inc. is based on an independent appraisal. See description of the valuation method disclosed later in Note 5. As such, these shares are classified within Level 3 of the hierarchy.

The fair value of the common stock, ARCO/Murray Construction Company, Inc. held by the Plan is valued at fair value based upon an independent appraisal. In the appraisal, the valuation is determined utilizing a weighted average between the four approaches identified above. The appraiser took into account historical and projected cash flow and net income, return on assets, return on equity, market comparables and fair value of the Company assets and liabilities. Plan management has concluded that a market participant would also recognize a discount for lack of marketability.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 6. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan investments consist primarily of the Company's common stock, which is exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks, as well as valuation assumptions based on earnings, cash flows and/or other such techniques. Due to the level of risk associated with the investment in common stock and to uncertainties inherent in the estimation and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of common stock will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the 2024 statement of net assets (deficit) available for benefits.

Note 7. Loan Payable

During the year ended December 31, 2021, the Plan entered into a loan payable with the selling shareholders of the Company which were subsequently assigned to the Company. The proceeds from the loan payable were used to purchase company common stock. The resulting term loan agreement with the Company is collateralized by the unallocated shares of the Company common stock. Shares are released from collateral and allocated to participants as payments of principal and interest are made. The number of shares released in any year is the number of shares held as collateral, times the ratio of the current year payments divided by the total of this year's payment, plus the total of all future years' principal and interest payments. The agreement provides for the loan to be paid back annually, with the final payment plus any accrued interest due December 31, 2071. The loan bears an interest rate of 1.90%. The outstanding balance of the loan payable to the Company at December 31, 2024 and 2023, was \$32,103,450 and \$33,512,828, respectively.

Note 8. Tax Status

The trust established under the Plan is tax-exempt under the appropriate sections of the Code. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken a significant uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 9. Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan invests in Company common stock and has indebtedness to the Company. These are related-party and party-in-interest transactions. Such parties are parties-in-interest under ERISA.

Note 10. Plan Termination

The Company reserves the right to terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions of the Plan and ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts. Upon such termination of the Plan, distribution of any unallocated amounts will be made to each participant in the fund in the ratio that his or her allocated account bears to the total of the accounts of all participants. Upon termination of the Plan, the ESOP Committee shall direct the trustee to pay all liabilities and expenses of the trust fund and to sell shares of financed common stock held in the loan suspense account to the extent it determines such sale to be necessary in order to repay the loan.
