Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Elanders Americas 401(k) Retirement Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

(1) Description of Plan and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Description of Plan

The following description of the Elanders Americas 401(k) Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) savings plan covering substantially all employees of Midland Information Resources Company and Elanders USA, LLC (collectively, the Company) who have completed three months of service and are age 18 or older. Excluded employees include those covered by a collective bargaining agreement, non-resident aliens, leased employees and reclassified employees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The investment committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determining the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings and monitoring investment performance.

Contributions

Participants may contribute a percentage of eligible compensation (subject to federal limitations) in the form of pretax or after-tax (Roth) contributions through a salary reduction. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (referred to as rollover contributions).

The Company contributes a discretionary matching contribution equal to 50% of each participant’s contribution up to 5% of the employee’s eligible compensation for employees at Midland Information Resources Company and 100% of each participant’s contribution up to 2% of the eligible employee’s compensation for Elanders USA, LLC employees. Participants are eligible for the discretionary Company match upon becoming eligible to make elective deferral contributions.

The Plan also allows for Company profit-sharing contributions which are at the discretion of the Company’s Board of Directors. Participants are eligible for the discretionary profit-sharing contributions upon completing 1,000 hours of service and being employed by the Company on the last day of the Plan year. The Company did not make any profit-sharing contributions to the Plan for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Employee contributions, matching employer contributions and employer discretionary contributions are invested in one or more investment fund options offered by the Plan as directed by the individual participant.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and allocations of (a) the Company’s contributions and (b) Plan earnings and charged with the participant’s withdrawals and an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a

participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Forfeited balances of terminated participant's non-vested accounts are used to reduce employer contributions. Forfeitures included in net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, amounted to \$3,910 and \$5,938, respectively. Total forfeitures used to reduce employer contributions and/or pay administrative expenses amounted to \$5,938 in 2024 and \$6,997 in 2023.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their elective deferrals plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the remainder of their accounts is based on 20% for each year of service after the first year. Participants are fully vested after five years of credited service or upon death, disability or attainment of normal retirement age of 59½.

Payment of Benefits and Participant Loans

On death, disability or retirement, a participant (or participant's beneficiary in the event of death) may elect to receive as a distribution from his or her account the value of their account in a lump-sum payment or in periodic payments over a fixed period of time as described in the Plan document. A participant is also allowed to make hardship withdrawals in certain circumstances as described in the Plan document. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

Participants may borrow (minimum of \$1,000) up to 50% of the total vested balance of their accounts up to a maximum of \$50,000. The loans are subject to a maximum term of five years or a period of time not to exceed ten years for loans used to acquire a principal residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates which is established by the Plan administrator, which is typically the prime rate plus 2% at the loan inception date. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

(b) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting. The Plan evaluated subsequent events through October 13, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Contribution Recognition

The Plan recognizes employee and related employer matching contributions based on the period the employee contribution is withheld by the Company from the employee's compensation.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are held by John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.) (Custodian) who allocates Plan assets to the individual accounts of each participant as directed by the participant.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the plan.

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in a transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis and dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. The net appreciation in the fair value of investments as reported by the Custodian includes interest and dividends as well as realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments bought, sold and held during the year.

Payment of Benefits and Participant Loans

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Participant loans are valued at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the Plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced and the delinquent participant loan is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses.

(3) Fair Value Measurements

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of quoted prices in active markets of similar assets for assets in non-active markets and Level 3 inputs which consist of other valuation techniques that have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. There were no investments requiring the use of Level 3 inputs, no transfers between Levels or changes in methods used to measure fair value in 2024 and 2023.

Level 2 Fair Value Measurements

Mutual Funds – Pooled Separate Accounts

The underlying assets of the pooled separate accounts are publicly traded open-end mutual funds registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. The net asset value of these funds is determined daily and transacted at that price. Thus, the fair value of substantially all mutual fund investments is based on the quoted market prices of the investments within the pooled separate accounts.

(4) Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

(5) Tax Status

The Company has adopted a pre-approved plan document sponsored by AT Retirement Services, LLC. AT Retirement Services, LLC has received a favorable opinion letter effective June 30, 2020, from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) which states that the pre-approved document satisfies the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan itself has not received a determination letter from the IRS. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter; however, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Service. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

The Plan evaluates the tax benefits of a tax position using the "more likely than not" threshold. As of December 31, 2024, management is not aware of any uncertain tax positions and related tax benefits which would be material to the Plan's financial statements. The Plan files annual information returns which for years subsequent to 2020 are subject to examination by taxing authorities.

