Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of New England Yankee Construction LLC Retirement Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C)[ERISA Section 103(a)(3) (C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The New England Yankee Construction, LLC (the “Company” or “Employer”) 401(K) Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) was established January 1, 2012. The following description of the Plan is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document, and any amendments for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of the Company immediately upon service. Participants may enroll in the Plan immediately once eligible. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). The Company is the sponsor and administrator of the Plan, Capital Bank and Trust Company is the custodian of the Plan and manages the investments as directed by participants.

Contributions

Each year, participants may elect to contribute a percentage of their compensation to the plan up to the maximum amount allowed by the Internal Revenue Code (the “Code”). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollover contributions).

The Company makes safe harbor contributions equal to 100% of the participant’s elective deferrals up to 3% of eligible compensation, plus 50% of the participant’s elective deferrals that are between 3% and 5% of eligible compensation. Annually, the Company may also make a discretionary contribution at the option of the Company’s Board of Directors that is subject to plan provisions. The Company may also make contributions to the Plan for eligible participants based on their classification as a Prevailing Wage employee. Eligible Prevailing Wage employees will receive a contribution based on the contribution requirements associated with the type of work they are performing. Classifications are determined under applicable federal, state, or municipal prevailing wage laws, and are determined on a per-pay period basis. Contributions are subject to the Code limitations.

All contributions are held in trust and invested by the Plan’s custodian in accordance with the options elected by the participants (i.e. all investments are participant-directed).

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is maintained separately within the Plan and is credited with their elective deferrals, employer contributions and earnings. Participants may elect to have contributions invested in any or all of the funds of the Plan. Allocation of employer contributions, investment income, and administrative expenses are based on a participant’s compensation or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested accounts.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct all contributions in a variety of investment choices as more fully described in the Plan’s literature.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their deferral and rollover contributions and employer safe harbor contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Participants are fully vested in employer discretionary contributions upon the completion of six years of service.

Payment of Benefits and Withdrawals

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or any other reason, a request for distribution of a participant's account balance is allowed. If a participant dies while classified as an active member of the Plan, the participant's beneficiary or beneficiaries are entitled to receive the entire participant's vested account balance. Should a participant become totally and permanently disabled while employed by the Company, the full value of the participant's account balance may be distributed upon request.

If a participant's total vested benefit is \$1,000 or less as of the distribution date, their entire vested benefit may be distributed to them in a lump sum, even if they do not consent to a distribution. If a participant's total vested benefit under the Plan is between \$1,000 and \$5,000 as of the distribution date and they do not consent to a distribution of their vested account balance, their vested benefit may be automatically rolled over to an IRA selected by the Plan Administrator. If a participant's total vested benefit exceeds \$5,000, no distribution will be made from the Plan without their consent. Otherwise, the Plan administrator will direct the custodian to begin required minimum distributions (RMDs) no later than April 1 of the calendar year after the participant reaches their RMD age, which under the provisions of the SECURE 2.0 Act is:

- Age 73 for individuals born between 1951 and 1959
- Age 75 for individuals born in 1960 or later

Subject to certain limitations prescribed by the Plan, the Plan amendment and the Code, participants may elect hardship withdrawals. Withdrawals from a participant's rollover account may also be made at any time, in accordance with the provisions specified in the Plan. Additionally, in-service withdrawals of greater than \$1,000 are allowed in accordance with the provisions specified in the Plan for participants who have attained retirement age (65).

Forfeitures

Forfeited accounts are amounts forfeited by participants who have terminated their employment and are not fully vested in their employer account. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$908 and \$843, respectively. Forfeitures are retained in the Plan and may first be used to pay administrative expenses. Any remaining amounts may be used to reduce future Safe Harbor employer contributions and/or Safe Harbor matching contributions payable under the Plan. Forfeitures may be used within the Plan year or in the following Plan year.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“U.S. GAAP”).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect reported amounts of assets and liabilities, changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates due to risks and uncertainties.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan’s management determines the Plan’s valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and custodians. See Note 3 for a discussion on fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividend income is recorded on the cash basis which approximates U.S. GAAP. Net appreciation (depreciation) of investments includes gains and losses on investments sold as well as held during the year.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Plan administration expenses are paid out of Plan assets, unless otherwise stated. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Income Taxes

The Plan recognizes the effect of income tax positions only if those positions are more likely than not to be sustained. Management has determined that the Plan had no uncertain tax positions that would require financial statement recognition or disclosure. As of December 31, 2024 the Plan’s tax returns generally remain subject to examination by major tax jurisdictions for the previous three years.

Subsequent Events

For the year ended December 31, 2024 the Plan evaluated subsequent events for potential recognition and disclosures through October 13, 2025, the date of the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets for identical investments as of the reporting date.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are other than quoted prices in active markets, which are either directly or indirectly observable as of the reporting date; and

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable inputs in situations where there is little or no market activity for the asset or liability and the reporting entity makes estimates and assumptions related to the pricing of the asset or liability including assumptions regarding risk.

A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024.

Money Market Funds – Valued at the quoted net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year-end. The NAV is a quoted price in an active market and is classified within level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Mutual Funds – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The NAV is a quoted price in an active market and is classified within level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5 – PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Parties-in-interest are defined under DOL regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering services to the Plan, the Employer and certain others. Certain investments were managed by Capital Bank and Trust Company. Capital Bank and Trust Company is the custodian as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions under ERISA. The Plan also paid fees for administrative and investment advisory fees rendered by parties-in-interest. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 6 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions as any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become one hundred percent vested in their employer contributions. However, no such action may deprive any participant or beneficiary under the Plan of any vested right.

NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS

The Company has adopted an approved volume submitter plan which received an Internal Revenue Service advisory opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 that indicated the form of the Plan satisfied the qualification requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. While the restated Plan document does not have an opinion the Company and Plan management believe that the Plan is currently designed and operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and the Plan to be tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

NOTE 8 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
