### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Marshfield Clinic Salary Reduction Plan (Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. 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**Note 1. Description of Plan**

The following description of the Marshfield Clinic Salary Reduction Plan and Trust (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA), as amended.

**General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Marshfield Clinic Health System, Inc. and related controlled entities (Employer).

On March 27, 2020, the *Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act* was passed by Congress. The CARES Act, among other things, includes several relief provisions available to tax qualified retirement plans and their participants. Plan management evaluated the impact of the CARES Act on the Plan and adopted several of the provisions regarding the expansion of allowed Plan distributions, the repayment of loans and the suspension of required minimum distributions. These temporary CARES Act provisions expired at the end of 2020. The Plan will be amended to reflect these changes prior to the December 31, 2025 deadline.

**Eligibility**

Eligibility to make 401(k) contributions is on the employee's employment commencement date or, if later, the attainment of age 18. Eligibility to receive matching contributions is his or her employment commencement date or, if later, the attainment of age 18, if the employee is scheduled to work an average of at least 1,000 hours in a 12-month period beginning with his or her employment commencement date. Each employee who is not scheduled to work an average of at least 1,000 hours in such 12-month period but who completes an eligibility year of service (worked 1,000 hours) or who becomes scheduled to work an average of at least 1,000 hours in any 12-month period shall become eligible to receive matching contributions upon the occurrence of either of such 2 events, or if later, upon the attainment of age 18. An employee who becomes eligible to receive matching contributions shall remain eligible to receive matching contributions even if his or her hours of service drop below 1,000 in any 1 or more plan years.

**Contributions**

Upon eligibility, a participant may elect to defer up to 100% of annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, on a tax-deferred basis or make Roth 401(k) contributions, subject to Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limits. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan also includes an auto-enrollment provision for those scheduled to work at least 1,000 hours in a 12-month period beginning with his or her commencement date or, if later, the attainment of age 18. This auto-enrollment provision automatically enrolls those eligible employees (scheduled for at least 1,000 hours in a 12-month period) in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect to not participate. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 6% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balance fund until changed by the participants. The automatic contribution rate becomes effective as soon as practical after 60 days from the employee's eligibility date.

Prior to January 1, 2020, for employees in key employee groups and those hired prior to January 1, 2017, the Employer made a matching contribution equal to 25% of the first 4% of compensation contributed by a participant. For employees not in a key employee group, the Employer made a matching contribution equal to 50% of the first 6% of eligible compensation contributed by a participant.

## **Marshfield Clinic Salary Reduction Plan and Trust Notes to Financial Statements December 31, 2024 and 2023**

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In 2020, the Plan was amended to change the matching contribution. Effective January 1, 2020, all employees, regardless of hire date and employee group, receive a matching contribution equal to 50% of the first 6% of eligible compensation contributed by a participant.

Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to suspend matching contributions for plan year 2024. However, subsequent to that date, the matching contribution was reinstated during 2024 as follows:

- Effective with the pay date ending May 17, 2024, a matching contribution equal to 50% of the first 2% of eligible compensation contributed by a participant.
- Effective with the pay date beginning on June 14, 2024, a matching contribution equal to 50% of the first 4% of eligible compensation contributed by a participant.
- Effective with the pay date beginning on September 20, 2024, a matching contribution equal to 50% of the first 6% of eligible compensation contributed by a participant.
- Effective with pay periods occurring on and after November 15, 2024, a matching contribution equal to 100% of the first 4% of eligible compensation contributed by a participant.
- Effective with pay periods occurring on or after January 1, 2025, a matching contribution equal to 100% of the first 4% of eligible compensation contributed by a participant, then 50% of eligible compensation contributed in excess of 4% of eligible compensation up to 6% of eligible compensation.

### ***Investment Options***

Participants direct the investment of their accounts into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers mutual funds, common stock, corporate bonds, and common collective trust funds. In addition, participants may utilize an individual self-directed brokerage option, through which participants are able to invest in a variety of securities including stocks, bonds, mutual funds, and government securities in accordance with the Plan document.

### ***Participant Accounts***

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of the Company's contributions and plan earnings (losses) and charged with benefit payments, transaction fees related to notes receivable from participants and distributions, and allocations of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

### ***Vesting***

Participants are immediately vested in all contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

### ***Payment of Benefits***

On termination of service, death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum amount, an annuity, one of several installment methods, or some combination thereof. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive a lump sum payment, a paid-up deferred annuity contract, a direct rollover, or may leave the account balance in the Plan if the account is greater than \$5,000. Participants may defer benefit distributions until April 1 following the calendar year in which they attain age 72 or terminate employment, whichever is later. Participants who attain age 72 after December 31, 2019, the required beginning date is April 1 following the calendar year in which they attain age 72 or terminate employment, whichever is later. If the participant's account is greater than \$1,000 but not greater than \$5,000, and the participant does not elect to have his or her distribution paid in a lump sum or transferred to another retirement plan or individual retirement plan, then benefits will be distributed into a direct rollover to an individual retirement account. Participants with accounts under \$1,000 upon termination will receive a lump sum payment if a direct rollover to another plan or individual retirement account is not elected. Upon death of a participant, a participant's beneficiary should refer to the plan document for a complete description of the various disbursement options and requirements.

