Report on the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Orange County Employees Association Health and Welfare Trust, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits and benefit obligations as of December 31, 2024 and 2023; the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits and changes in benefit obligations for the years then ended; and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Orange County Employees Association Health and Welfare Trust's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Orange County Employees Association Health and Welfare Trust's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of Orange County Employees Association Health and Welfare Trust (the "Plan") are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Investment Valuation, Transactions, and Income Recognition

General - Investments are carried at fair value, which is determined, presented, and disclosed in accordance with Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification ("FASB ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*. Under FASB ASC 820, fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability (i.e., the "exit price") in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

FASB ASC 820 establishes a fair value hierarchy for inputs used in measuring fair value that maximizes the use of observable inputs and minimizes the use of unobservable inputs by requiring that the most observable inputs be used when available. Observable inputs are those that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability based on market data obtained from sources independent of the Plan. Unobservable inputs reflect the Plan's assumptions about inputs that market participants would use in pricing the investments developed based on the best information available in the circumstances. The fair value hierarchy is categorized into three levels, based on the inputs, as follows:

Level 1 - Valuations based on quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Valuations based on quoted prices in markets that are not active, quoted prices for similar investments in active markets or model-based valuations for which all significant assumptions are observable and can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3 - Valuations based on unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and are significant to the overall fair value measurement. Values are determined using proprietary pricing models, discounted cash flow models that include the investment entities' own judgments and estimations, or some other pricing method using unobservable inputs.

Inputs and Valuation Methods: In determining fair value, FASB ASC 820 allows various valuation approaches. The specific methods used for each of the Plan's investment classes are presented below:

Mutual Funds - The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted market prices in active markets (Level 1).

U.S. Government Securities – Valued using pricing models maximizing the use of observable inputs for similar securities. This includes basing value on yields currently available on comparable securities of issuer with similar credit ratings (Level 2).

Marketable Certificates of Deposit – Valued using pricing models maximizing the use of observable inputs for similar securities. This includes basing value on yields currently available on comparable securities of issuer with similar credit ratings (Level 2).

Valuation Methods, Consistency: The valuation techniques used in the accompanying financial statements have been consistently applied.

Transactions and Income Recognition: Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividend and interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Computer Equipment and Software

Office equipment is recorded at cost. Expenditures for renewals and improvements that significantly add to the productive capacity or extend the useful life of an asset are capitalized. Expenditures for maintenance and repairs are charged to expense.

Depreciation and amortization are calculated using the straight-line method over estimated useful lives of five years. Accumulated depreciation and amortization at December 31, 2024 and 2023 is \$165,009 and \$220,238, respectively.

The Plan reviews the carrying value of equipment for impairment whenever events and circumstances indicate that the carrying value of an asset may not be recoverable from the estimated future cash flows expected to result from its use and eventual disposition. In cases where undiscounted expected future cash flows are less than the carrying value, an impairment loss is recognized equal to an amount by which the carrying value exceeds the fair value of assets. The factors considered by management in performing this assessment include current operating results, trends and prospects, the manner in which the equipment is used, and the effects of obsolescence, demand, competition, and other economic factors. Based on this assessment there was no impairment at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Benefit Obligations

As a result of the eligibility provisions of the Plan, hours worked by participants through December 31, 2024 and 2023, produced eligibility through January 2025 and 2024, respectively, for active participants. Accordingly, group insurance premiums and claims incurred are accrued on the basis of hours worked through December 31, 2024 and 2023, and eligibility through January 2025 and 2024, respectively. These amounts are recorded as amounts currently payable on the statements of benefit obligations.

The liabilities for future payment of claims incurred but unreported at December 31, 2024 and 2023, have been estimated on the claims processed post year end and has been included in the amounts currently payable on the statements of benefit obligations.

Operating Expenses

Expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits and benefit obligations. In addition, certain investments related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid. These payments are recorded as insured benefits and self-funded benefits in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. Claim payments are recorded when submitted to the Plan by the third-party claim's processor for reimbursement. Claims paid by the claims processor prior to year-end or claim payments submitted to the Plan by the third-party claims processor that are not yet paid are recorded as an amount currently payable in the accompanying statements of benefit obligations. Premiums not yet paid at year-end are included as an amount currently payable in the accompanying statements of benefit obligations.

Employer Contributions and Contributions Receivable

The Plan's policy is to recognize contributions based on the latest executed collective bargaining agreement on an individual employer basis. Contributions from the participating employer is based on a rate per hour for covered employees. Contributions reported in the financial statements relate to participants who are on the payroll as of the first day of each month. These contributions provide coverage for participants to the last day of the month in which they are reported. Contributions due but not paid prior to year-end are recorded as contributions receivable.

Contributions from employers are accrued based upon subsequent cash receipts and an estimation of amounts due based on historical remittance trends. The carrying amount of contributions receivable is reduced by an allowance for credit losses that reflects management's best estimate of the amounts that will not be collected. Factor which influence management's judgment in determining the appropriate allowance for credit losses include past collection experience, industry standards, current economic conditions, and expected future economic conditions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the allowance was \$0.

