## **Note 1. Description of Plan**

The following description of the Longenecker & Associates, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") audit provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

### ***General***

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established effective January 1, 2007, as restated January 1, 2024. The Plan covers substantially all employees of Longenecker & Associates, Inc. (the "Company"). There is no age or service hours requirements to be eligible to participate. The Plan administrator controls and manages the operation and administration of the Plan. For the period from January 1, 2024 to July 15, 2024, John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A) (John Hancock) served as the trustee of the Plan. For the period from July, 16, 2024 to December 31, 2024, Principal Trust Company (PTC) serves as the trustee of the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

### ***Contributions***

Each year, participants may contribute eligible compensation, as defined in the plan document, subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Limitations. Participants who have attained age fifty before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined contribution plans (rollover contributions). The Company contributes a mandatory safe harbor contribution of 3% of the employee's compensation as defined in the plan document. The Company may also provide a discretionary, non-elective contribution but did not do so for the plan year ended December 31, 2024. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.

### ***Investment Options***

Participants direct the investment of their accounts into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan offers mutual funds, pooled separate accounts, common collective trusts and a guaranteed investment contract as investment options for participants. The Plan maintains investments in self-directed brokerage accounts that are no longer investment options for participants.

### ***Participant Accounts***

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, rollover contributions, and allocations of the Company's contribution and plan earnings less expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

### ***Vesting***

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, rollover contribution, and safe harbor contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Vesting in the Company's non-elective contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service where employees are vested 100% after 1 year.

### ***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate is set at 1% above the prime rate for the life of the loan. Principal and interest are paid ratably through deductions from each payroll.

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***Payment of Benefits***

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant or their beneficiary, is paid in a single sum if the participant's vested balance is \$5,000 or less. Otherwise, the participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount, partial non-periodic distributions, or installment payment equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Hardship withdrawals are allowed as defined in the plan agreement. In-service distributions are also permitted for participants aged 59 ½.

***Forfeitures***

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were forfeiture balances were zero. According to the plan document, any forfeitures are to be used to pay plan administrative expenses, restore forfeited account balances of rehires who are eligible for restoration, or reduce employer contributions, in a nondiscriminatory manner at the discretion of the plan administrator. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$0 was used for the above purposes.

**Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

***Basis of Accounting***

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

***Estimates***

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates and assumptions.

***Investment Valuation and Income Recognition***

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the trustee. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Fully benefit-responsive investment contracts are valued at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus interest at the contract rate, less participant withdrawals and administration expenses.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

***Contributions***

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance and interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

***Payment of Benefits***

Benefits are recorded upon distribution.

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***Administrative Expenses***

The Plan's administrative expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company, as provided by the plan document. Certain administrative functions are performed by employees of the Company. No such employee receives compensation from the Plan. Expenses relating to specific participant transactions (notes receivable and distributions) are charged directly to the participant's account.

***Subsequent Events***

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

**Note 3. Fair Value Measurements**

Fair value, as defined under GAAP, is an exit price representing the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. GAAP establishes a three-tier fair value hierarchy which prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value. These tiers include:

- Level 1**    Observable inputs such as quoted prices in active markets.
- Level 2**    Inputs other than quoted prices in active markets that are either directly or indirectly observable.
- Level 3**    Unobservable inputs about which little or no market data exists, therefore requiring an entity to develop its own assumptions.

Assets and liabilities are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The Plan's assessment of the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement requires judgment, and may affect the valuation of fair value assets and liabilities and their placement within the fair value hierarchy levels.

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value:

***Mutual Funds***

Mutual funds are publicly traded investments and are valued daily at the closing price reported on the active market on which the funds are traded.

***Common Collective Trust Funds***

The Plan invests in common collective trust funds for which quoted prices are not available in active markets for identical instruments. The Plan utilizes the net asset value (NAV) per share, as determined by the custodian, as the estimated fair value. Because quoted prices in active markets for identical assets are not available, these prices are determined using observable market information such as quotes from less active markets and/or quoted prices of securities with similar characteristics.

***Pooled Separate Accounts***

The Plan invests in pooled separate accounts for which quoted prices are not available in active markets for identical instruments. The Plan utilizes the net asset value (NAV) of units, as determined by Principal Life Insurance Company (PLIC), as the estimated fair value. Because quoted prices in active markets for identical assets are not available, these prices are determined using observable market information such as quotes from less active markets and/or quoted prices of securities with similar characteristics.

**Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts**

Accounts primarily consist of mutual funds and exchange traded funds that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices.

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The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

#### **Note 4. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract**

The Plan holds a traditional investment contract with PLIC. This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan is a guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuers or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuers, but it may not be less than 1%. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuers. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the plan document (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) premature termination of the contracts, (4) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (5) the failure of the Plan to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The plan administrator does not believe that the occurrence of any such value event, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants, is probable.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following: (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material representation or (4) a material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

#### **Note 5. Certification of Plan Trustees**

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, John Hancock and PTC, qualified institutions, have certified the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments excluding the \$1,322,683 in the self-directed brokerage accounts and notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023

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- Investment income excluding \$127,283 from the self-directed brokerage accounts and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024
- Investment information and notes receivable from participants included in the accompanying schedule of assets (held at end of year), excluding the \$1,322,683 in the self-directed brokerage accounts as of December 31, 2024

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

**Note 6. Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

**Note 7. Exempt Party-in-Interest Transactions**

Certain plan investments are invested in funds managed by Principal Life Insurance Company (Principal) an affiliate of the Plan trustee, Principal Trust Company. Principal is the trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services were included as a reduction of the return earned on each fund. Fees paid to Principal by the Plan for participant-initiated transactions were \$105,474 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

**Note 8. Tax Status**

The Plan has not obtained a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service (the "IRS") stating that the Plan was in compliance with the applicable requirement of the IRC. The Plan is relying on the IRS approval of the non-standardized plan that it is utilizing. The IRS has determined and informed the document sponsor by a letter dated June 30, 2020 that the non-standardized plan document was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the plan administrator believes that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**Note 9. Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
