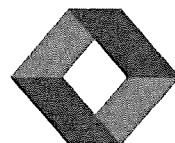
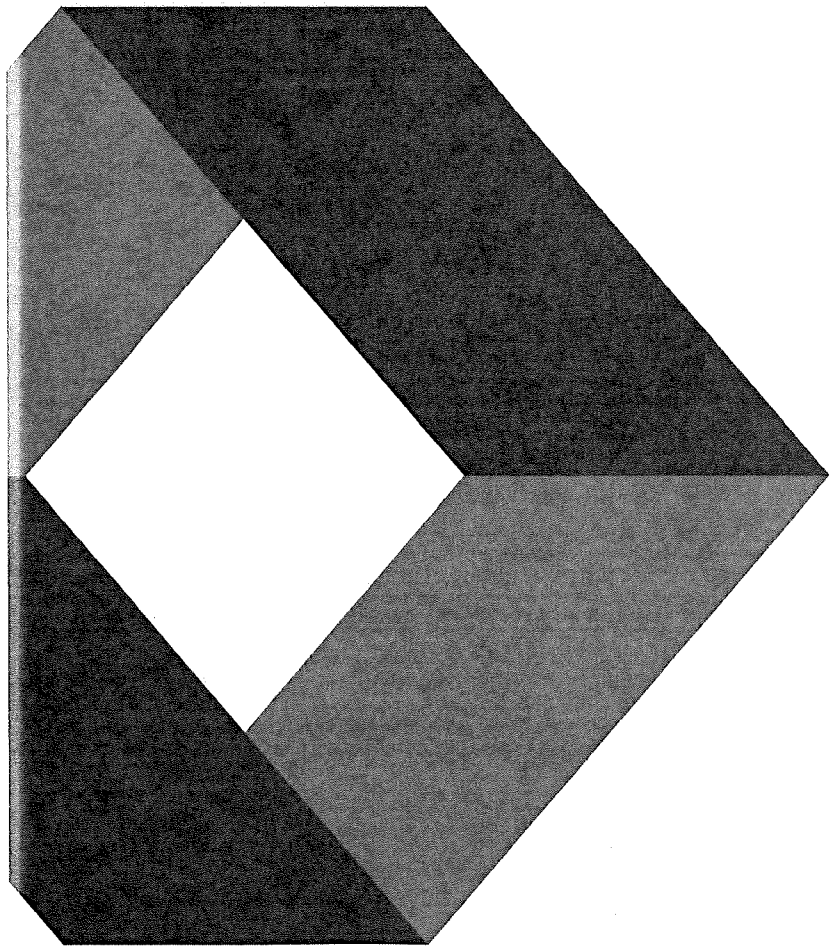

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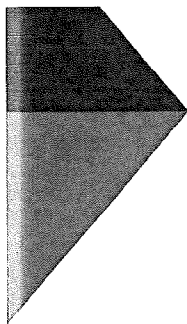

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of The Farber Companies 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of The Farber Companies 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Note A - Description of Plan

The following description of the Farber Companies 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan with a 401(k)-provision covering all non-union and non-leased employees of Farber Specialty Vehicles, Inc. (the "Company"), who have completed one year, 1,000 hours of service and attained age 21. The Company may also make discretionary matching and profit-sharing contributions to the Plan for participants who have attained one year of service as defined by the Plan document. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to the maximum allowed by law of pretax annual compensation as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions in accordance with Internal Revenue Code Section 414(v). Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). The Plan provides for Company matching contributions of 100% of the participants' deferrals, not to exceed 4% of total annual compensation. The Company may also make discretionary profit-sharing contributions to the Plan for the related year. These contributions are funded in the year subsequent to their authorization. All employer contributions are allocated only to the participants directly employed by the contributing employer. The profit-sharing contributions authorized were \$100,000 for 2024 and 2023. All discretionary contributions require the completion of one year of service, as defined in the Plan document. Contributions are subject to IRS limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's own contribution and an allocation of the Company's contribution and plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, employer's safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. Participants vest 20% per year of service after their second year of service. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service.

Investment Options

Participants may direct investments of their account into a range of investment options under the terms of the Plan. Participants can change the investment of their funds on a daily basis.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participant loans are not permitted under the plan.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or due to other reasons, a participant may receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account and may be eligible to rollover the vested interest to an individual retirement account or other eligible plan. To reduce administrative burden to the plan, vested account balances not exceeding \$5,000 will be distributed to participants. Participants who have attained age 59 ½ and are 100% vested in all accounts may elect to withdrawal up to 100% of account balance while employed with the employer.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$0. These accounts can be used to reduce future Employer's contributions or pay for Plan expenses. The December 31, 2024 forfeiture balance, if any, will be used to pay administrative fees in 2025. Employer plan expenses were reduced by \$819 and \$907 by forfeited non-vested accounts during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 respectively.

