NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following brief description of Carthage Area Hospital 401(k) Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established to provide retirement benefits for employees of North Country Orthopaedic Group, P.C. (NCOG), North Country Orthopaedic Ambulatory Surgery Center, LLC (ASC) and Carthage Area Hospital (the Hospital). The Hospital is the Plan Sponsor. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Administration

The Hospital is responsible for the general administration of the Plan. The Board of Directors of the Hospital are the Trustees of the Plan. Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company (Principal) is the custodian of the Plan. Principal is also the recordkeeper of the Plan.

Eligibility

Employees of the Hospital, NCOG, and ASC become eligible to begin salary deferrals on the first day of the month following completion of thirty days of employment.

Participant Contributions

Participants may make tax-deferred contributions to the Plan subject to certain limitations of the Plan and the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover).

All eligible employees are automatically enrolled into the Plan, unless the employee elects to opt-out, at 3% of their eligible compensation. The contribution percentage will be increased annually thereafter by 1% up to a maximum of 10%, unless the employee elects to limit the increase.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

Employer Contributions

The Hospital and NCOG are the employers and make matching contributions for groups of employees subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

- For non-union employees, the Hospital and NCOG matches 50% of the participant's deferral up to 5% of the participant's eligible compensation.
- For employees that are members of the New York State Nurses Association (NYSNA), the Hospital matches 50% of the participant's deferral up to 5% of the participant's eligible compensation, not to exceed \$2,000 annually. The Hospital may make a nonelective contribution only to NYSNA employees based on an allocation of a fixed dollar amount or percentage as determined by the provisions of the NYSNA Union agreement, which was 3% for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- For licensed practical nurses, technical employees, service maintenance and clerical employees that are members of the 1199 SEIU Union, the Hospital matches 50% of the participant's deferral up to 5% of the participant's eligible compensation, not to exceed \$1,100 annually.

Participant Accounts

Participants direct the investment of their accounts among the investment options in the Plan. Participant accounts are credited with the participant contributions, employer contributions, and actual earnings/losses thereon and charged with an allocation of administrative plan expenses. Allocations of earnings/losses and administrative expenses are based on account balances according to specific terms provided by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Vesting

Participants are 100% immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings/losses thereon. Vesting in the employer's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after three years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime rate (7.50% and 8.50% at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively), plus 1.00%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, as defined in the Plan.

Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan has an automatic distribution provision where terminated participants with an account balance less than \$7,000 automatically receive a lump-sum distribution. Prior to January 1, 2024, the automatic distribution threshold was \$5,000.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

Forfeited Accounts

When certain terminations of participation in the Plan occur, the nonvested portion of the participant's account, as defined in the Plan, represents a forfeiture. Forfeitures are utilized to reduce the Hospital's discretionary nonelective contribution and to pay administrative expenses. However, if the participant is re-employed and fulfills certain requirements, as defined in the Plan, the participant's account will be reinstated. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$117,389, and \$130,952, respectively. In 2024, \$134,359 of forfeitures were used to reduce the Hospital's 2023 discretionary nonelective contribution. In 2023, \$55,692 of forfeitures were used to reduce the Hospital's 2022 discretionary nonelective contribution.

Hardship Withdrawals

Participants may request hardship withdrawals from the Plan under certain circumstances. Only that portion of a participant's account associated with participant contributions and actual earnings/losses thereon may be eligible for hardship withdrawals.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates and such differences could be significant.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, currency and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Allowance for Credit Losses

The Plan records a receivable for the employer contribution that is remitted to the Plan subsequent to the Plan's year-end. The Plan considers an expected allowance for credit losses that is updated to reflect any changes in credit risk since the receivable was initially recorded. The estimated allowance for credit losses is based on historical, current, and expected future conditions. The Plan has not experienced any historical credit losses relative to contributions receivable and current and future economic conditions are not expected to change relative to historical financial information, therefore management has determined that no allowance for credit losses is necessary as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Fair Value Measurement

GAAP established a hierarchy for information and valuations used in measuring fair value that is broken down into three levels based on the reliability of inputs as follows:

- Level 1 - Valuations are based on quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan has the ability to access. Valuation adjustments are not applied to Level 1 instruments. Since valuations are based on quoted prices that are readily and regularly available in an active market, valuation of these products does not entail a significant degree of judgment.
- Level 2 - Valuations are based on quoted prices in markets that are not active or for which all significant inputs are observable, either directly or indirectly.
- Level 3 - Valuations are based on inputs that are unobservable and significant to the overall fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes to the valuation techniques used during 2024 and 2023.

Registered investment companies: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the company or on the active market on which the company is traded. Registered investment companies held by the Plan are open-end funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These companies are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The companies held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Pooled separate account: The pooled separate account invests mainly in domestic stocks, the majority of which have observable level 1 quoted pricing inputs. The fair value of the pooled separate account is not publicly quoted but is valued similarly to mutual funds.

Collective investment trust (CIT): Valuation is based on the contract value and is available to investors via website or when participants access their account values. The CIT can be redeemed at value as of the measurement date and therefore is considered to have a readily determinable fair value.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Fair Value Measurement (Continued)

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Benefits Paid to Participants

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Hospital. Expenses that are paid by the Hospital are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Certain investment related expenses are included in administrative expenses.

Collective Investment Trust

The collective investment trust evaluates fair value estimates through various methods. One method is oversight of pricing vendors, which includes an analysis of their pricing methodologies. In addition, the Fund validates prices through an investment analyst review process, which includes validation through direct interaction with external sources, review of recent trade activity, or use of internal models. There were no unfunded commitments at December 31, 2024 and 2023. During 2023, the Plan reclassified the collective investment trust previously held in Level 1 to Level 2 due to a change in management's assessment and clarification of the inputs being more consistent with the Level 2 inputs rather than Level 1. There was, however, no change in the actual inputs utilized to value the collective investment trust.

Pooled Separate Account

During 2024, the Plan reclassified the pooled separate accounts previously held in Level 1 to Level 2 due to a change in management's assessment and clarification of the inputs being more consistent with the Level 2 inputs rather than Level 1. There was, however, no change in the actual inputs utilized to value the pooled separate accounts. In the prior year financial statements, the pooled separate accounts have been reclassified to conform to the current year presentation.

4. CERTIFIED INVESTMENT INFORMATION

5. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Principal is the custodian of the Plan's assets, the Plan's recordkeeper and third-party administrator. The Hospital is the Plan sponsor. NCOG is an adopting employer. As such, transactions between the Plan and these entities qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Additionally, notes receivable from participants are party-in-interest transactions.

6. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Hospital has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

7. TAX STATUS

The Plan and trust have been established using a non-standardized pre-approved plan designed and maintained by the Plan's third party administrator. The IRS has determined and informed the pre-approved plan sponsor by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator believes the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

8. RECONCILIATION TO FORM 5500

Certain items may be classified differently between the financial statements and Form 5500. Net assets available for benefits and changes in net assets available for benefits per the financial statements agree to Form 5500 in total as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

9. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 14, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
