Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of 403(b) Thrift Plan for Employees of VistAbility (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL's") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier ("qualified institution") in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

1. Description of Plan

The following description of 403(b) Thrift Plan for Employees of VistAbility (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan was adopted by VistAbility (the “Organization”) on January 1, 2002 and was most recently amended effective March 1, 2023. The Plan is a defined contribution plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”) and certain provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). All full-time employees of the Organization and related employer (The Respite Inn) are eligible to participate in the Plan upon employment. Certain classes of employees as defined by the Plan document are excluded from participating in the Plan. Participants may enter the Plan on the first day of each pay period following eligibility.

Plan Administration

The Organization is the administrator of the Plan. As administrator, the Organization has exclusive authority and responsibility for all matters in connection with the operation and administration of the Plan (including the authority and responsibility to invest, manage, and control the assets of the Plan specifically allocated to the trustee). Mutual of America Life Insurance Company (“Mutual of America”) is the directed trustee and record keeper for the Plan for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and acts at the direction of the Plan’s administrator.

Contributions

Eligible employees may defer a portion of their eligible compensation into the Plan on a before-tax basis pursuant to Code Section 403(b) up to the limits imposed by Section 402(g) of the IRC. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants direct their investments into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. The Organization provides for a matching contribution equal to the lesser of 100% of an employee’s deferral contributions or 2% of the participant’s eligible compensation received during the Plan year. The Organization also provides a discretionary employer matching and or an employer base contribution. Employees must be 18 years of age and have fulfilled 1,000 hours of service to be eligible to receive an employer matching or base contribution. The Organization made an employer matching contribution of \$127,333, net of forfeitures, to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024. No employer base contribution was made or approved for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions, any employer contributions, Plan earnings or losses, and rollovers from other qualified plans. Plan earnings or losses are allocated based upon each participant’s account balance. Certain fees are charged to the fund investments and are offset against Plan investment income and loss as presented on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Participants should refer to the prospectuses of these funds for details on the various types and amounts of investment fees charged to the Plan and their individual accounts.

Vesting

Participant contributions and rollovers, as well as all earnings on these contributions and rollovers, are fully vested when made or earned. Employer matching and base contributions, if any, as well as all earnings on these contributions, vest at 100% upon the completion of 3 years of vesting service.

Participants Notes Receivable

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts up to 50% of the value of their vested account balance, or \$50,000, whichever is less. Note receivable terms range from one to five years, except for notes receivable used to purchase a primary residence, which may be repaid over a reasonable period of time which exceeds five years. The notes receivable are secured by no more than 50% of the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates at the time the note receivable originates.

Mutual of America Group Annuity Loans

The amount borrowed plus a loan reserve (20% of the loan amount) is secured against the Interest Accumulation Account. The funds are not deducted from the participant's account balance. Loan proceeds come from Mutual of America's general assets. Principal repayments are applied to reduce the amount secured by the assets held in the Interest Accumulation Account, and the interest paid by the participant is retained by Mutual of America as compensation. The interest rate is variable and subject to change as of the beginning of each quarter.

As of December 31, 2024, the interest rates on the loans were 3.25% to 5.85% per annum. Principal and interest are paid twice a month through payroll deductions, personal checks from employees on leave, or cashier's checks for the full payoff of the notes receivable. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the balance of outstanding loans was \$104,986 and \$102,223, respectively.

Payment of Benefits

When participants leave the Organization, upon normal retirement age (65) or for any other reason, those participants (or their beneficiaries) may receive the full value of their salary deferrals, rollovers, employer contributions, and the net earnings thereon as a qualified joint and survivor annuity. Participants may elect other forms of benefit payment including lump sum and various other annuity options.

The Plan allows for in-service withdrawals at age 59½ and for certain heavy financial need (hardship) as defined by the Plan document.

In order to receive distributions, participants (or their beneficiaries) are required to file the appropriate forms with the Plan's administrator. Account values will be determined as of the day the distribution is made.

Distributions under the Plan shall generally be made as soon as possible after the date of retirement, date of death, or termination of employment. In the event of a mandatory distribution greater than \$5,000, for which the participant does not elect to have such distribution paid directly to an eligible retirement plan in a direct rollover or to receive the distribution directly, the Plan's administrator will pay the distribution in a direct rollover to an individual retirement account designated by the Plan's administrator.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct their contributions in percentage increments into a series of pooled separate accounts, an insurance contract, and a money market fund offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures, if any, that occur during a Plan year will be used to reduce future employer contributions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the forfeiture account amounted to \$1,600 and \$0, respectively. For the year ended December 31, 2024, no forfeitures were used.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

All investments are recorded at fair value based upon active market values determined by investment advisors as required under ERISA regulations.

Investments in securities traded on a national securities exchange are valued at the last reported sales price on the last business day of the valuation period. In accordance with the policy of stating investments at fair value, net realized and unrealized depreciation for the year is reflected on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Participant Notes Receivable

Participant notes receivable are measured at their unpaid principal balance. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the Plan's administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Organization. Expenses that are paid by the Organization are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net depreciation in fair value of investments. The Organization paid the majority of all necessary and proper expense incurred in the administration of the Plan. Such expenses were primarily comprised of auditing fees, and expenses related to the maintenance of the Plan's records.

Information Certified by the Trustee

Mutual of America has prepared and certified as complete and accurate the Plan's schedule of investment assets, notes receivable from participants, transactions, and net realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments, and interest and dividend income, which was used to prepare the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

SECURE Act 2.0

On December 23, 2022, Congress passed the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023, which included SECURE Act 2.0 ("SECURE"). SECURE contains over 90 new retirement provisions, with varying effective dates through 2027. Since the provisions of SECURE include both required and optional elements, applicable provisions will be evaluated and implemented in accordance with accompanying regulations and guidance, and the Plan will be amended as required. Certain provisions became effective for 2024, however, these changes had no material impact to the Plan's financial statements as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024.

4. Fair Value Measurements

Accounting standards for fair value measurements establish a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under these accounting standards are described below:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Money market fund: Valued based on redemption values on the last business day of the Plan year.

Pooled separate accounts: Valued at the net asset value (“NAV”) of units of the separate account. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimating fair value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the separate account, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the account in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. Contract with an Insurance Entity – Not Fully Benefit-Responsive

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan held an insurance contract, the Mutual of America Interest Accumulation Fund, totaling \$2,285,045 and \$2,191,768, respectively, that is not fully benefit-responsive. Mutual of America maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value less a transaction fee. The guaranteed insurance contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. Participant note balances included in this fund were \$104,986 and \$102,223 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

6. Related-Party Transactions and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by Mutual of America, the trustee of the Plan. Any purchases and sales of these funds are performed in the open market at fair value. Such transactions, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA regulations, are permitted under the provisions of the Plan, and are specifically exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

7. Tax Status

The Plan terms have been drafted in reliance on the sample language provided by the Internal Revenue Service in Revenue Procedure 2007-71. The Plan's administrator intends to apply for a determination letter on the Plan when the government opens such a program. The Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its tax-exempt status. Plan management believes the Plan is currently designed and operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC; therefore, no provision for income tax has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

8. Plan Termination

The Organization has established the Plan with the intention and expectation that the Plan will continue indefinitely. However, the Organization reserves the right at any time to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, distributions will be made to participants as described in the Plan agreement.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rates, market fluctuations, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks will occur in the near term could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported on the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

The Plan held an investment that represented 21% of the Plan's net assets as of December 31, 2024.

The Plan held an investment that represented 23% of the Plan's net assets as of December 31, 2023.