(6) Administrative Expenses

Plan administrative expenses related to participant loan administration, member requested services, withdrawal charges and personal retirement accounts are charged to participant accounts. Under its contract with John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.), investment fees are deducted from participant accounts and included in administrative expenses rather than a reduction of the investment rate of return.

(7) Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are shares of pooled separate accounts and guaranteed interest accounts managed by John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.). John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.) is the custodian as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Administrative and investment fees paid to John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.) amounted to \$94,167 in 2024, and \$83,955 in 2023.

(8) Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan utilizes various investment instruments. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

As of the date of our report, certain discrimination and top-heavy testing of contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 have not been completed due to the potential inclusion of employees of other affiliates of the Plan sponsor. Management believes that participant refunds for excess contributions, if any, or other compliance matters resulting from the completion of the testing for 2024 and 2023 would not be material to the financial statements of the Plan.

(10) Transfer of Plan Assets

During 2023, certain employees of the Company who were participants in the Plan transferred to an affiliated company in connection with a corporate re-alignment of customer services. The affiliated company maintains a separate defined contribution retirement plan covering its eligible employees. Accordingly, the Plan transferred assets of \$965,646 on April 17, 2023 to the affiliated company's defined contribution retirement plan for those participants who became eligible employees of the affiliated company.

(11) Corrective Contribution

The Plan management determined that one participant elected to contribute a percentage of their eligible compensation to the Plan during 2024 but no contributions were withheld and remitted to the custodian. The Plan administrator is determining the elective deferral amount for that participant which should have been withheld in 2024 and the related Company match. The Company will make a corrective contribution to the Plan including lost earnings for that participant during 2025 under the IRS corrective contribution guidelines.

(12) Recent Developments

On December 29, 2022, the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 was signed into law, which includes the package of retirement provisions referred to as "SECURE 2.0". These provisions continue the themes and reforms that began with the 2019 SECURE Act, focusing on getting more participants into the retirement system and finding ways for them to accumulate more assets. These changes have various effective dates starting in 2025 and forward. The Plan Sponsor is working with its advisors to determine that the Plan document is updated to comply with the provisions of SECURE 2.0 Act.

(13) Economic Impacts

National and worldwide factors have led to significant volatility in the financial markets and have affected, and may continue to affect, the value of the Plan's investments. The potential future economic impact of these conditions is difficult to assess or predict. The Plan sponsor is not able to estimate the full impact of these conditions on the Plan's financial statements.

(1) Description of Plan and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Description of Plan

The following description of the Elanders Americas 401(k) Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) savings plan covering substantially all employees of Midland Information Resources Company and Elanders USA, LLC (collectively, the Company) who have completed three months of service and are age 18 or older. Excluded employees include those covered by a collective bargaining agreement, non-resident aliens, leased employees and reclassified employees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The investment committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determining the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings and monitoring investment performance.

Contributions

Participants may contribute a percentage of eligible compensation (subject to federal limitations) in the form of pretax or after-tax (Roth) contributions through a salary reduction. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (referred to as rollover contributions).

The Company contributes a discretionary matching contribution equal to 50% of each participant’s contribution up to 5% of the employee’s eligible compensation for employees at Midland Information Resources Company and 100% of each participant’s contribution up to 2% of the eligible employee’s compensation for Elanders USA, LLC employees. Participants are eligible for the discretionary Company match upon becoming eligible to make elective deferral contributions.

The Plan also allows for Company profit-sharing contributions which are at the discretion of the Company’s Board of Directors. Participants are eligible for the discretionary profit-sharing contributions upon completing 1,000 hours of service and being employed by the Company on the last day of the Plan year. The Company did not make any profit-sharing contributions to the Plan for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Employee contributions, matching employer contributions and employer discretionary contributions are invested in one or more investment fund options offered by the Plan as directed by the individual participant.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and allocations of (a) the Company’s contributions and (b) Plan earnings and charged with the participant’s withdrawals and an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a

participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Forfeited balances of terminated participant's non-vested accounts are used to reduce employer contributions. Forfeitures included in net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, amounted to \$3,910 and \$5,938, respectively. Total forfeitures used to reduce employer contributions and/or pay administrative expenses amounted to \$5,938 in 2024 and \$6,997 in 2023.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their elective deferrals plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the remainder of their accounts is based on 20% for each year of service after the first year. Participants are fully vested after five years of credited service or upon death, disability or attainment of normal retirement age of 59½.

