Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed the audit of the accompanying financial statements of Brightli Retirement Savings Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Notes to the Financial Statements

Year Ended December 31, 2024

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Brightli Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Burrell-Preferred, Inc. (dba Brightli) (the Plan Sponsor). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Plan was restated June 23, 2024, changing its name from Burrell Behavioral Health Tax Deferred Annuity Plan to Brightli Retirement Savings Plan. The restatement expanded eligibility to allow additional employee groups to participate. The provisions of the restated plan are substantially similar to the prior Plan except for certain administrative and regulatory updates.

The addition of new employee groups resulted in transfers of assets into the Plan from another related plan in the amount of \$20,783,326, which is reflected in the accompanying Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Eligibility: The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of the Plan Sponsor. Participants are eligible to make salary deferrals upon hire date and become eligible for matching contributions upon completion of more than 1,000 hours in a year and have at least one year of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions: Participants can contribute up to 100% percent of their eligible wages by way of pre-tax contributions or after-tax Roth contributions, subject to certain limitations. Participants who had attained age 50 before the end of the plan year were eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover contributions). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Plan Sponsor made matching contributions equal to 100% of the first 5% of each participant's deferral contribution as a safe harbor matching contribution. The Sponsor may also make discretionary nonelective profit sharing contributions to participants who obtain completion of more than 1,000 hours in a the Plan year and who are employed on the last day of the Plan year. The Plan did not make a profit sharing contribution for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant accounts: Each participant's account is credited with (a) the participant's contribution; (b) the Sponsor's discretionary and matching contributions (if any), and (c) plan earnings. Plan earnings are allocated to each participant based upon the earnings of the investment plan selected by the participant, and the participant's account balance. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan.

Payment of benefits: Participants who terminate service and have account balances of \$5,000 or less will receive an automatic distribution of their vested balance. Participants with account balances that exceed \$5,000 may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the vested interest in their account. Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Vesting: Participants are immediately 100% vested in their elective deferral contributions and safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in any discretionary non-elective contributions is based on years of credited service. A participant is fully vested after six years of credited service.

Forfeitures: Amounts forfeited from a participant's account shall be used to reduce Plan Sponsor contributions and to pay plan expenses.

Notes receivable from participants: Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account, whichever is less. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear an interest rate equal to 1% above the prime interest rate on the day of issuance. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are presented using the accrual method of accounting.

Use of estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Notes receivable from participants: Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. Interest income is recorded on the cash basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are paid. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Investment valuation and income recognition: Investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income and dividends are recorded when received. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Expenses: Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent events: The Plan has evaluated subsequent events between the end of the most recent fiscal year end and October 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024.

Mutual and money market funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Funds held by the Plan are open-ended funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

General accounts: Valued by the daily crediting of interest, which is subject to minimum contractual guarantees. The observable inputs used in determining the value include the contract value, credited rate and contractual minimum rates, MVA formula, and the contract surrender charge schedule, if applicable.

Separate accounts: Represent assets segregated and invested on behalf of customers. Investment risks associated with market value changes are borne by the customer. Separate account assets comprise actively traded mutual funds that have daily quoted net asset values for identical assets that the Company can access. These net asset values are obtained daily from the fund.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or

4. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their account balances.

5. Plan Tax Status

The Plan obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the prototype plan, as designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. A tax liability would be recognized if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

6. Certified Information

Certain information in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, related to investments at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, and interest and dividends, for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, American United Life Insurance Company (AUL), and The Variable Annuity Life Insurance Company (VALIC), qualified institutions.

7. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

8. Related-Party Transactions and Party In Interest Transactions

Certain plan investments are managed Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company. Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company is the asset custodian and trustee and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. Investments in these funds totaled \$1,220,474 at December 31, 2024.

At year ended December 31, 2024, certain plan investments were still held with the Plan's prior asset custodians, American United Life Insurance Company and Variable Annuity Life Insurance Company. At year ended December 31, 2024, investments in funds with American United Life Insurance Company and The Variable Annuity Life Insurance Company totaled \$2,486,324 and \$548,291, respectively.

During year ended December 31, 2024, fees of \$170,458, were paid to Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company. These fees are included on the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits with administrative fees.

Certain employees serve as the Plan's administrators. The administrators do not receive compensation for services rendered to the Plan.

9. Separated Participants

At December 31, 2024, \$854,485 of net assets available for benefits were for those participants who have separated from active service with the Company with a balance less than \$5,000, and are due a distribution in accordance with the plan document.
