# PRIMARY PEDIATRICS, P.C. 401(k) PROFIT SHARING PLAN

## NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### **(1) Description of Plan**

The following description of the Primary Pediatrics, P.C. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### ***General***

The Plan is a defined contribution plan for the exclusive benefit of eligible employees and their beneficiaries. Employees become eligible to participate in the Plan after attainment of age 18 and completion of six months continuous service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Primary Pediatrics, P.C. (the Company) is the Plan sponsor. The Plan's administrative committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The plan administrator determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance, and reports to the Plan's administrative committee.

#### ***Contributions***

Under the provisions of the Plan, each participant may contribute a portion of compensation as defined by the Plan. Participant contributions may be traditional elective deferrals (pre-tax) or Roth elective deferrals (after-tax). Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans (rollover).

Under the safe-harbor provisions of the Plan, the Company makes a matching contribution in an amount equal to 100 percent of the participant's contribution up to four percent of the participant's compensation. In addition, the Company may contribute to the Plan discretionary profit sharing contributions and matching contributions. To be eligible for the discretionary profit sharing contributions, the participant must have completed one year of service (1,000-hour rule) and be employed on the last day of the Plan year. There is no service requirement for discretionary matching contributions. For 2024, the Company made no such discretionary profit sharing or matching contributions. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

#### ***Participant Accounts***

Individual accounts are maintained for each participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's contributions, and qualified rollover contributions, and adjusted for gains and losses based on the investment performance of a participant's account, less any withdrawals and distributions and administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. The participant is entitled to a benefit equal to their vested account balance.

#### ***Vesting***

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions, Company safe-harbor matching contributions, and the investment earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary profit sharing and matching contributions is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100 percent vested after six years of credited service based on graded vesting.

## **(1) Description of Plan (Continued)**

### ***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Participant loans are not permitted by the Plan.

### ***Payment of Benefits***

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum payment equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account or periodic installments over a period of years not exceeding the normal life expectancy of the participant or, if applicable, the beneficiary. A participant who is still employed by the Company and has attained age 59½ may make an election to withdraw all or a portion of their entire account balance.

### ***Hardship Withdrawals***

In the event funds are needed because of extreme financial hardship, as defined by law, the participant may be allowed to make a withdrawal of their vested account balance from eligible accounts, as defined by the Plan. In accordance with the Internal Revenue Code, benefits withdrawn prior to age 59½ may be subject to additional taxes.

### ***Forfeited Accounts***

Forfeitures are created when participants terminate employment before becoming entitled to their full benefits from the contributions under the Plan. These forfeited amounts will be used to reduce employer contributions or to pay administrative expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no forfeited nonvested amounts. There were no forfeited nonvested amounts used to reduce employer contributions or pay administrative expenses in 2024.

### ***Investment Options and Investments***

Participants direct the investment of all contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

## **(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The accounting policies of the Plan are maintained in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP). The Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) provides authoritative guidance regarding U.S. GAAP through the *Accounting Standards Codification (ASC)* and related Accounting Standards Updates (ASUs). The following describes the more significant of those policies:

### ***Basis of Accounting***

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

### ***Use of Estimates***

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of Plan assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

## **(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)**

### ***Investment Valuation and Income Recognition***

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's trustee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance company. See Note 5 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

### ***Contributions***

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

### ***Excess Contributions Payable***

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions, when applicable. The Plan distributes the excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15 of the subsequent year.

### ***Payment of Benefits***

Benefits are recorded when paid.

### ***Administrative Expenses***

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to participant's benefit payments are charged directly to the participant's accounts and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

## **(3) Information Prepared and Certified by the Trustee (Unaudited)**

Certain information in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, related to investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments and interest and dividends, for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Nationwide Trust Company (Nationwide), a qualified institution.

