Scope and nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audit of the financial statements of Celebrity Motor Cars LLC 401 (k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). NOTE 1 - PLAN DESCRIPTION

The following description of the Celebrity Motor Cars LLC 401 (k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

GENERAL:

The Plan is a defined contribution plan, effective January 1, 2012 and amended August 15, 2016, established by Celebrity Motor Cars, LLC (the "Company") under the provisions of Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"), which includes a qualified deferred arrangement as described in Section 401(k) of the IRC, for the benefit of eligible employees of the Company. John Hancock Trust Company, LLC and Empower Retirement, LLC are the trustee as of December 31, 2024, and 2023 and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

ELIGIBILITY:

All full time employees of the Company with three (3) months of service and attained the age of 21 are eligible to participate in the Plan.

CONTRIBUTIONS:

Eligible employees can contribute a minimum of 1% of eligible compensation up to a maximum amount limited by requirements of the IRC. The Company, at its discretion, may match a percentage of the deferred salary contributions and profit sharing contributions. The actual percentage of matching contributions is decided each year by the Company. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the plan. A participant will become eligible to begin receiving matching contributions and profit sharing contributions on the first day of the calendar month coincident with the next date following the date that the participant attains the age of 21 and has completed one (1) year of service.

The Plan permits eligible participants the option to have their account balance from another qualified plan rolled over into the Celebrity Motor Cars LLC 401 (k) Plan. The amounts rolled over to the Plan during the years ended December 31, 2024, and 2023 were \$375,023 and \$3,160,532, respectively, and is included in participant rollovers on the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

VESTING:

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Company matching contributions and profit sharing contributions will vest upon years of service in accordance with the schedule below:

PAYMENTS OF BENEFITS:

Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement (normal, early or late), a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. The form of payment will be a lump sum distribution. Participants under the age of 59½ may obtain all or a portion of their vested participant account balance in the event of financial hardship. The basis for determining financial hardship is in accordance with Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Distribution of benefits to participants upon termination of employment will be limited to only the participant's account balance.

PARTICIPANT ACCOUNTS:

The Plan maintains an account for each participant. In addition to being credited for the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, each account is credited or charged with the participant's allocated, as defined, share of income and expenses of the plan.

NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS:

All participants may borrow funds from their respective investment in the Plan. The loan amount must be \$1,000 or more, but is limited to one half of the participant's vested account balance or \$50,000, whichever is less. Loans bear interest at the prime rate plus 1%, ranging from 4.5% to 10.00% at December 31, 2024, and are payable over a specified period not to exceed five (5) years (except in the case of a principal residence purchase). The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

FORFEITED ACCOUNTS:

The portion of the participant's account balance which is not vested upon termination of employment is forfeited and remains in the Plan. These accounts may be used to reduce employer contributions or may be used to offset administrative expenses. As December 31, 2024, and 2023, the balance in the forfeiture account was \$0 and \$0, respectively.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING:

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

INVESTMENT VALUATION AND INCOME RECOGNITION:

Investments of the Plan are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians and insurance company. See note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS:

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024, and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

PAYMENT OF BENEFITS:

Benefits are recorded when paid.

ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES:

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value investments.

USE OF ESTIMATES IN THE PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and disclosure of contingent assets and contingent liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of additions and deductions during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

EXCESS CONTRIBUTIONS PAYABLE:

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to participant contributions and employer contributions, if applicable. There were excess employer contributions to the plan of \$122,930 as of December 31, 2024 and \$107,493 as of December 31, 2023.

MUTUAL FUND FEES:

Investments in mutual funds are subject to sales charges in the form of front-end loads, back-end loads or 12b-1 fees. Allowable fees under Section 12b-1 of the Investment Company Act of 1940 are annual fees deducted to pay for marketing and distribution costs of the funds. These fees are deducted prior to the allocation of the Plan's investment earnings activity and, thus, not separately identifiable as an expense.

NOTE 3 – INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE (UNAUDITED)

The Plan management has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, John Hancock Trust Company, LLC and Empower Retirement, LLC are the Trustee of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for plan benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the supplemental Schedule H - Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related investment activity reflected in the statements of changes in net assets available for plan benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

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The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONT.)

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds are valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the plan at year end.

The Plan invests in unallocated contracts. The contract provides a guarantee for participant initiated transactions of both principal and interest. The objective is to seek to protect principal and offer fixed returns that exceed returns of money market funds over a full market cycle. The investments are recorded at fair value. Funds are withdrawn from the investment contract by the respective insurance companies to pay for Plan benefits and to make participant directed transfers to other funds pursuant to the terms of the Plan.

Fair value for fixed rate contracts is calculated by projecting the future cash flows for the contract at the contractual crediting rate, and then discounting it by a rate that approximates the current market rates for a contract of equal credit quality and duration. The Fair value in the contract approximates contract value. The crediting interest rate varies by participant, approximately between 1% and 2% during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. All contracts reset crediting interest rates at least quarterly during the term of the contract, based upon prevailing market rates of interest as determined by the insurance companies. There may be a termination charge to either the Plan Sponsor and or the participants of the Plan if the unallocated contract is terminated. (Level 3 input).

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their individual account balances.

NOTE 6 - TAX STATUS

The Plan follows the CCH Incorporated Prototype Non-standard Profit Sharing Plan with CODA which obtained its latest determination letter on March 16, 2010, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and accordingly, no provision for federal income tax has been made in the accompanying financial statements. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in the United States of America requires Plan Management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

NOTE 7 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of assets available for benefits.

NOTE 8 – RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

John Hancock Trust Company, LLC and Empower Retirement, LLC are the directed trustees and record-keeper for the Plan and therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions.

The directed trustees provide certain administrative services to the Plan. The directed trustees receive revenues from mutual fund service providers for services the directed trustees provide to the funds. This revenue is used to offset certain amounts owed to the directed trustees for its administrative services to the Plan.

Notes receivable from Plan participants qualify as party in interest transactions.

NOTE 9 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