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***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$500 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates ranging from 3.25% to 8.50%, which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the plan administrator. At December 31, 2024, outstanding loans maturity dates ranged from 2024 to 2038. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

The Plan also allows for rollover loans obtained from another qualified Plan.

**Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

***Basis of Accounting***

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

***Estimates***

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

***Investment Valuation and Income Recognition***

The Plan's sole investment as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, was its interest in the Marshfield Clinic Master Trust (Master Trust). The Master Trust is a multiple-plan trust, ownership of which is divided between the two defined contribution plans of the Employer based on allocated units of participation. Each participation unit has a value equal to the total fair value of the Master Trust's net assets divided by the total participant units outstanding. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Master Trust's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

***Payment of Benefits***

Benefits are recorded upon distribution.

***Administrative Expenses***

Expenses of the Plan, including brokerage fees, commissions, and fees of accountants, counsel, and other specialists, are paid by the Plan. The majority of administrative and investment expenses paid in 2024 and 2023 are included as a reduction in plan interest in net investment income of the Master Trust.

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**Subsequent Events**

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 14, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Effective October 8, 2025, the Sanford Board of Trustees resolved to merge the Plan with the Sanford Retirement Savings Plan. The merger is expected to occur on or before March 1, 2026.

**Note 3. Interest in Master Trust**

The Plan's interest in the assets of the Master Trust is included in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. The participating plans in the Master Trust's net assets and their respective percent interests as of December 31 were as follows:

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**Note 4. Fair Value Measurements**

Fair value, as defined under GAAP, is an exit price representing the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. GAAP establishes a three-tier fair value hierarchy which prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value. These tiers include:

- Level 1** Observable inputs such as quoted prices in active markets.
- Level 2** Inputs other than quoted prices in active markets that are either directly or indirectly observable.
- Level 3** Unobservable inputs about which little or no market data exists, therefore requiring an entity to develop its own assumptions.

Assets and liabilities are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The Plan's assessment of the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement requires judgment and may affect the valuation of fair value assets and liabilities and their placement within the fair value hierarchy levels.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

***Cash equivalents***

Carrying value of cash equivalents approximates fair value due to their relatively short-term nature.

***Mutual funds***

Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Master Trust are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U. S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Master Trust are deemed to be actively traded.

***Equity securities***

Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

***Debt securities***

Valued using quoted prices from external data providers and market participants and are included within Level 2 of the fair value hierarchy. Valuation information provided by external data providers and market participants generally includes a fair value utilizing a model where inputs to the model are directly observed by the market or can be derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data or fair value using other financial instruments, the parameters of which can be directly observed.

***Collective trust funds***

Valued at the NAV of units of the collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. There were no unfunded commitments or redemption restrictions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Note 5. Securities Lending**

The Master Trust entered into a securities lending agreement in 2011 with JP Morgan Chase & Co., N. A. whereby marketable securities are loaned to designated counterparties (borrowers) in exchange for acceptable collateral. Effective October 15, 2021, the Master Trust transferred all securities lending agreements from JP Morgan Chase & Co., N.A. to The Bank of New York Mellon (collectively, the Sub-custodian). The original collateral is limited to cash, government securities, and other securities approved in advance, in writing. The Master Trust may recall securities loaned on short notice. Collateral is marked to market daily to reflect changes in value of reinvested assets. The borrower must post original collateral that has a market value of at least 102% of the market value of domestic U.S. loaned securities, 105% of the market value of foreign equity loaned securities, or such other percentage of the market value of the loaned securities (not less than 100%) approved by the Master Trust in writing. The collateral is held in custody by the Sub-custodian and pooled with collateral maintained for other

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participants in this program. The Sub-custodian indemnifies the Master Trust against loss on the securities loaned as a result of the borrower's default. The Master Trust retains the risk of loss from a decline in the market value of the collateral held in the invested collateral pool below the amount of the collateral payable to the borrower. The Sub-custodian invests the cash collateral in short-term investments. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the fair value of the collateral held and the amounts payable under these arrangements was \$10,551,693 and \$9,551,226, respectively. Securities lending income of \$18,779 and \$60,297 was earned by the Master Trust in the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

**Note 6. Information Prepared and Certified by Trustee**

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Fidelity Management Trust Company, a qualified institution, has certified the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023
- Investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023
- Notes receivable from participants included in the accompanying schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024
- Disclosures regarding the Marshfield Clinic Master Trust in Notes 3 and 4 as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

**Note 7. Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue their contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, Plan assets will be distributed to participants and beneficiaries in accordance with the Plan provisions and ERISA.

**Note 8. Related-Party Transactions and Exempt Party-in-Interest Transactions**

Certain plan investments are managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan. The Employer performs certain administrative services on behalf of the participating plans which are reimbursed by the Master Trust. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

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**Note 9. Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**Note 10. Tax Status**

The IRS has determined and informed the Plan by a letter dated December 3, 2013, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the plan administrator and Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