Deposit with Insurance Companies

The premium stabilization reserve has been included as an asset of the Plan until such amounts are used to pay premiums. The reserve is nonforfeitable should the insurance contract terminate. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan has a premium stabilization reserve with Standard Insurance Company for \$7,719,705 and \$6,350,746, and a surplus receivable of \$1,036,689 and \$0, respectively.

The premium stabilization fund had a favorable increase of \$332,390 and \$336,877, during the plan years ending December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The receivable increases in stabilization reserve are netted against insured benefits paid on the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect reported amounts of assets, liabilities and benefit obligations and the disclosure of contingencies, if any, as of the date of the statements of net assets available for benefits and changes therein during the reporting periods. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investments. Such investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments and the level of uncertainty with respect to changes in the value of investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

2. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

General

The Plan, a health and welfare plan, was established on July 21, 1998, for the purpose of providing health care benefits to eligible participants covered by the collective bargaining agreements between Orange County Employees Association ("OCEA") and the individual employer signatory to the agreements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Administration of the Plan is the responsibility of the Board of Trustees (the "Trustees") and is governed by a joint board consisting of equal representation from the participating employer and the Orange County Employees Association Health and Welfare Trust.

Contributions and Eligibility

Employees are eligible for Health & Welfare benefits and all supplemental benefits if they are employed in an OCEA -represented bargaining unit and are members of OCEA. Employees are eligible for Health & Welfare benefits but not for any supplemental benefits if they are employed in an OCEA-represented bargaining unit and are not a member of OCEA.

Employees who are employed in a bargaining unit not represented by OCEA, a city or district employee, or an extra-help employee and are a member of OCEA, then they may be eligible for certain supplemental benefits.

During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan received contributions from the County of Orange at the principal rate of \$0.30 per hour worked. Participants eligible for supplemental benefits contribute based on rates charged by providers and are contributed by means of payroll deductions.

Participants have the option of contributing via payroll deductions for supplemental benefits. Rates vary based on number of members covered and benefit selected.

Retired participants are provided benefit coverage in accordance with eligibility provisions of the Plan. Retirees are eligible for benefits if they are retired, are a current member of the Retired Employees Association of Orange County and will be receiving a retirement check from the Orange County Employees Retirement System. Retirees are required to pay the full premium of the following benefits: dental, vision, and certain life insurance in order to receive coverage. Effective June 1, 2018, retirees must have been a member of OCEA for at least one year immediately preceding their retirement date in order to be eligible for benefits.

Continuation of health care benefits to persons who could otherwise lose those benefits due to certain events, as mandated by the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act ("COBRA"), has been adopted by the Plan.

Benefits

The Plan provides health and welfare benefits including dental, vision, basic disability, life insurance with AD&D, supplemental benefits, and prepaid legal for eligible employees of the Sponsor and their covered dependents as defined by the plan document. Dental and vision claims are self-funded by the Plan. The claims for dental and vision are processed by the Plan's third-party claims processors under administrative services only ("ASO") arrangements. The claims processors pay claims directly to or on behalf of participants and are then reimbursed by the Plan. Ultimate responsibility for payments to providers and participants is retained by the Plan. Life benefits are insured with premiums paid by the Plan.

3. PRIORITIES UPON TERMINATION

It is the intent of the Trustees to continue the Plan in full force and effect; however, to safeguard against any unforeseen contingencies, the right to discontinue the Plan is reserved to the Trustees. In the event of termination, the Trustees shall first satisfy, or make provisions to satisfy, the obligations of the Plan. Any remaining Plan assets may be allocated among participants and beneficiaries in the manner determined by the Board of Trustees and in accordance with applicable law or transferred to a plan operated by an Internal Revenue Code Section 501(9)(c) trust providing similar benefits. Termination shall not permit any part of the Plan to be used for, or diverted to, purposes other than the exclusive benefit of the participants.

4. TAX STATUS

The voluntary employees' beneficiary association ("VEBA") trust funding certain benefits of the Plan received an exemption letter from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") dated October 9, 2002, stating that the trust is tax-exempt under the provisions of Section 501(c)(9) of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). In addition, the Plan and the trust are required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain the tax-exempt status of the trust. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the related trust is tax-exempt. However, as a result of the Plan's funding policy, from time to time the trust may be subject to income taxes. No federal or state income taxes have been recorded in for unrelated business taxable income.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if it has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

5. CONCENTRATION OF CASH

The Plan maintains its cash at one financial institution. The balance is insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation for up to \$250,000. Cash balances may at times exceed the insured deposit limits. Any loss incurred or a lack of access to such funds could have a significant adverse impact on the Plan's financial condition, results of operations and cash flows.

6. FUNDING POLICY

The Plan is financed primarily by employer and participant contributions on a monthly basis by employer payments and payroll deductions, respectively.

8. RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

As described in Note 1, the Plan paid certain expenses related to Plan operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions are exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

Certain Plan investments are managed by Charles Schwab and Wells Fargo Bank, the custodians as defined by the Plan.

The Plan entered into an agreement with the Orange County Employees Association to have it act in the capacity of an administrative office on behalf of the Plan, and to provide general services as well as direct data processing and IT support. Administrative expenses are billed monthly in accordance with an administrative contract. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$1,416,100 and \$1,374,900 respectively, was paid for OCEA administrative services.
