We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Robert Brogden's Olathe Buick GMC, Inc. 401(K) Retirement Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Robert Brogden's Olathe Buick GMC, Inc. 401(K) Retirement Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Note 1 – Plan Description

The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General – The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Robert Brogden's Olathe Buick GMC (the Company), Robert Brogden Automotive dba Robert Brogden Buick GMC Cadillac, Robert Brogden Imports LLC dba Robert Brogden's Olathe Kia, and Robert Brogden GC Auto II, Inc., who have reached age 18 and have completed 6 months of eligible service for elective deferrals and matching contributions. There is no minimum service requirement for non-elective contributions, but participants must be employed on the last day of the plan year in order to share in the allocation. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions – Participants may contribute a portion of their eligible plan compensation ranging from 1% up to a maximum allowable by the plan document and in accordance with other limiting provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and other applicable legal limits. In any calendar year in which a participant is age 50 or older, an additional "catch-up contribution" (limit to \$7,500 in 2024) may be made. The Plan also allows participants to contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans.

The Company provides a safe harbor matching contribution of 100% of the first 3% deferred and 50% of the next 2% deferred by the participant up to 5% of compensation. The matching contribution amounted to \$267,266 for 2024.

The Company may also provide an additional non-elective discretionary profit sharing contribution. The Company made a discretionary profit sharing contribution of \$101,666 for 2024.

Participant Accounts – Each participant's account is credited with (a) the participant's contributions, (b) the Company's contributions, (c) forfeitures, and (d) any earnings or losses thereon. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants may direct the investment of their account balances into various investment options offered by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Participants may borrow from their fund account a minimum of \$1,000 to a maximum equal to the lesser of one-half of their vested account balance, or \$50,000. Up to 50% of a participant's vested account balance may be used as collateral for any loan. The loan interest rate, determined at the time of the loan issuance, is set at 1 percent above the prime rate, as defined. Principal and interest are paid ratable through after-tax payroll deductions on at least a quarterly basis over a five year period unless the loan is for the purchase of a principal residence in which case the loan repayment period may not extend beyond 10 years from the date of the loan. Interest rates ranged from 4.25% to 9.50% at December 31, 2024.

Vesting – Participants are immediately vested in 100 percent of their Elective Deferral Account, Rollover Contribution Account, Qualified Non-Elective Contribution Account, Safe Harbor Matching Contribution Account and Non-Elective Contribution Account, and earnings thereon. The Employer Matching Contribution Account vests based on Years of Vesting Service according to a 2 - 6 year graded vesting schedule (20% per year starting with two years of vesting service).

Note 1 – Plan Description (continued)

Payment of Benefits – Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may receive a lump-sum amount equal to the vested value of the participant’s account. During active employment, participants may withdraw their contributions for financial hardship upon approval of the plan administrator. Terminated employees receive a lump-sum amount of their account balance.

Forfeitures – Nonvested accounts are forfeited upon participants’ terminations. Forfeited amounts may be used to reduce future contributions made by the employer, restore forfeited account balances of rehires who are eligible for a restoration of forfeitures, and to offset administrative expenses incurred by the Plan. Forfeited amounts of approximately \$6,000 were used to pay plan expenses during the Plan year ending December 31, 2024. Forfeited, nonvested accounts totaled \$22,553 and \$18,667 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting – The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – Investments are reported at fair value (Note 8) or contract value (Note 9). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Board of Directors determines the Plan’s valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and trustee. See Note 8 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchase and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Gains and losses on the sale of investments are determined on weighted average cost which includes transaction expenses. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions – Participants’ elective deferrals and Company contributions are recognized as additions to Plan assets in the year designated by the participant and Company, respectively.

Administrative Expenses – Administrative expenses are paid by the Company or Plan, as provided by the plan document.

Benefit Payments – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Note 3 – Certification of Financial Information

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the plan administrator instructed the Plan’s independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the following information certified by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, the custodian, except for comparing such information certified by the custodian to information included in the Plan’s financial statements. The custodian certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investment activity and notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the information reflected on the supplemental Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024.

Note 4 – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 5 – Tax Status

The Plan is a non-standardized prototype plan of ERISA Services, Inc., the third-party administrator of the Plan. ERISA Services, Inc. obtained a letter dated June 1, 2021 in which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stated its opinion that the form of the prototype plan of ERISA Services, Inc. is acceptable under Section 401 of the IRC for use by employers for the benefit of their employees. The plan administrator and the Plan’s tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan’s financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by a taxing authority. The Plan has recognized no interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions. The Plan’s tax returns for 2021, 2022, and 2023 are subject to examination by the taxing authorities, generally for three years after they were filed.

Note 6 – Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain plan assets are managed by the custodian. Therefore, these transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for administrative services were \$23,650 for the year ended December 31, 2024, which include custodian, recordkeeping, investment advisory, and participant transaction fees. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company at no cost to the Plan. The Plan has notes receivable from participants subject to specific guidelines as defined in the plan document. These transactions are not deemed prohibited party-in-interest transactions, because they are covered by statutory or administrative exemptions from the IRC and ERISA's rules on prohibited transactions.

Note 7 – Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 8 – Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) *Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the assets or liability;
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability had a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

Note 8 – Fair Value Measurements (continued)

The asset and liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Pooled Separate Accounts (PSAs) invest in mutual funds and equity securities. PSAs are valued daily at their accumulation unit value multiplied by number of units held. The accumulation unit value is determined daily based on the net asset value of shares of the underlying fund as provided by the Custodian.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 9 – Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract

The Plan holds a traditional fixed account investment fund with the custodian. This investment meets the fully benefit-responsive investment criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions plus credited interest less participant withdrawals and fees. The account is credited with earnings based on the daily balance. There is no stated minimum or maximum interest rate for the investment choice.

Note 9 – Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract (continued)

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value. Such events include but may not be limited to the following: (1) the complete or partial termination of the Plan; (2) the establishment or activation of, or material change in, any Plan investment fund, or an amendment to the Plan or a change in the administration or operation of the Plan, including the removal of a group of employees from Plan coverage as a result of the sale or liquidation of a subsidiary or division or as a result of group layoffs or early retirement programs.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different than the contract value. The issuer will terminate the contract under the following circumstances: (1) the Plan provides effective communication that the contract will be terminated; (2) the market value balance is not more than \$1,000 or the contract value difference is zero; (3) the issuer determines that it will not be able to continue to operate the agreement under its current terms following the Plan's establishment, activation, or material change to, any Plan investment fund; (4) the Plan fails to make the contributions required under the contract.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with participants.

Note 10 – Nonexempt Transactions

Employee contributions totaling \$6,147 and \$3,695 during the years ending December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, were transferred to the Plan later than required by Department of Labor Regulations.

Note 11 – Plan Amendments

Effective June 1, 2023, the Plan was amended to add Robert Brogden GC Auto II, Inc. as a member of the controlled group and to add GMC at The Western Motor Company, Inc. as an employer whose years of service count for eligibility and vesting purposes. The Plan was also amended on this date to allow loan rollovers from qualified institutions.

Effective April 23, 2024, the Plan was amended to remove a Plan trustee.

Note 12 – Subsequent Events

During 2025, the participating employer Robert Brogden Imports LLC dba Robert Brogden's Olathe Kia was sold and its employees were no longer participants in the Plan.

The Plan has evaluated all subsequent events through October 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
