Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments; administering the Plan; and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

### ***Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements***

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with

auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. - Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

### ***Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA***

The supplemental Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

- the form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

### *Notes to Financial Statements*

#### 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Dan Gernatt Gravel Products Incorporated Savings and Security Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

**General** – The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Dan Gernatt Gravel Products, Inc. (the “Plan Sponsor” or “Plan Administrator”), Gernatt Asphalt Products, Inc., Country Side Sand & Gravel, Inc., and Dan Gernatt Farms. Employees must be at least 20½ years of age and have completed 1 month of service in order to become a participant in the Plan and begin making elective deferrals. Non-resident aliens and residents of Puerto Rico are not eligible to participate in the Plan. The Plan was established effective August 1, 1985, and was most recently amended and restated as a cycle 3 non-standardized pre-approved plan effective February 1, 2022 for compliance with statutory regulations. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

**Contributions** – Participants may elect to contribute between 5% and 100% of their annual compensation, limited by the amount imposed by law. Contributions may be made on a pre-tax or after-tax basis. Additionally, participants age 50 or older may elect to make a catch-up contribution limited to the amount imposed by law. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan at a deferral rate of 5% of eligible compensation unless they affirmatively elect otherwise. The Plan does not include an automatic escalation of deferral provision. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (i.e., rollovers).

The Plan Sponsor makes a matching contribution equal to 50% of a participant’s eligible deferral up to 5% of a participant’s eligible compensation. The Plan also allows the Plan Sponsor to make additional contributions to the Plan at the discretion of the Plan Sponsor’s Board of Directors. There were no discretionary contributions made for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Employees must work at least 1,000 hours during the Plan year to be eligible for discretionary employer contributions. Contributions are subject to certain statutory limitations.

**Vesting** – Participants are immediately vested in their salary deferral and rollover contributions and actual earnings thereon. Plan Sponsor matching contributions and additional discretionary contributions vest utilizing a six-year graded schedule. A year is credited towards participant vesting upon achieving 1,000 service hours within a plan year. A participant vests in Plan Sponsor contributions at the rate of 20% after two years of credited service and becomes fully vested after six years of credited service, upon death or disability while still employed, normal retirement age or upon plan termination.

**1. Description of the Plan (continued)**

***Participant Accounts*** – Individual accounts are participant-directed and are maintained for each Plan participant. Participant accounts are increased by participant contributions, Plan Sponsor contributions and the participant’s share of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are decreased by participant distributions and each participant’s share of Plan expenses and losses. The allocation of earnings and losses to participant accounts is based upon the value of an individual account in relation to the total assets of the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

***Payment of Benefits*** – Upon termination of service due to retirement, death, disability, or as required by law, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution in an amount equal to the vested value of their account, annual installments over a set number of years, or an annuity. The Plan permits in-service distributions from accounts which are 100% vested for participants age 59½ and older and for financial hardships, as defined in the Plan document.

***Notes Receivable from Participants*** – In accordance with Plan provisions, participants are permitted to borrow a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance, or \$50,000. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant’s account and bear a reasonable rate of interest. Participants may only have two loans outstanding at any time. Loans are repayable over a period of up to five years, or longer if used for the purchase of a primary residence. Notes receivable from participants in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus accrued but unpaid interest, if any.

***Forfeitures*** – The non-vested account balances of participants who have ceased employment with the Plan Sponsor are forfeited upon the distribution of vested balances. The Plan Sponsor may use forfeitures to pay Plan expenses or to reduce amounts otherwise required to be contributed by the Plan Sponsor. The Plan used forfeitures amounting to \$134,336 and \$3,043 to offset Plan Sponsor contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The balance in the forfeiture holding account amounted to \$6,821 and \$109,699 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

***Income Taxes*** – Effective February 1, 2022, the Plan was amended and restated under a cycle 3 non-standardized pre-approved defined contribution plan. The Plan Sponsor obtained a letter dated November 14, 2022 in which the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) stated that the Plan is qualified under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code (the “Code”); therefore, no provision for income tax has been included in the Plan’s financial statements

***Plan Termination*** – Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan agreement to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate its participation in the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of partial or complete Plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their accounts.

**2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

***Basis of Accounting*** – The accompanying financial statements are prepared using the accrual method in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“U.S. GAAP”).

