Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2024 and 2023

1. Description of Plan

The following description of WB Engineers & Consulting, PLLC Retirement Savings Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. The Plan includes an employee stock ownership plan ("ESOP") and a 401(k) retirement savings plan.

The sponsor established the ESOP and related trust agreement effective as of January 1, 2021, which is designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended ("IRC"), and is subject to the applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). Upon establishment of the ESOP, the preexisting 401(k) retirement savings plan was merged into the Plan.

General

The Plan is a leveraged ESOP established effective January 1, 2001, as restated January 1, 2015. The Plan covers all employees, excluding union employees, leased, nonresident aliens, and interns employees, of WB Engineers & Consultants (the "Company") who have completed 1,000 hours and are age 21 or older. The Plan is designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the IRC and is subject to the provisions of ERISA. The Plan administrator and participants are responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan's investment committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance, and reports to the Plan administrator and participants.

Participant Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan document, up to the maximum limits of the IRC. Participants also may designate all or a portion of their deferral contributions as after-tax contributions into a Roth account. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants also may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") limitations.

Employer Contributions

Because the Plan is intended to be a safe harbor plan, the sponsor makes safe harbor matching contributions in an amount equal to 3% of employee compensation. In addition, the sponsor may make profit-sharing and other matching contributions in such amount, if any, as determined by the sponsor, in its sole discretion. Participants who have completed one year of service (or 1,000 hours) and are at least 21 years of age are eligible for profit-sharing and matching contributions, but only if they are employed on the last day of the Plan year for which such contributions are made. There were safe harbor matching contributions in the amount of \$669,355 made for the year ended December 31, 2024. There were no profit sharing contributions made for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's matching contributions, and, on the last day of each Plan year, an allocation of the Company's common stock shares released from the unallocated account, as well as forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts. Only those participants who are eligible employees of the Company as of the last day of the Plan year will receive an allocation. Allocations are based on a participant's eligible compensation, relative to total eligible compensation. Plan earnings are allocated, as defined in the Plan agreement, to each participant's account based on the ratio of the participant's account balance to all participants' account balances. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan.

Vesting

A participant is vested immediately in his or her contributions plus actual earnings thereon. If a participant's employment with the Company is terminated for any reason other than retirement, permanent disability, or death, vesting in the Company's contribution portion of his or her account is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 20% vested after one year of credited service and continues to vest in increments of 20% until 100% vested after five years of credited service.

Voting Rights

Each participant is entitled to exercise voting rights attributable to the shares allocated to his or her account and is notified by Principal Trust Company, the trustee, prior to the time that such rights are to be exercised. The trustee is not permitted to vote any allocated share for which instructions have not been given by a participant. The trustee is required, however, to vote any unallocated shares on behalf of the collective best interests of Plan participants and beneficiaries.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. , is set at 1 percent above the prime rate, as defined. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Terms range up to 15 years years or greater for the purchase of a primary residence.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or for other reasons, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Hardship withdrawals must be submitted to the Plan administrator for approval. Distribution of ESOP plan benefits due to termination, retirement, disability, or death will be made in shares of sponsor stock (see Put Option below) or cash. Such benefits for reasons of retirement, disability, or death will begin no later than one year after the end of the Plan year in which a participant terminates service with the sponsor. Benefits related to terminations for any other reasons will begin no later than the end of the sixth Plan year after the Plan year in which a participant terminates service with the sponsor.

Forfeited Accounts

Plan forfeitures are allocated to each participant's account in the same manner in which Company contributions are allocated. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$283 and \$246, respectively. These accounts will be used to pay Plan administrative expenses. During 2024, Plan administrative expenses were reduced by \$6,144 from forfeited nonvested accounts in accordance with Plan provisions.

Put Option

Under federal income tax regulations, Company stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations, includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the current appraised value of the stock. The Company can pay for the purchase with interest over a period of five years. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Allocations

The financial statements of the Plan present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to (a) the accounts of employees with rights in allocated stock ("allocated") and (b) stock not yet allocated to employees ("unallocated"), including shares that are committed to be released, and the participant directed contributions (allocated). Shares are released from collateral and become allocated generally in the period in which debt service is actually paid.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's investment committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance company, as applicable. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents the sum of each participant's invested principal plus all accrued interest, as further discussed in Note 5. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed as incurred.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events were evaluated through October 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Based upon that evaluation, the Plan has determined that no material subsequent events require recognition or disclosure in these financial statements.

4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation technique are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation technique include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation technique are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation techniques used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the techniques used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Sponsor Common Stock: Valued at estimated fair value based on an independent appraisal. This appraisal was based upon a combination of the guideline public company and discounted cash flow methods. In applying the discounted cash flow methodology, the appraiser considered projected cash flow and net income, EBITDA, return on assets, return on equity, market comparable, and estimated fair value of Sponsor assets and liabilities. The appraiser selected this methodology as it provides a strong indication of the value of the Company based on its underlying characteristics and future earnings potential as well as takes into account current transactional market values of similar companies. Factors considered by the appraiser in developing a discount rate for lack of marketability include known discount rates related to prices paid for restricted stocks in private sales compared to prices paid for the same securities in public markets.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Valued at the NAV, which is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. All funds may be redeemed daily with notice of one to five days. There are no unfunded commitments with respect to the Plan's investments in these funds.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

There are no unfunded commitments in any of these investments, and there are no restrictions on redemptions.

5. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract

The Plan holds an investment contract with Principal Trust Company. This contract meets the fully benefit - responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The investment contract held by the Plan is summarized as follows:

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan is a guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 0%. The crediting rate is reviewed on a semiannual basis for resetting. The contract cannot be terminated before the scheduled maturity date.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with the fully benefit-responsive investment contract is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. These events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

- the Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the IRC or the failure of the trust to be tax exempt under Section 501(a) of the IRC;
- premature termination of the contract;
- Plan termination or merger;
- changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options; or
- bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

- an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines;
- a breach of material obligation under the contract;
- a material misrepresentation; or
- a material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

6. Information Prepared and Certified by the Custodian

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Principal Trust Company, the custodian of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of:

- Mutual funds, pooled separate accounts, and investment contract investment, and notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Net appreciation in fair value of mutual funds, pooled separate accounts, investment contract investment, and interest and dividends reflected on the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

No auditing procedures were performed by the independent auditors as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA with respect to information certified as complete and accurate by the custodian, except for comparing such information with the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule. Based on information provided and certified by the custodian, there are no fixed income obligations, leases, or debt instruments in default or deemed uncollectible, as defined by ERISA, for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

7. Related-Party and Party-In-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by the trustee, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Additionally, the Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the participants' account balances. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Certain administrative functions of the Plan are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

The Plan invests in Company common stock. These are related party and party-in-interest transactions. As described in Note 2, the Company may pay Plan expenses. The Plan has a number of service providers. Such providers are parties in interest under ERISA.

8. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company reserves the right to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to Plan provisions. Upon termination of the Plan, the Plan administrator and participants direct the trustee to pay all liabilities and expenses of the Plan and to sell shares of financed common stock held as collateral to the extent it determines such sale to be necessary in order to repay the loan. Subsequently, the interest of each participant in the trust fund will be distributed to such participant or his or her beneficiary at the time prescribed by the Plan agreement and the IRC. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

9. Tax Status

The IRS has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated September 1, 2021, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt.

Plan management is required to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

10. Risks and Uncertainties

Plan investments consist primarily of the Company's common stock, which is exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks, as well as valuation assumptions based on earnings, cash flows, and other such techniques. Due to the level of risk associated with the investment in common stock and uncertainties inherent in estimates and assumptions, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of the common stock will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
