1. Plan Description

The following description of the Beelman 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the summary plan description for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General – The Plan was established effective July 1, 1993 as a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Beelman Truck Company, Beelman Management, LLC and Beelman River Terminals, Inc. (the “Company”) (the “Plan Sponsor”) who meet the eligibility provisions of the Plan. The Plan is subject to provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Participant Contributions – The Plan is contributory, with participants having the option of contributing up to 100% of eligible compensation, subject to limitations of the Internal Revenue Code. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Company Contributions – The Company may make discretionary matching contributions. The Company matched 25% of each participant’s elective contribution for all of 2024 and 2023. Eligibility for the Company match is achieved after reaching age 21 and after six months of employment.

Effective January 1, 2016, the Plan was amended to allow the Company, in its sole discretion, to make a profit-sharing contribution. Eligibility for any profit-sharing contribution is achieved after reaching age 21 and after six months of employment. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company profit-sharing contribution was equal to 2% of eligible compensation.

Eligible Participants – All employees, as defined in the Plan document, are eligible after reaching age 21 and after two months of employment.

Participants’ Accounts – Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions, the appropriate amount of the Company’s discretionary matching contribution, and an allocation of Plan earnings or losses and administrative expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting – Participants are 100% vested in all employee contributions and earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company’s discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of service. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service. Credited service is measured by 1,000 hours in a Plan year. A participant will become fully vested automatically upon attainment of normal retirement age, if employment is terminated due to disability or death, or upon termination of the Plan.

Payment of Benefits – Upon retirement, upon leaving employment due to disabling illness or injury, or upon termination prior to retirement, a participant’s vested balance in the Plan will be distributed either as a transfer to another qualified plan, a transfer to an individual retirement account, or in a lump-sum distribution to the designated participant or beneficiary. For participants with an account balance that is less than \$1,000, the vested portion of their account will be “cashed out” via a lump-sum distribution.

For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were \$155,790 and \$65,415, respectively, in notes receivable from participants that were “offset” and reported as “Benefits Paid to Participants”.

1. Plan Description (continued)

Forfeited Plan Assets – If a participant forfeits any unvested balances in their account, the forfeited assets are used to reduce Company contributions or Plan expenses. Forfeitures used to reduce Company contributions during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$156,815 and \$198,470, respectively. Forfeitures used to pay Plan expenses during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$0 and \$131, respectively. Forfeitures available to reduce future Company contributions or Plan expenses totaled \$5,877 and \$1,712 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Notes Receivable from Participants – The Plan allows participants to borrow money from their account balance. Active participants with a vested account balance of at least \$2,000 are eligible to borrow from their Plan balance. The minimum note amount is \$1,000 and the maximum note amount is the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the vested account balance. General-purpose notes have a repayment term of no greater than 5 years. Principal residence notes have a term of no greater than 30 years. The interest rate is determined at the effective date of the note and is the existing prime rate plus an additional 1%.

The notes receivable from participants balance as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$1,198,774 and \$1,062,199, respectively. Deemed distributions of notes receivable from participants during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$38,701 and \$0, respectively. Interest on notes receivable from participants for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$83,876 and \$59,554, respectively. Notes receivable from participants that are considered in default at December 31, 2024 totaled \$0.

Excess Contributions – Contributions received from participants for 2024 totaling \$3,645 were paid in 2025 to certain active participants to return to them excess deferral contributions as required to satisfy the relevant nondiscrimination provisions of the Plan. These amounts, with earnings or losses, were remitted after March 15, 2025 and therefore will be reported as a corrective distribution during the year ended December 31, 2025.

Contributions received from participants for 2023 are net of payments made totaling \$13,057 in 2024 to certain active participants to return to them excess deferral contributions as required to satisfy the relevant nondiscrimination provisions of the Plan. These amounts, with earnings or losses, were remitted prior to March 15, 2024 and therefore are included within the excess contributions payable at December 31, 2023.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting – The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual method of accounting.

Investment Valuation – Investments are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Contract value is the relevant measure for that portion of the net assets available for plan benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the plan.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Investment Risk – Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for plan benefits. Participants in the Plan assume all investment risk connected with any decrease in the Plan assets, and such assets are the sole source of payments under the Plan.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant notes are reclassified as distributions based on the terms of the Plan document.