#### **(4) Guaranteed Interest Account with Nationwide Trust Company**

Fully benefit-responsive investment contracts are required to be reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the plan. Contract value represents the cost-plus contributions made under the contract, plus interest at the contract rates less withdrawals and administrative expenses. This specifically affects the presentation of the amounts related to the Plan's participation in the guaranteed interest account. The statements of net assets available for benefits present the contract value of the guaranteed interest account.

The Plan holds investments in a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed interest account with Nationwide Trust Company. Nationwide maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Nationwide Trust Company represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The interest crediting rate is determined for each individual Plan contract based on anticipated market returns. The guaranteed rate is reset periodically, typically quarterly, and in no instance will the interest rate fall below zero percent.

The average yield earned by the Plan, calculated by dividing the annual interest credited to the Plan during the year by the average annual fair value, was 1.86 percent and 1.85 percent as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer. Based on ongoing credit evaluations of the investments, the Company does not expect payment defaults or delinquencies and has not recorded an allowance for credit losses for the investments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. There are no unfunded commitments associated with the contract.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

The guaranteed interest account does not permit Nationwide to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date. In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

## **(5) Fair Value Measurements**

The FASB issued a statement that defines fair value and establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

**Level 1** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

**Level 2** Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

**Level 3** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There has been no change in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual Funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the funds. The funds held by the Plan are open-end funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The method described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

## (6) Income Tax Status

The Company adopted Pension Financial Services, Inc. (the prototype sponsor) prototype 401(k) profit sharing plan. The prototype sponsor has received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), dated June 30, 2020, which states that its prototype plan, in form, meets the requirements of Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code) and, therefore, is tax-exempt under the provisions of Section 401(a). The Plan document has been amended since receiving the determination letter and the Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the Plan itself; however, the Plan administrator believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. The Plan administrative committee also maintains that the Plan has been administered in accordance with all applicable laws and, accordingly, no provision has been made for income taxes in the accompanying financial statements.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate uncertain tax positions taken by the Plan. The financial statement effects of a tax position are recognized when the position is more likely than not, based on the technical merits, to be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan has recognized no interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

## **(7) Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions**

Certain Plan assets are investment options offered through the Plan trustee or affiliates and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Administrative expenses on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits include amounts paid by the Plan to investment advisors and the trustee for administrative services.

Such transactions, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA regulations, are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are specifically exempted from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

## **(8) Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed an intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

## **(9) Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate risk, market volatility, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

## **(10) Prohibited Transactions**

For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan sponsor failed to deposit participant deferrals of \$470,946 within the required time frame as stated by the United States Department of Labor (DOL). The DOL considers late deposits to be prohibited transactions. The Plan sponsor is in the process of correcting the delinquent participant contributions, including the lost earnings.

## **(11) Subsequent Events**

In July 2025, the Plan changed trustees from Nationwide to ADP.

Management has evaluated events subsequent to December 31, 2024 through October 14, 2025, the date these financial statements were available to be issued.

This is a summary of the annual report for FERNBANK INC. RETIREMENT PLAN, 58-6028607/001 for 01/01/2024 through 12/31/2024. The annual report has been filed with the Employee Benefits Security Administration, formerly known as the Pension and Welfare Benefits Administration, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

**Basic Financial Statement**

Benefits under the plan are provided by insurance and trust. Plan expenses were \$117,598. These expenses included \$50,298 in administrative expenses and \$67,300 in benefits paid to participants and beneficiaries, and \$0 in other expenses. A total of 141 persons were participants in or beneficiaries of the plan at the end of the plan year, although not all of these persons had yet earned the right to receive benefits.

The value of plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the plan, was \$7,733,423 as of 12/31/2024, compared to \$6,820,141 as of 01/01/2024. During the plan year the plan experienced an increase in its net assets of \$913,282. This increase includes unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the value of plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the plan's assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year or the cost of assets acquired during the year. The plan had total income of \$1,030,880, including employer contributions of \$102,683, employee contributions of \$176,475, gains of \$0 from the sale of assets and earnings from investments of \$714,911.
