## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

Plan Administrator and Plan Participants  
Our World Neighborhood Charter School 401(k) Plan

### ***Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit***

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Our World Neighborhood Charter School 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Our World Neighborhood Charter School 401(k) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note D to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### ***Opinion***

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

### ***Basis for Opinion***

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Our World Neighborhood Charter School 401(k) Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

### ***Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements***

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Our World Neighborhood Charter School 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

NOTE A: DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Our World Neighborhood Charter School 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document, including amendments, for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

Our World Neighborhood Charter Schools (the “Organization”) originally adopted the Plan on January 1, 2012 and was most recently restated on January 1, 2021. The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of the Organization. The Plan is also subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Participant requirements

Each employee shall be entitled to make elective deferrals to the Plan upon attaining 21 years of age and completion of three months of eligible service, as defined in the Plan. All eligible employees of the Organization are entitled to receive employer match, safe harbor nonelective and profit sharing contributions. An eligible employee shall be entitled to receive employer contributions upon attaining 21 years of age and completion of three months of eligible service, as defined in the Plan. Union employees whose employment is governed by a collective bargaining agreement under which retirement benefits were the subject of a good faith bargaining are excluded from both elective deferrals and employer contributions.

Contributions

Each year, eligible employees may contribute up to 90% of their eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan, subject to Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) limitations.

Participants are not required to contribute in order to receive an employer contribution. The Organization will make safe harbor nonelective contributions not to exceed 3% of eligible compensation for all eligible employees. The Organization will also make a matching contribution equal to 100% of salary deferrals not to exceed 3% of eligible compensation. The Organization may make discretionary profit sharing contributions to eligible employees who are employed by the Organization on the last day of the Plan year with certain exceptions as defined in the Plan document in an amount and percentage as determined by the Board. The Organization did not make a discretionary profit sharing contribution for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Participant accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and the Organization’s contributions and an allocation of Plan earnings. Allocation of earnings are based upon participant account balances. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s account.

Investment options

Participants may direct the investment of their accounts among the investment options offered by the Plan.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and employer contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Payment of benefits

Upon retirement, death, termination of employment or permanent and total disability, a participant is entitled to receive a lump-sum distribution, or a partial withdrawal, equal to the value of the participant's balance in his or her account. Participants may also withdraw an amount at age 59½ if certain criteria are met. In addition, hardship withdrawals are available under the Plan, subject to certain early withdrawal penalties. Other withdrawals may be subject to restrictions as defined in the Plan.

Once a participant's employment by the Organization is terminated, vested balances of less than \$5,000 will be automatically rolled into an IRA unless otherwise elected.

Participant notes receivable

Participant notes receivable are measured and valued at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. The Plan allows participants to borrow from their vested account balance. The minimum amount of each loan is \$1,000. Participants should not have more than one outstanding loan at any time. The maximum amount of borrowings permitted cannot exceed the lesser of (1) \$50,000, reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance, if any, the participant had at any one time during the previous twelve month period ending on the day the loan is made; or (2) 50% of a participant's vested account balance. The notes must generally be repaid through payroll withholding in equal installments consisting of principal and interest, at a reasonable interest rate, over a period not to exceed five years unless for the purchase of a primary residence. Principal and interest payments on the notes are redeposited into the participant's account based on their current investment allocation election.

Delinquent participant loans are deemed as distributions based on the terms of the plan document.

NOTE B: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

Investment valuation and income recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Shares of pooled separate accounts are valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year-end. Purchases and sales of the mutual funds are made and recorded as needed, when a contribution is made to the Plan, when a distribution is made from the Plan or when a participant changes his or her investment election. Interest and dividends are recorded when earned. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains or losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid either by the Plan or the Organization, as provided by the plan document. Expenses that are paid directly by the Organization are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation or depreciation of fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Use of estimates in the preparation of financial statements

The preparation of the Plan's financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates and assumptions.

Subsequent events

The Plan has conducted an evaluation of potential subsequent events occurring after the statement of net assets available for benefits date through October 10, 2025, which is the date the financial statements are available to be issued. See Note I.

NOTE C: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAP”) establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset’s or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are actively traded open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to report their daily net asset value and to transact at that price.

*Pooled separate account:* Valued at the net asset value reported by the fund as a practical expedient. There are no unfunded commitments and investments can be redeemed on a daily basis without restriction and are not subject to redemption notification provisions except in the case of a plan-level liquidation.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE E: PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

NOTE F: TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted a non-standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan sponsored by United Benefit Pensions Inc. The plan provider has received an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stating the form of the plan is acceptable for use by employers for the benefit of their employees. The plan opinion letter has been relied upon by this Plan. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service or other applicable taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE G: TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTIES-IN-INTEREST

For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, Reliance Trust Company is the trustee of the Plan. Transactions in any affiliated investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions which are exempt from the prohibited transactions rules. Participant loans qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

As described in Note B, the Plan paid certain expenses related to plan operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions are party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

NOTE H: RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE I: NONEXEMPT PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS - DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS

The Plan had delinquent contributions from prior years of \$1,824. These contributions were remitted to the Plan during 2022 and 2023. During 2024 and 2023, the Organization did not remit certain participant contributions to the Plan within the time period described in 29 CFR 2510.3-102. The total delinquent contributions were \$1,038 and \$5,651, respectively. The delinquent contributions from 2023 were remitted to the Plan during 2024, and the delinquent contributions from 2024 were remitted to the Plan in 2025. The Organization remitted lost earnings to the Plan covering all late remittances in October 2025, therefore these late remittances are now considered corrected.