Note B - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Employer Contributions Receivable

Employer contributions receivable represent employer matching contributions related to participant deferrals withheld prior to December 31, 2024 and 2023 as well as any discretionary profit-sharing contributions approved during the years then ended, respectively. The balance is based on actual collections subsequent to year end. Based on a review of historical losses, current economic conditions and supportable and reasonable forecast assumptions, management has concluded that any expected credit losses on balances outstanding at year end will be immaterial. There were \$109,384 and \$137,362 in employer contributions receivable as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Participant Contributions Receivable

Participant contributions receivable represent participant deferrals withheld prior to December 31, 2024 and 2023. The balance is based on actual collections subsequent to year end. Based on a review of historical losses, current economic conditions and supportable and reasonable forecast assumptions, management has concluded that any expected credit losses on balances outstanding at year end will be immaterial. There were \$0 and \$101,124 in participant contributions receivable as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reductions to contributions. There were no excess contribution in 2024 and 2023.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are deducted from participants' accounts.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Board of Directors determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, custodians, and insurance company. See Note E for discussion of fair value measurements.

The Transamerica Stable Value Option is a fully benefit-responsive investment contract that is a non-tradable obligation of the insurance company. The redemption frequency is daily with no conditions, limits, or restrictions. The effective annual interest rate is established semi-annually and there is no established minimum or maximum interest rate. In general, an occurrence of an event that limits the ability of the investment to transact at contract value would be a significant deterioration in the credit worthiness of Transamerica.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Capital gain distributions are included in interest and dividends. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Note C - Unaudited Information Certified by the Plan Custodian

The December 31, 2024 and 2023, Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits, the investment activities included on the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the years then ended, and the accompanying notes to the financial statements were prepared in part or entirely from information certified by the custodians in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. The information certified includes investments of \$15,073,391 and \$15,064,305 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, and related total investment income of \$1,788,806 for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan's investments were held in custodial accounts maintained by Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Note D - Investments in Insurance Contracts

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan maintained one Guaranteed Investment Contract (GIC) investment option, the Stable Value Core issued by Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company (a-party-in-interest/"VRIAC"). The contract underlying this investment option is considered to be fully benefit responsive in accordance with ASC Topic 962. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the contract value of the investment in the Stable Value Core was \$793,096 and \$1,112,958, respectively.

VRIAC's determination of credited interest rates reflects a number of factors, including mortality and expense risks, interest rate guarantees, the investment income earned on invested assets and the amortization of any capital gains and/or losses realized on the sale of invested assets. A market value adjustment may apply to amounts withdrawn at the request of the contract holder.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (i) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan) (ii) changes to Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions; or (iii) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan Administrator does not believe that the occurrence of any such event which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants is probable.

VRIAC has the option to payout the current value of the contract only after completion of five contract years.

Note E - Fair Value Measurements

FASB ASC Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of value hierarchy under FASB ASC Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Fair Value Measurements

Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are delivered principally from or corroborated by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Fair Value Measurements

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurements.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable measurements.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled separate accounts: Investments are held in pooled separate accounts (PSA's). The PSA's offered are proprietary to Transamerica and many invest exclusively in one underlying mutual fund traded on an established market. The underlying mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded. All of Transamerica's PSA choices are valued daily using publicly available quoted market prices

Note F - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note G - Income Tax Status

The Plan is operated under the Dataair Mass-Submitter Pre-Approved Document including Defined Contribution Pre-Approved Adoption Agreement Non-Standardized Alternative One: Cash or Deferred Profit Sharing Plan established by Dataair Employee Benefit Systems, Inc. The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed Dataair Employee Benefit Systems, Inc. by letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable section of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has not been amended since receiving the determination letter. The Plan administrator and Plan's administrative consultant believe the Plan is designed and currently being operated in compliance with all applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Service Code. Therefore, management believes that the Plan is qualified and that the related trust is exempt from taxation under the Internal Revenue Code.

Note H - Risks and Uncertainties

Investments

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note I - Party-in-Interest Transactions

Parties-in-interest are defined under Department of Labor regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering services to the Plan, the employer, and certain others. Plan transactions with parties-in-interest included administrative fees paid to the Plan's third-party administrators AI Minor & Associates, Inc., and the Plan's custodian, Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company, as well as an investment advisor, Merrill Lynch. Certain Plan investments were managed by Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company, custodian as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Note J - Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 13, 2025, the date the financial statements are available to be issued.
