NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

As of December 31, 2024

NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Leading Edge Aviation Inc. 401(K) PS Plan and Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General:

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all non-union employees who have completed three consecutive months of service with Leading Edge Aviation Inc. (the Company). Employees are eligible for employer match after one year of service (1,000 hours) and must be employed on the last day of the plan year. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions:

Each year, participants may contribute a percentage of their annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, not to exceed the limits set forth by the Internal Revenue Service. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants are allowed to make Roth elective deferral contributions. The Roth contribution limits are the same as the pretax contribution limits. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollovers). The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision, currently set at three percent of eligible compensation, whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. The Company contributes 50% of the first 4% of compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Additional profit sharing amounts may be contributed to the Plan at the option of the Company's board of directors and are invested at the participant's direction. Contributions are subject to certain statutory limitations.

Participant accounts:

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contribution, (b) Plan earnings (losses), and (c) forfeitures of terminated participants' non-vested accounts, and charged with an allocation of any administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting:

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. They are also fully vested in qualified non-elective contributions made by the Company and earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching and other discretionary profit sharing contribution portions of their account plus actual earnings thereon is determined based on years of continuous service. Amounts subject to the graduated vesting schedule are vested in 20% increments with full vesting after completion of six years of credited service.

NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

Notes receivable from participants:

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear annual interest between 8.5% to 9.5%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through bi-monthly payroll deductions.

Payment of benefits:

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in a lump-sum payment or applied to the purchase of an annuity contract. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. Amounts allocated to accounts of persons who, at the financial statement date, have elected to withdraw from the Plan but have not been paid totaled \$0 as of December 31, 2024.

Forfeited accounts:

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$18 and \$0 respectively. Forfeitures, if available, will be applied to plan expenses or employer contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the plan used \$0 of forfeiture to reduce the plan sponsor's expense.

NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Date of managements review:

Subsequent events were evaluated through October 14, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Basis of accounting:

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Notes receivable from participants:

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2024, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the Plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

Investment valuation and income recognition:

The Plan's investments in shares of registered investment companies are stated at fair value as determined by quoted market prices, which represent the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year-end.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of benefits:

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses:

Substantially all administrative expenses are paid by the plan sponsor, Leading Edge Aviation Inc. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable and distributions from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses.

NOTE 3: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to measure the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value at the reporting date.

FASB ASC 820-10, *Fair Value Measurement and Disclosure*, establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs are derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means, and Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan held only investments measured by the Level 1 inputs in the fair value hierarchy.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements:

The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year end.

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NOTE 5: RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST

ERISA defines a party-in-interest to include, among others, fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, or an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan. Certain plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by Mid Atlantic Trust Company (MATC), who receives revenue from mutual fund service providers for services performed. MATC is the custodian of assets as defined by the Plan. In addition, Paychex Retirement Services, who is the third-party administrator for the Plan, receives contract administration fees. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, however they are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules under ERISA. The revenue is used to offset certain amounts owed to MATC and Paychex for administrative services to the Plan. Contract administrator fees paid by the Plan amounted to \$10,379 and \$6,902 for the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 6: PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 7: RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 8: TAX STATUS

The Company has adopted a prototype plan document and is relying on the prototype sponsor's opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated April 10, 2014. The letter states that the prototype and related trust, as then designed, was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC).

NOTE 8: TAX STATUS (continued)

Although the prototype plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the prototype sponsor and the plan administrator believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Leading Edge Aviation Inc. 401(K) PS Plan and Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General:

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all non-union employees who have completed three consecutive months of service with Leading Edge Aviation Inc. (the Company). Employees are eligible for employer match after one year of service (1,000 hours) and must be employed on the last day of the plan year. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions:

Each year, participants may contribute a percentage of their annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, not to exceed the limits set forth by the Internal Revenue Service. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants are allowed to make Roth elective deferral contributions. The Roth contribution limits are the same as the pretax contribution limits. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollovers). The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision, currently set at three percent of eligible compensation, whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. The Company contributes 50% of the first 4% of compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Additional profit sharing amounts may be contributed to the Plan at the option of the Company's board of directors and are invested at the participant's direction. Contributions are subject to certain statutory limitations.

Participant accounts:

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contribution, (b) Plan earnings (losses), and (c) forfeitures of terminated participants' non-vested accounts, and charged with an allocation of any administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting:

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. They are also fully vested in qualified non-elective contributions made by the Company and earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching and other discretionary profit sharing contribution portions of their account plus actual earnings thereon is determined based on years of continuous service. Amounts subject to the graduated vesting schedule are vested in 20% increments with full vesting after completion of six years of credited service.

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear annual interest between 8.5% to 9.5%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through bi-monthly payroll deductions.

Payment of benefits:

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in a lump-sum payment or applied to the purchase of an annuity contract. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. Amounts allocated to accounts of persons who, at the financial statement date, have elected to withdraw from the Plan but have not been paid totaled \$0 as of December 31, 2024.

Forfeited accounts:

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$18 and \$0 respectively. Forfeitures, if available, will be applied to plan expenses or employer contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the plan used \$0 of forfeiture to reduce the plan sponsor's expense.

NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Date of managements review:

Subsequent events were evaluated through October 14, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Basis of accounting:

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Notes receivable from participants:

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2024, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the Plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

Investment valuation and income recognition:

The Plan's investments in shares of registered investment companies are stated at fair value as determined by quoted market prices, which represent the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year-end.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of benefits:

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses:

Substantially all administrative expenses are paid by the plan sponsor, Leading Edge Aviation Inc. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable and distributions from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses.

NOTE 3: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to measure the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value at the reporting date.

FASB ASC 820-10, *Fair Value Measurement and Disclosure*, establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs are derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means, and Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan held only investments measured by the Level 1 inputs in the fair value hierarchy.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements:

The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year end.

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NOTE 5: RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST

ERISA defines a party-in-interest to include, among others, fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, or an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan. Certain plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by Mid Atlantic Trust Company (MATC), who receives revenue from mutual fund service providers for services performed. MATC is the custodian of assets as defined by the Plan. In addition, Paychex Retirement Services, who is the third-party administrator for the Plan, receives contract administration fees. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, however they are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules under ERISA. The revenue is used to offset certain amounts owed to MATC and Paychex for administrative services to the Plan. Contract administrator fees paid by the Plan amounted to \$10,379 and \$6,902 for the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 6: PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

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The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 8: TAX STATUS

The Company has adopted a prototype plan document and is relying on the prototype sponsor's opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated April 10, 2014. The letter states that the prototype and related trust, as then designed, was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC).

NOTE 8: TAX STATUS (continued)

Although the prototype plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the prototype sponsor and the plan administrator believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
