All plan assets were transferred to the control of the Plan on January 1, 2024. Our opinion has not been modified with respect to this matter.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1. Plan Description

The following description of the MPI Engineered Technologies, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan & Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution profit-sharing plan and trust with a qualified cash or deferred 401(k) arrangement covering all employees of MPI Engineered Technologies, LLC (the Company) except for leased employees and non-resident aliens. Participation in the Plan is available for all eligible employees who have attained the age 18 and completed two months of eligible service, as defined by the Plan. The Plan was established by the Company on November 16, 2012, most recently restated on January 1, 2024 and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Effective January 1, 2024, the MPI Engineered Technologies, LLC USW Indiana 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan & Trust was merged into the Plan. Net assets totaling approximately \$1,181,000 were transferred into the Plan.

Trustee: Transamerica Life Insurance Company, Inc. is the Plan's trustee. Transamerica Life Insurance Company, Inc. invests all participant and employer contributions, as well as earnings thereon, pursuant to the terms of the Plan.

Contributions: The Plan allows participants to elect to defer a portion of their compensation up to 100%, including any catch-up contributions for participants who have attained age 50, not to exceed the maximum amounts allowed for by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and the Plan documents. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions, including their employer contribution, into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 3% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated index fund until changed by the participant. The amount of the participant's deferred compensation is treated as a participant elective contribution, allocated to that participant's elective account, and is 100% vested at the time of contribution. Any portion of this contribution can be elected by the participant as a Roth contribution.

The Company may contribute a discretionary matching percentage of each participant's compensation, as determined annually, to the Plan each year. The Company may also make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution, to be determined annually. Contributions are accumulated and invested, as directed by participants, in a trust fund held by the custodian. In 2024, the Company elected to contribute a 100% match up to 2% of employee contributions. Employer contributions are invested in manner similar to participant deferrals, directed by the participants.

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Participant accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's voluntary contributions and an allocation of (a) the Company's discretionary matching contribution, if any; (b) the Company's discretionary profit-sharing contribution, if any; and (c) Plan earnings. The accounts are charged for any withdrawals, distributions, and administrative expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Note 1. Plan Description (Continued)

Vesting: Participants have no vested interest in the Company contributions until they have completed one year of service, at which time they become 50% vested. Vesting increases by 25% each year up to 100% after three years of plan participation and service. An employee is considered to have completed one year of service for purposes of vesting upon the completion of 1,000 hours of service at any time during a plan year. Participants are fully vested immediately with respect to their voluntary contributions, rollovers and earnings thereon.

Notes receivable from participants: Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of the lesser of \$100,000 or 100% of the vested balance in the participant's account. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan Administrator. The term of such loans may not exceed five years except in the case of a loan for the purchase of a principal residence which may not exceed thirty years. Participants may have a maximum of two outstanding loans at a time. Principal and interest is paid ratably, through payroll deductions.

Payment of vested benefits: Participants, or their beneficiaries, are entitled to receive the entire amount of their interests in the Plan upon retirement, death, total or permanent disability, employment termination, reaching the age of 59½ or qualifying for a hardship distribution, as defined in the Plan. A participant will be considered to have suffered a disability if he or she is permanently unable to perform his or her customary duties for the employer due to a mental or physical condition which can be expected to result in death or be of a long continued and indefinite duration as determined by the Plan administrator. On termination of service, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of his or her account. If the participant's vested balance is less than or equal to \$1,000, the entire sum will be distributed as soon as possible following the participant's separation from service. If the participant's vested balance is greater than \$1,000, they can elect to receive a lump-sum distribution.