Benefits Paid to Participants – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses – Plan expenses may be paid by the Plan unless the Plan Sponsor, in its sole discretion, elects at any time to pay part or all of such expenses. The Plan has a fee recapture arrangement funded by basis point reductions from each participants' account. The reduction amounts allocated to this account (referred to as an EASE account) are maintained in the Plan to be used for administrative and other Plan expenses. This fee recapture is reported as other income in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Plan Benefits and was \$29,147 and \$23,619 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Any unused balance will be allocated back to the participants. The Plan has a specified amount of time subsequent to the Plan year to use for administrative and other Plan expenses prior to any remaining balance being allocated back to the participants. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, there was \$12,139 and \$0, respectively, in unused amounts allocated back to participants. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the balance in this unallocated EASE account was \$29,377 and \$18,159, respectively.

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of increases and decreases in net assets during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Reclassification – The financial statements for 2023 have been reclassified to conform to the 2024 financial statement presentation.

Subsequent Events – The Plan has evaluated the existence of subsequent events through October 14, 2025, which represents the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Fair Value Measurements

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for plan benefits, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. The fair value of the Plan's mutual funds at December 31, 2024 and 2023, measured using Level 1 inputs, was \$40,167,234 and \$33,703,928, respectively.

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs consist of unobservable inputs with little or no market activity and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs are used only when Level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available.

An asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used should maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The policy is to recognize transfers between Levels 1 and 2 and into and out of level 3 as of the date of the event or change in circumstances that caused the transfer. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no transfers between Levels 1 and 2 and no transfers into or out of Level 3.

Level 1 - The fair values of the mutual funds are determined by reference to the mutual fund's underlying assets, which are principally marketable equity and fixed income securities. The valuations of marketable equity and fixed income securities are based on the closing price reported in the active market where the individual securities of the mutual funds are traded. Shares held in mutual funds traded on national securities exchanges are valued at their net asset value. The measurement frequency is daily.

4. General Account

The Plan additionally offers a general account option, which is reported at contract value. The general account, being Level 2 investments as previously defined, is not actively traded and is valued based on observable inputs being the amounts contributed or transferred to the general account, plus earnings, less any withdrawals or transfers out, and less any administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The contract value of the general account at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$3,698,595 and \$4,167,025, respectively.

Principal and interest earned over a defined term, less any applicable charges, is guaranteed. The guaranteed rate is the effective annual rate earned by all contributions to that general account during that reporting year. Contributions continue to earn that calculated interest rate for the duration of the guaranteed term. Interest income earned in the general account for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$67,508 and \$64,824, respectively.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value. Such events include the following: (a) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (b) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (c) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (d) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. Furthermore, certain events would allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Examples of such events include (a) an uncured breach of the Plan's investment guidelines, (b) a material amendment to the contract without the issuer's consent, (c) a violation of a material obligation under the contract, or (d) a material misrepresentation. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Plan participants or the issuer are probable of occurring.

The general account does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity.

5. Employer Contributions

As noted in the summary of significant accounting policies, for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 the Company matched 25% of each participant's elective contribution and made a profit-sharing contribution equal to 2% of eligible compensation. The allocation of the employer contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 was as follows:

7. Transactions with Parties-In-Interest

For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan's custodian was Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company. The Plan invested in investment options managed by the custodian.

The Plan incurred administrative expenses in the amount of \$244,219 and \$221,498, respectively, for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions that are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

8. Certification of Investment Information (Unaudited)

Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, the custodian of the Plan as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, has supplied the Plan administrator with a certification as to the completeness and accuracy of all investment information in the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Plan Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Plan Benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and in the supplemental schedule as of December 31, 2024.

9. Plan Termination Priorities

Although it has not expressed intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions set forth in the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. In the event of termination of the Plan, the right of all participants to benefits would become 100% vested and nonforfeitable. The amount of the account balance due each participant would be distributed in accordance with the payment provisions of the Plan.

10. Internal Revenue Service Status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Plan by letter dated October 29, 2008, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax consultant believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are not uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements.

The Plan is required to file form 5500 "Annual Return / Report of Employee Benefit Plan". The returns of the Plan are subject to examination by the respective taxing authorities, generally for three years after they are filed. The returns for the years ended December 31, 2022, 2023 and 2024 are still considered open subject to possible examination.
