Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal controls relevant to the audits in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal controls. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal controls-related matters that we identified during the audits.

Other Matters

Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental Schedule H, Line 4i- Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included



in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following brief description of the Sibley Memorial Hospital 401(k) Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan covering all employees of Sibley Memorial Hospital (the Plan Sponsor) who have completed 1,000 hours of service in the 12-month period and are age 21 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Sibley Memorial Hospital Pension Committee (the Committee) is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan's Board of Trustees.

The Plan was amended and restated effective May 28, 2020.

Recent Legislation

The Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement (SECURE) Act 2.0 was signed into the 2023 Consolidations Appropriations Act under the Securing a Strong Retirement Act on December 29, 2022, with retirement provisions designed to increase retirement savings, facilitate access to retirement savings, encourage employees to save for retirement, and lower employers' cost of offering and funding retirement plans. The Plan's management and those charged with governance have a policy to incorporate these legislative changes in its Plan document by the prescribed deadlines

Contributions

Eligible employees may elect to contribute through regular payroll deductions on a pre-tax or Roth basis, from 1% to 50% of their annual compensation. The Plan automatically enrolled eligible employees hired after July 1, 2001, and through August 4, 2004, pursuant to a deemed salary reduction agreement in which contributions total 1% of compensation for participants who do not affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Effective January 1, 2009, automatic enrollment was reinstated with an automatic enrollment of 3% of compensation. For employees hired on or after January 1, 2014, the contributions total 3% of compensation during the first year of participation and increase by 1% each following year up to a maximum of 6% of compensation, unless otherwise affirmatively elected by the participant.

Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also rollover distributions from other qualified plans.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (continued)

Contributions (continued)

The Plan Sponsor makes matching contributions on the employees' behalf at a rate of 50% of elective deferral contributions up to 3% of eligible compensation. The Plan Sponsor may make discretionary profit-sharing contributions to the Plan. There were no such contributions during the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan Sponsor also makes a Basic Hospital Contribution and Excess Contribution (both as defined in the Plan document) for each eligible participant in the Plan without regard to the participant's elective deferral, and which is calculated based on each participant's compensation earned during the applicable payroll period. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, employer contributions, and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings and account balances, as defined. The participant is entitled to a benefit that cannot exceed the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants are 100% vested after completing three years of service from the date of hire.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or a direct rollover into another qualified plan.

Forfeitures

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$413,926 and \$421,722, respectively. These can be used to reduce future matching contributions to the Plan. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$413,089 was used to offset 2024 employer contributions.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (continued)

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. A participant's Roth contribution account and hospital contribution account shall not be available for a loan. Principal and interest is paid bi-weekly through payroll deduction. Participants also have the option to pay off notes at any time by money order or certified check. Participants are allowed a maximum of two loans. Loan repayment terms can not exceed five years unless the loan is for the purchase of a principal residence (fifteen-year maximum term). Notes bear interest at a rate that reflects the current market rates charged by financial institutions for similar loans.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and custodian. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation/(depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Contributions

Employee and employer match contributions are recorded in the period that the Plan Sponsor makes payroll deductions from the participant's earnings. The discretionary profit-sharing contributions and Basic Hospital contributions are typically funded after the Plan year-end, within the timeframe prescribed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of the Plan are allocated and charged to the participant accounts. Administrative expenses include recordkeeping fees and expenses related to purchases, sales, or transfers of the Plan's investments. Fees for loan initiation and maintenance are paid for by the participant and management and other fees for investment funds offered under the Plan may be subtracted from the investment fund's assets in determining the investment fund's unit or net asset value. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation/(depreciation) of fair value of investments. Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements.

Subsequent Events

The Plan Administrator evaluated subsequent events and transactions through October 7, 2025, the date these financial statements were available for issue, and has determined that no material subsequent events have occurred that would affect the information presented or require additional disclosure.

In October 2025, the Plan transferred its assets from Principal Trust Company to State Street Bank. Additionally, Transamerica Retirement Solutions became the Plan's recordkeeper. The Plan Administrator evaluated subsequent events and transactions through October 7, 2025, the date these financial statements were available for issue, and has determined that no other material subsequent events have occurred that would affect the information presented or require additional disclosure.

3. CERTIFIED INVESTMENTS

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation/(depreciation) in fair value of investments, interest and dividends and interest on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan Administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Principal Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the entity has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (continued)

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments measured at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the current trading value of shares held by the Plan at year end.

Common collective trusts: One of the common collective trust funds is invested in securities that are traded in active markets. These active market inputs are principally used to determine fair market value. As such, the fund is reported at Level 2. The stable value fund is valued at the net asset value (NAV) of the underlying investment contracts. The funds' estimated fair value is net asset value, exclusive of the adjustment to contract value and has not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. The fair value of the collective trust fund recognized as NAV is deemed appropriate as the collective trust fund does not have a finite live, unfunded commitments, or significant restrictions on redemptions.

5. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Plan holds a traditional investment contract that meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria, and therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The contract value of the unallocated contract as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, was \$30,152,459 and \$30,463,991, respectively.

5. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT (continued)

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan is a guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 0 percent. The guaranteed value interest rate will not be changed more frequently than once per year. The contract cannot be terminated before the scheduled maturity date.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following:

1. Amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan);
2. Changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions;
3. Bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan;
4. The failure of the Plan sponsor to qualify for exemption from Federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA; and/or
5. Premature termination of the contract.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events including the following:

1. An uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines;
2. A breach of material obligation under the contract;
3. A material misrepresentation; and/or
4. A material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

6. RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Principal Trust Company. Additionally, Principal Trust Company provides certain administrative services to the Plan. These transactions qualify as party in interest transactions.

7. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate risk, market risk and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near term, and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amount reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

8. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the Plan is terminated, all participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

9. INCOME TAX STATUS

The IRS has determined and informed the Plan Sponsor by a letter dated February 20, 2018 that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code, and therefore, believes the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.