Forfeitures: Forfeitures are used to pay plan expenses, reduce employer contributions, or restore participant accounts. Forfeitures used for the years ended December 31, 2024 were approximately and \$21,000. Unallocated forfeiture as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, were approximately \$82,000 and \$38,000, respectively.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition: Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See below for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Risk and uncertainties: Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near-term and those changes could materially affect the amount reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Notes receivable from participants: Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent participant notes are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payments of benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid. Since financials are accrual basis, any distributions unpaid as the plan year end are recorded as a liability. There were no unpaid distributions at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Excess contributions payable: Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) for any given plan year are recorded as a liability at December 31, 2024 and 2023, with a corresponding reduction to contributions. There were no excess contributions in 2024.

Administration of Plan assets: Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee received compensation from the Plan.

Administrative expenses: Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the plan sponsor. Expenses paid by the plan sponsor are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and participant distributions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. Personnel and facilities of the Company have been used by the Plan for its accounting and other activities at no charge to the Plan.

Subsequent events: The plan sponsor has evaluated subsequent events through October 13, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan was amended to adopt safe harbor provisions under Section 401(k) of the IRC. The safe harbor provisions are intended to simplify plan administration and ensure compliance with nondiscrimination requirements by providing for mandatory employer contributions and satisfying certain notice and vesting requirements. This amendment was adopted after the end of the plan year ended December 31, 2024, and therefore represents a subsequent event that does not impact the financial statements as of and for the year then ended.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Update (ASC) 820 are described below:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds (registered investment companies): Fair values are based on unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities. Prices are obtained from readily available sources for market transactions involving identical assets or liabilities and these investments are classified as Level 1.

Pooled separate accounts: Valued using the net asset value (NAV) (as a practical expedient) of shares held by the fund at year end. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. The practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount that is different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the pooled separate accounts, the account advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Common/collective investment trust: Value based on the net assets value (NAV) of units of the common/collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the trust less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the Plan will sell the investments for an amount different than the reported NAV.

Stable value collective trust funds: Valued using the net asset value (NAV) of units of the collective trust. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

Note 5. Guaranteed Interest Account

The Plan entered into fully benefit-responsive investments with Transamerica. Transamerica maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged to participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

Transamerica is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer. The crediting rate is reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. Certain events may limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value, but these are primarily limited to termination of the Plan contract with Standard. The Plan administrator does not believe that the termination of the contract, which could limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value, is probable.

For the year ended December 31, 2024, the average crediting rate was 2.26%.

Note 6. Related Party and Party-In-Interest Transactions

The Plan allows for transactions with certain parties who may perform services or have fiduciary responsibilities to the Plan, including the Company. During the year ended December 31, 2024, there were direct fees of approximately \$134,000 charged to the Plan as administrative expenses, and transactions involving the investment of plan assets in investment funds maintained by Transamerica Life Insurance Company, a party-in-interest as defined in Section 3(14) of ERISA. Indirect fees paid by the Plan for investment management services are included in the net appreciation in fair value of investments. Certain employees of the Company provide administrative services to the Plan. These employees are not compensated by the Plan.

Note 7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

Note 8. Income Tax Status and Uncertain Tax Position

The Plan uses a pre-approved plan sponsored by CCH Incorporated DBA FTWilliams Com. The IRS has determined and informed the plan sponsor by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the prototype plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan itself is not required to and has not received a determination letter from the IRS. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving this letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. With few exceptions, the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations by the U.S. federal, state or local tax authorities for the years before 2021.

Note 9. Prohibited Transactions

During 2024, the Plan Sponsor inadvertently failed to deposit \$67,038 of participant contributions and loan repayments within the required time frame as stated by the United States Department of Labor regulations. During 2023 and 2021, the Plan Sponsor inadvertently failed to deposit \$14,821 and \$19,337, respectively, of participant contributions and loan repayments within the required time frame as stated by the United States Department of Labor regulations. The Plan Sponsor has deposited the lost earnings to correct the 2024 and 2023 failures. The Plan Sponsor will deposit the lost earnings to correct the 2021 failures. The corrections were or will be made from the Plan Sponsor's assets and not from assets of the Plan. Additionally, the Plan Sponsor completed or will complete the Form 5330s and pay the applicable excise taxes.
