Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Pension Plan for the Employees of LaSalle School (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Pension Plan for the Employees of LaSalle School (the "Plan") sponsored by LaSalle School, Inc. (the School or Employer) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. The Plan is a defined contribution plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The Plan was most recently restated effective January 1, 2022.

General

The School established the Plan to provide employees with a systematic means of saving and investing for the future. Employees of the School are eligible to enroll after they have completed one year of service, which is defined as 1,000 hours of service during a consecutive twelve-month period. Once employees are eligible, they may join the Plan on the first day or the first or seventh month of the Plan year following the date the employee satisfies the eligibility requirements.

Contributions

No participant contributions are allowed to the Plan. However, the School may make discretionary contributions to the Plan, which are determined annually by the School's Board of Trustees (Board). An employee must have 500 hours of service during the Plan year and be employed on the last day of the Plan year in order to share in the allocation of the School's contribution. Participants who are not employed at the end of the Plan year due to death, total and permanent disability, or retirement, but otherwise meet the eligibility requirements, share in the contribution allocation. The contribution is allocated based on a class allocation formula, as defined in the Plan Document.

Participants may direct the School's contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with an allocation of the School's discretionary contribution, if any, and Plan earnings and charged with an allocation of investment expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings/losses or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Vesting in the School's contributions are based on years of continuous service. A participant is 20% percent vested after 2 years of credited service and continues to vest in increments of 20 percent until 100 percent vested after 6 years of credited service.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

Vesting (Continued)

A participant shall have a vested and nonforfeitable interest in his or her contribution account determined by the number of years of service as follows:

Less than 2	0 %
2 but less than 3	20 %
3 but less than 4	40 %
4 but less than 5	60 %
5 but less than 6	80 %
6 or more	100 %

Employees who sever employment before becoming 100% vested in their account balance will forfeit the portion of their account that is not vested.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures represent the non-vested portion of terminated participants' accounts. Forfeitures are reallocated to participants in the same manner as the discretionary contributions to the participants for such Plan year. Forfeitures allocated to participants' accounts totaled \$5,304 and \$6,477 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Unallocated forfeitures totaled \$5,576 and \$6,839 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Payment of Benefits

Distributions resulting from retirement, death, disability, or termination are made in the form of a lump sum distribution. Upon termination of employment, if the account balance is less than \$1,000, the participant will receive a single lump sum amount equal to the value of his or her account. If the account balance is greater than \$1,000 but less than or equal to \$5,000 and the participant has not elected to receive the benefit pursuant to the lump sum form of benefit payment, the account balance will be automatically rolled into an automatic rollover IRA. Distributions, without penalty, may be made upon attainment of age 59½.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Principal and interest at the prime rate is paid ratably through bi-weekly payroll deductions. The maximum repayment term is 5 years but may be extended for the purchase of a principal residence.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's investment committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians and insurance company, as applicable. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed as incurred.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the School. Expenses that are paid by the School are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

GAAP provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the standards are described below:

Level 1: Quoted prices in active markets that are accessible at the measurement date for identical assets and liabilities.

Level 2: Inputs, other than quoted prices in active markets, that are observable either directly or indirectly and fair value is determined through the use of models or other valuation methodologies.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)

Level 3: Unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the asset or liabilities. Level 3 assets and liabilities include financial instruments whose value is determined using pricing models, discounted cash flow methodologies, or similar techniques, as well as instruments for which the determination of fair value requires significant management judgment or estimation.

Money market fund: Value based on quoted prices in active markets.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. There were no changes in valuation techniques during 2024 or 2023.

4. CERTIFIED INVESTMENT INFORMATION

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA for 2024 and 2023. Accordingly, Hand Benefits & Trust Company, the Plan's custodian, has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended:

5. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan adopted a volume submitter plan offered by pre-approved stating that the written form of the underlying specimen plan is qualified under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code. The volume submitter plan received an IRS Opinion Letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the IRS Opinion Letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Plan management is required to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

6. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the School has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.

7. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan allows current employees who are participants to receive loans under specific circumstances. As such, transactions between the participants that have loans and the Plan qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

7. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS (Continued)

The Plan also allows current employees who are participants to receive loans under specific circumstances. As such, transactions between participants with these loans the Plan qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

8. RECONCILIATION TO FORM 5500

Certain items have been classified differently between the financial statements and Form 5500. Net assets available for benefits and changes in net assets available for benefits per the financial statements agree to Form 5500 in total as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

9. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events were evaluated through October 8, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
