INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed the audits of the financial statements of the Tarbell and Keystone 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for plan benefits - modified accrual basis as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits - modified accrual basis for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Tarbell and Keystone 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 7 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified accrual basis of accounting.

- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the modified accrual basis of accounting described in Note 1; this includes determining that the modified accrual basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financials are issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of the modified accrual basis of accounting.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, on the modified accrual basis of accounting.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.

Other Matters

Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 1 of the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements are prepared on the modified accrual basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) and the supplemental schedule of delinquent transactions are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements.

The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agree to or are derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- The form and content of the supplemental schedules, other than the information in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The information in the supplemental schedules related to assets held by and certified by the Hand Benefits & Trust Company (the "Custodian"), agree to, or are derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by the Custodian that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1. Significant Accounting Policies

Valuation of investments: The Plan includes investments in registered investment companies and a stable value fund that are reported at fair value. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

The changes in the difference between value and the cost of investments and realized gains and losses are reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits - modified accrual basis as an increase or decrease in appreciation or depreciation in the value of investments.

Accounting method: The Plan prepares its financial statements on a modified accrual basis of accounting. Under this method, contributions and other amounts receivable are recognized, but interest and dividends earned on investments are not accrued. The modified accrual basis of accounting is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Estimates and assumptions: The preparation of financial statements requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and changes therein, and the disclosure of contingent assets. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Excess contributions payable: Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. Excess contributions payable also include the employer contributions in excess and are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to employer match. During the Plan years ending December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no liabilities for any excess contributions payable.

Payment of benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Note 2. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Tarbell and Keystone 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Further information about the Plan Document and benefit provisions is available from the Plan Administrator.

General: The Plan was established January 1, 1993 and was last restated on January 1, 2022. The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of the Plan Administrator, Tarbell & Brodich Professional Association (the "Company") who have attained age 21 and completed 500 hours of service within a six-month time period. If this requirement is not met, the employee is then subject to a one year of service requirement. Entry into the Plan occurs on the first day of the Plan quarter following completion of the eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Company is also the Plan Administrator and Plan Sponsor.

Plan management is currently evaluating the provisions of the SECURE Act to determine which amendments will be made, if any, and how the Plan will adopt controls for mandatory provisions as applicable.

Contributions: Under the Plan, participants may elect to make pre-tax contributions ("deferrals") to their participant directed accounts held by Hand Benefits & Trust Company (the "Custodian").

Participants are also permitted to make after-tax Roth contributions; these deferrals are limited to 65% of compensation, subject to certain limitations under Sections 415(c), 402(g) and 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants who have attained, or expect to attain, age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions..

Participant contributions may be matched by the Company at a percentage of the participants' contributions, as determined by the Company. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company matched 100% of each participants deferrals up to a maximum of 5%. Participants must be employed on the last day of the plan year. The matching company contribution is invested as directed by the participants. The Company may also provide a discretionary profit-sharing contribution to participants employed on the last day of the plan year. No profit-sharing contributions were made for the 2024 plan year.

Taxes: Participants are not taxed on their pre-tax deferrals, on the employer contributions allocated to their accounts, or on earnings thereon until these amounts are distributed. Roth contributions are made with after tax amounts. Roth contributions and earnings thereon are withdrawn tax-free provided all requirements of IRC Section 402A are met.

Vesting: Participants are immediately vested in their salary deferral contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants are also immediately vested in any rollover contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in employer contributions is based on hours of service with 1,000 hours of service per year requirement. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service.

Forfeitures: If upon termination of employment a participant is not fully vested in their employer contribution, all non-vested amounts shall be retained by the Plan. Per the Plan Document, the Plan Administrator may elect to use forfeitures to reduce employer contributions. Total unallocated forfeitures at December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$10,246 and \$2,412, respectively. For the year ended December 31, 2024, no forfeitures were used to reduce employer contributions.

Investment options: Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may choose to direct all contributions into a variety of investment options, with varying degrees of investment risk. Participants may change their investment options, transfer funds, and change deferral percentages as permitted by the Plan.

Notes receivable from participants: Participants may borrow from their vested account balance with a minimum of \$1,000 to a maximum of the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participants vested account balance. Note repayments (borrowings) are treated as a transfer to (from) the investment fund from (to) the participant notes fund. The notes are collateralized by the balance in the participant's account. Notes with terms ranging from five years or less bear interest rates at the Wall Street Journal prime rate plus 1% (8.50% at December 31, 2024). Participants are allowed to have only one loan outstanding at a time. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Payment of benefits: The Plan provides for withdrawals in the event of termination, death, disability or attainment of age 65, the Plan's normal retirement age. Benefit payments can be in the form of a lump-sum, partial withdrawal, or installment payments as elected by the participant. Participants age 59½ and older are entitled to distributions of all or any portion of vested account balances. Participants may take hardship withdrawals, from their elective deferral as well as the vested portion of employer contributions. Participants may withdraw from their rollover account at any time.

Funding policy: Weekly deferrals are withheld from eligible participants' wages and remitted to the Plan based on the instructions provided by the participant. Employer matching contributions and discretionary contributions if any, are remitted on an annual basis to the Custodian, and are also invested based on the instructions provided by the participant.

Income tax status: The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Plan Administrator by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan is designed in accordance with the applicable section of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since the determination letter was received, however the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

The Internal Revenue Service has ruled that the Plan qualifies under Section 401(a) of the IRC and is, therefore, not subject to tax under present income tax law. The Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its exempt status.

The Plan adopted the provisions of FASB ASC 740, Accounting for Uncertainty in Income Taxes. Accordingly, management has evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded the Plan had maintained its tax-exempt status, does not have any significant unrelated business income and had taken no uncertain tax positions that require adjustment or disclosure in the financial statements. With few exceptions, the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations by the U.S. Federal tax authorities for years before 2021.

Note 3. Fair Value Measurement

The Fair Value Measurement of the FASB Accounting Standards (FASB ASC 820-10) provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820-10 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs are other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability. Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Registered investment companies: Valued at the NAV of shares held by the Plan at year end.

Stable value funds: The Plan's interest in the fund is valued each day the exchange is open. The fund will attempt to maintain a stable value of \$10.00 per unit. However, there can be no assurance that the value of the units in the fund will not fluctuate. The value of each unit is determined by subtracting total liabilities from total assets and dividing the remainder by the number of units outstanding. The fund is valued at contract value, which is expected to approximate fair value.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Administrator has the right under the Plan to discontinue its matching contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 6. Transactions with Parties-in-Interest

The Company provides to the Plan certain accounting and administrative services for which no fees are charged. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Notes receivable from participants are also considered party-in-interest transactions. However, under the provisions of ERISA these transactions meet the criteria for exemption, are not considered prohibited transactions, and do not need to be reported in the supplementary schedules of Form 5500.

Note 7. Information Certified by the Plan's Custodian

The Plan Administrator has elected the methods of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the Custodian has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate.

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 7, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued and the following subsequent event has been noted. No subsequent events were identified that would require disclosure in the financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2024.