***Investment Valuation and Income Recognition*** – The Plan’s investments are stated at fair value except for its fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is valued at contract value (Note 4). Fair value is determined by Empower Trust Company, LLC (“ETC”) and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (“EAICA”) (collectively, “Empower”) as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled separate accounts are valued at their unit value (net asset value) based on the fair value of the underlying mutual funds at year-end. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

The Plan’s investment in a guaranteed interest account is reported at contract value and represents the value paid if the funds were withdrawn prior to their maturity. Interest is credited on contract balances using a single interest crediting rate applied to all contributions made regardless of the timing of the contributions. Interest crediting rates are reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting.

The Plan presents in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits the net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of its investments which consists of the realized gains and losses and the unrealized net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of those investments. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

***Excess Contribution Payable*** – Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the corrective distributions payable at December 31, 2023 to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2024. There were no excess contributions payable at December 31, 2024.

**2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)**

***Administrative Expenses*** – Certain accounting and administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Plan Sponsor. Expenses relating to investment activity are paid by the Plan.

***Payment of Benefits*** – Benefits are recorded when paid.

***Party-in-Interest Transactions*** – Plan investments in pooled separate accounts and guaranteed interest account are held by Empower. Empower is the Custodian as defined by the Plan and, as such, transactions with the Custodian qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid to Empower for administrative and recordkeeping services amounted to \$3,861 and \$42 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Plan also paid Commonwealth Financial Network, considered a party-in-interest as the Plan's investment advisor, \$45,689 and \$41,952 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

***Risks and Uncertainties*** – Investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

***Use of Estimates*** – The preparation of financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

***Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement (SECURE) Act*** – The SECURE Act was signed into law on December 20, 2019. The SECURE Act increases the age for required minimum distributions (RMD) from age 70½ to age 72, creates penalty-free withdrawals for birth or adoption, and modifies certain aspects of plan administration and participant disclosures. These changes are effective for plan years beginning after December 31, 2019.

On December 29, 2022, the SECURE 2.0 Act was signed into law to address additional retirement issues. SECURE 2.0 Act includes provisions to help participants increase retirement savings and simplify and clarify certain retirement plan rules. SECURE Act 2.0 increases the age for RMDs to age 73, effective January 1, 2023 and increasing it to age 75 by 2033. Plan management is currently reviewing SECURE 2.0 provisions and will amend the plan as required.

*Subsequent Events* – The Plan Administrator has evaluated the effects of all subsequent events, for recognition or disclosure, through October 13, 2025, the date the accompanying financial statements were available to be issued.

**3. Information Certified by the Custodian (Unaudited)**

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor (“DOL”) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the Custodian has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplementary information is complete and accurate:

**4. Guaranteed Investment Contract with Insurance Company**

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive investment contract (the “Contract”) with Empower. Empower maintains the contributions in a general account and manages the fund. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The contract is included in the accompanying financial statements at contract value at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**4. Guaranteed Investment Contract with Insurance Company (continued)**

Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value. Such events include the following: (a) removal of a group of participants from Plan coverage as a result of temporary absence, (b) change in position or other occurrence qualifying as a temporary break in service under the Plan, (c) transfer or other change of position resulting in employment by an entity controlling, controlled by, or under other common control with the employer, (d) cessation of an employment relationship resulting from a reorganization, merger, layoff or the sale or discontinuance of all or any part of the Plan Sponsor's business, (e) removal from the Plan of one or more groups or classifications of participants, (f) partial or complete Plan termination, or (g) Plan disqualification.

**5. Fair Value Measurements**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure the fair value of the Plan's assets. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

- **Level 1** – Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical, unrestricted assets or liabilities that are accessible at the measurement date. There were no assets of the Plan that utilized Level 1 inputs as its primary basis for calculating fair value as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.
- **Level 2** – Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets or quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active. This level also includes inputs other than quoted prices that are observable, either directly or indirectly, for substantially the full term through corroboration with observable, independent market data. This includes investments valued at quoted prices adjusted for legal or contractual restrictions specific to the security.
- **Level 3** – Pricing inputs are unobservable for the asset or liability. That is, inputs that reflect the reporting entity's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability. There were no assets of the Plan that utilized Level 3 inputs as its primary measure of fair value as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

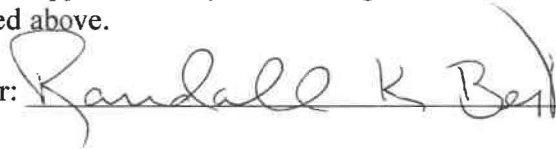
