Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Dentons Durham Jones Pinegar P.C. 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Dentons Durham Jones Pinegar P.C. 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Notes to Financial Statements

1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Dentons Durham Jones Pinegar P.C. 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document and summary plan description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was created on October 1, 1984 and is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Dentons Durham Jones Pinegar P.C. (the Company or Employer), who are not covered by another plan. To be eligible to participate in the Plan, employees must be full-time employees of the Employer and be a minimum of 21 years of age. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). Effective November 16, 2020, the Plan was amended to change the plan name from Durham Jones & Pinegar, P.C. 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan to its current name.

Contributions

Contributions to the Plan include: (i) salary reduction contributions authorized by participants, (ii) matching contributions made by the Company, (iii) discretionary profit-sharing contributions made by the Company, and (iv) participant rollovers from other plans.

Participants may contribute up to 100% of their eligible compensation, as defined by the Plan document, to the Plan each year, subject to the limitations of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Regular 401(k) contributions are excluded from the participant's taxable income for federal income tax purposes until received as a withdrawal or distribution from the Plan. ROTH 401(k) contributions are not excluded from the participant's taxable income for federal income tax purposes, but withdrawals of contributions and earnings thereon at retirement are tax free. Participants direct the investment of their contributions, and the related matching contributions made by the Plan Sponsor, into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

The Plan allows a discretionary Employer matching contribution, which, when paid, is equal to a defined percentage of a participant's elective deferral contributions as determined by the Employer. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Employer matched 50% of elective deferral contributions of the first 6% of each participant's contribution. Additional profit-sharing amounts by allocation group may be contributed at the discretion of the Employer. Each participant's share of the discretionary profit-sharing contribution is equal to the discretionary contribution determined for the participant's allocation group multiplied by the ratio of the participant's annual compensation to the total compensation of all participants in the allocation group. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Employer made a \$801,024 profit-sharing contribution to the Plan.

Participants may also contribute to the Plan amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans.

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each participant of the Plan. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's profit-sharing contribution and Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. Participants may direct the investment of their account balance into various investment options offered by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Vesting

Participants are automatically fully vested in their contributions, catch-up contributions, and rollover contributions. Employer discretionary matching contributions vest at a rate of 20% per year over 5 years of service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of one-half of the vested account balance or \$50,000. The loans are secured by an assignment of a participant's vested interest in the Plan, and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates at the time funds are borrowed as determined by the Plan Administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions or as a lump sum for the outstanding loan balance. Loan terms range from one to five years. As of December 31, 2024, participant loans had maturities through 2029 at interest rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or annual installments. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution. Participants are also eligible to make hardship withdrawals from their deferred contributions in the event of certain financial hardships.

Forfeitures

When certain terminations of participation in the Plan occur, the nonvested portion of the participant's account represents a forfeiture. The Plan document permits the use of forfeitures to either reduce future Employer contributions or pay Plan administrative expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023 forfeited accounts totaled \$0. New forfeitures during 2024 totaled \$81,333 and forfeited accounts depreciated by \$552. During 2024, Employer contributions were reduced by \$80,781, and no Plan administrative expenses were paid from forfeited nonvested accounts.

Administrative Expenses

Plan administrative expenses may be charged directly to the Plan (either allocated to the participants or using forfeiture funds) or paid by the Employer. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan paid \$114,036 of administrative expenses. Certain administrative expenses are paid by the Company. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in the fair value of investments.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan were prepared using the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with US GAAP requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for investments in securities that are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, currency exchange rate, credit, and the overall fluctuation in the market. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of assets available for benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments in mutual funds are stated at fair value based on quoted market prices. The Plan holds investments in pooled separate accounts of Principal Life Insurance Company (Principal). The pooled separate accounts are stated at net asset value (NAV) per unit as a practical expedient of fair value, which NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying net assets on the last day of the Plan year. Principal determines unit values by dividing the pooled separate accounts' net assets at fair value by their units outstanding at the valuation date. The stable value investment is stated at NAV per unit as a practical expedient of fair value, which NAV is based on contract value. Common stock and exchange-traded funds are valued at quoted market prices on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

The fixed income securities are valued at 1) quoted market prices on the active market on which the individual securities are traded, and 2) quoted prices in markets that are not active by a combination of inputs, including but not limited to dealer quotes who are market makers in the underlying funds and other directly and indirectly observable inputs.

Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Net appreciation (depreciation) of investments includes realized and unrealized gains or losses on investments and is recognized in income currently. Amounts invested may earn interest and dividends, which in turn are reinvested. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as distributions when the participant has a distributable event.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid by the Plan.

Subsequent Events

Plan management has evaluated events occurring subsequent to year-end through October 14, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Fair Value Measurements

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Financial Accounting Standards Board established a framework for measuring fair value in the form of a fair value hierarchy, which prioritizes inputs into valuation techniques used to measure fair value into three broad levels. This hierarchy requires assets to be classified by level in their entirety based upon the lowest level of input that was significant to the fair value measurement. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are as follows:

Level 1: Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.

Level 2: Observable inputs other than Level 1, including quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in less active markets, or other observable inputs that can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3: Unobservable inputs supported by little or no market data for financial instruments whose value is determined using pricing models, discounted cash flow methodologies, or similar techniques, as well as instruments for which the determination of fair value requires significant management judgment or estimation.

4. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contracts

In September 2024 and October 2024, the Plan entered into fully benefit-responsive investment contracts with American National Insurance Company, Standard Insurance Company, and Reliance Standard Life Insurance Company (collectively, the "Issuers"), in the form of single premium deferred annuity contracts (the "Contracts"). One participant in the Plan is the annuitant of the Contracts. The contracts are included in the financial statements at contract value as reported to the Plan by the Issuers. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value, subject to the terms of the Contracts (and subject to certain penalties in some situations). The Issuers are contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest earned at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the Issuers or otherwise.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the Issuers. Such events include the following: (1) complete or partial termination of the Plan, (2) the establishment or activation of, or material change in, any Plan investment fund, or an amendment to the Plan or a change in the administration or operation of the Plan, including offering a competing fund (a fund with similar investment strategies and assets as the Contracts) without the approval of the Issuers. The Contracts permit contract termination with sufficient notice or with other violations of the contractual terms. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events have occurred which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value.

5. Federal Income Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a non-standardized prototype plan which has obtained a favorable tax opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated June 30, 2020, stating that the non-standardized prototype plan is qualified under the appropriate sections of the IRC. The Plan Sponsor believes the Plan continues to operate in accordance with the requirements to qualify for tax-exempt status. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes is included in the accompanying financial statements.

Management evaluates tax positions taken by the Plan and recognizes an income tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. Plan management has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions that require either recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing authorities for tax years for which the applicable statutes of limitations have not expired. There are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

6. Exempt Party-In-Interest Transactions

Plan investments include units of pooled separate accounts and a stable value fund managed by Principal. Principal is a trustee of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. The notes receivable from participants are also exempt party-in-interest transactions.

7. Information Certified by the Trustees

The Plan Administrators have elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under that election, the Plan Administrators instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the following information certified by Principal Life Insurance Company by itself and on behalf of Principal Global Investors Trust Company and by Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company (collectively, the Trustees), except for comparing such information certified by the Trustees to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule:

- All investment assets indicated in the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) held by the Plan, which total \$59,328,942 as of December 31, 2024.
- The recording of transactions related to all investment assets indicated in the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year), including related earnings (losses) and interest and dividends.