Payment of Benefits and Participant Loans

On death, disability or retirement, a participant (or participant's beneficiary in the event of death) may elect to receive as a distribution from his or her account the value of their account in a lump-sum payment or in periodic payments over a fixed period of time as described in the Plan document. A participant is also allowed to make hardship withdrawals in certain circumstances as described in the Plan document. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

Participants may borrow (minimum of \$1,000) up to 50% of the total vested balance of their accounts up to a maximum of \$50,000. The loans are subject to a maximum term of five years or a period of time not to exceed ten years for loans used to acquire a principal residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates which is established by the Plan administrator, which is typically the prime rate plus 2% at the loan inception date. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

(b) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting. The Plan evaluated subsequent events through October 13, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Contribution Recognition

The Plan recognizes employee and related employer matching contributions based on the period the employee contribution is withheld by the Company from the employee's compensation.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are held by John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.) (Custodian) who allocates Plan assets to the individual accounts of each participant as directed by the participant.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the plan.

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in a transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis and dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. The net appreciation in the fair value of investments as reported by the Custodian includes interest and dividends as well as realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments bought, sold and held during the year.

Payment of Benefits and Participant Loans

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Participant loans are valued at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the Plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced and the delinquent participant loan is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses.

(3) Fair Value Measurements

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of quoted prices in active markets of similar assets for assets in non-active markets and Level 3 inputs which consist of other valuation techniques that have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. There were no investments requiring the use of Level 3 inputs, no transfers between Levels or changes in methods used to measure fair value in 2024 and 2023.

The fair values of the Plan’s investments were determined by John Hancock Life Insurance Company USA and are reported in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as follows:

Level 2 Fair Value Measurements

Mutual Funds – Pooled Separate Accounts

The underlying assets of the pooled separate accounts are publicly traded open-end mutual funds registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. The net asset value of these funds is determined daily and transacted at that price. Thus, the fair value of substantially all mutual fund investments is based on the quoted market prices of the investments within the pooled separate accounts.

(4) Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

(5) Tax Status

The Company has adopted a pre-approved plan document sponsored by AT Retirement Services, LLC. AT Retirement Services, LLC has received a favorable opinion letter effective June 30, 2020, from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) which states that the pre-approved document satisfies the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan itself has not received a determination letter from the IRS. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter; however, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Service. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

The Plan evaluates the tax benefits of a tax position using the "more likely than not" threshold. As of December 31, 2024, management is not aware of any uncertain tax positions and related tax benefits which would be material to the Plan's financial statements. The Plan files annual information returns which for years subsequent to 2020 are subject to examination by taxing authorities.

(6) Administrative Expenses

Plan administrative expenses related to participant loan administration, member requested services, withdrawal charges and personal retirement accounts are charged to participant accounts. Under its contract with John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.), investment fees are deducted from participant accounts and included in administrative expenses rather than a reduction of the investment rate of return.

(7) Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are shares of pooled separate accounts and guaranteed interest accounts managed by John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.). John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.) is the custodian as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Administrative and investment fees paid to John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.) amounted to \$94,167 in 2024, and \$83,955 in 2023.

(8) Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan utilizes various investment instruments. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

As of the date of our report, certain discrimination and top-heavy testing of contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 have not been completed due to the potential inclusion of employees of other affiliates of the Plan sponsor. Management believes that participant refunds for excess contributions, if any, or other compliance matters resulting from the completion of the testing for 2024 and 2023 would not be material to the financial statements of the Plan.

(10) Transfer of Plan Assets

During 2023, certain employees of the Company who were participants in the Plan transferred to an affiliated company in connection with a corporate re-alignment of customer services. The affiliated company maintains a separate defined contribution retirement plan covering its eligible employees. Accordingly, the Plan transferred assets of \$965,646 on April 17, 2023 to the affiliated company's defined contribution retirement plan for those participants who became eligible employees of the affiliated company.

(11) Corrective Contribution

The Plan management determined that one participant elected to contribute a percentage of their eligible compensation to the Plan during 2024 but no contributions were withheld and remitted to the custodian. The Plan administrator is determining the elective deferral amount for that participant which should have been withheld in 2024 and the related Company match. The Company will make a corrective contribution to the Plan including lost earnings for that participant during 2025 under the IRS corrective contribution guidelines.

(12) Recent Developments

On December 29, 2022, the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 was signed into law, which includes the package of retirement provisions referred to as "SECURE 2.0". These provisions continue the themes and reforms that began with the 2019 SECURE Act, focusing on getting more participants into the retirement system and finding ways for them to accumulate more assets. These changes have various effective dates starting in 2025 and forward. The Plan Sponsor is working with its advisors to determine that the Plan document is updated to comply with the provisions of SECURE 2.0 Act.

(13) Economic Impacts

National and worldwide factors have led to significant volatility in the financial markets and have affected, and may continue to affect, the value of the Plan's investments. The potential future economic impact of these conditions is difficult to assess or predict. The Plan sponsor is not able to estimate the full impact of these conditions on the Plan's financial statements.
