Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements



NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Accanto Health, LLC 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan originally effective January 1, 1998. The covers employees of Accanto Health, LLC, The Emily Program, P.C., TEP Management, LLC, Veritas Management Services, LLC, Veritas Collaborative, LLC, Veritas Collaborative North Carolina, LLC, Veritas Collaborative Virginia, LLC, Veritas Collaborative Charlotte, LLC, Veritas Collaborative Georgia, LLC, Veritas Collaborative Atlanta, LLC, and Veritas Collaborative Holdings, LLC, collectively the Company. The Plan has been amended throughout the years to comply with tax legislation. The Plan was last amended and restated effective January 1, 2023 and subsequent to year end effective January 1, 2025. The Plan excludes leased employees, reclassified employees, nonresident aliens, and employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement. The Plan is subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Eligibility

Eligible employees who have attained age 21 and have been employed for two months are eligible to participate in elective deferrals and Company matching and non-elective contribution components of the Plan. Employees enter the Plan on the first day of the month following the date in which the eligibility provisions have been met.

Contributions

Eligible participants are permitted to elect to have a percentage or dollar amount, limited by Plan provisions, of their compensation contributed as pre-tax contributions or a Roth deferral to the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

The Company may, at its discretion, elect to make a qualified matching contribution or nonelective contribution to the Plan. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company matching contribution was 50% of deferral contributions up to 6% of eligible compensation. There were no Company nonelective contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans or conduit IRAs. Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's matching contribution, an allocation of the Company's nonelective contribution, and an allocation of Plan earnings or losses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined.

Participant Accounts (Continued)

Income is allocated daily based on the shares in the participant's account. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company matching and nonelective contribution portion of their accounts, plus actual earnings thereon, is based on years of credited service (one year – 25%, two years – 50%, three years – 75%, four years – 100%). A participant is 100% vested after four years of credited service. For participants who merged into the Plan from Veritas Collaborative, LLC 401(k) Trust on January 1, 2023, vesting in the company matching and nonelective contribution portion of their accounts, plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of credited service (one year – 50%, two years – 75%, three years – 100%). Such participants are 100% vested after three years of credited service. Participants hired prior to January 1, 2008 are 100% vested in all contributions. A participant is fully vested upon reaching normal retirement age, death, or permanent disability.

Benefit Payments

Upon termination of service, death, disability, or retirement, the participant will receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account in the form of a single lump-sum payment or installments. The Plan allows for in-service distributions if a participant reaches age 59½ and hardship distributions subject to Plan provisions. If a participant terminates employment and the participant's account balance does not exceed \$5,000, the Plan administrator will authorize the benefit payment without the participant's consent. Automatic distributions between \$1,000 and \$5,000 are required to be rolled over into an individual retirement account.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. Note receivable terms range from one to five years and may be longer for notes used for the acquisition of a principal residence. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited nonvested accounts may be used to pay administrative expenses or to reduce future Company contributions. Forfeited nonvested accounts as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$58,268 and \$81,269, respectively. There were \$81,792 and \$15,269 of forfeitures used to reduce Company contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. There were \$142 and \$155 of forfeitures used to pay expenses for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan Trustees determine the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, custodian, and insurance company. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Investment income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. Delinquent notes receivable are recorded as distributions on the basis of the terms of the Plan document.

Contributions

Contributions from participants and Company contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Administrative Expenses

The Company pays certain administrative expenses on behalf of the Plan.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 13, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan was amended to change the vesting schedule for Company matching contributions to immediately 100% vested. Also effective January 1, 2025, pursuant to the SECURE 2.0 Act, the Plan increased the maximum catch-up contributions for employees turning ages 60-63 from \$7,500 to \$11,250.

NOTE 3 CERTIFICATION OF INVESTMENT INFORMATION

Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company dba: Principal Trust Company, Principal Life Insurance Company, and Principal Life Insurance Company on behalf of Principal Global Investors Trust Company, the qualified institutions of the Plan, have supplied the Plan administrator with a certification as to the completeness and accuracy of all investment information reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Master Trust are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective Trust Funds: Valued at NAV of units of the bank collective trust. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

Pooled Separate Account – Valued at the NAV as determined by the insurance company. The NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

NOTE 5 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near-term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 6 PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the participants would become 100% vested in their Company contributions.

NOTE 7 PLAN TAX STATUS

The Plan is placing reliance on an opinion letter received from the IRS on the pre-approved plan indicating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401 of the IRC and is therefore not subject to tax under current income tax law. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and currently being operated, in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore, believe the Plan is qualified.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan investments are managed by the qualified institutions, therefore, the investment transactions with the qualified institutions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

The Company has not yet corrected the prohibited transaction by depositing the lost earnings, filing the required Form 5330 with the IRS and paying the appropriate excise tax.
