Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Docker 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Docker 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audits does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Docker 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audits, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audits.

Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of Docker 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan documents for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan, a defined contribution plan sponsored by Docker, Inc. (the "Company" or "Employer"), is designed to qualify under Section 401(a) and related provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan was established on October 1, 2013, and restated effective January 1, 2022, and is designed to provide eligible participants with a means to defer a portion of their compensation for retirement and to provide benefits in the event of disability, death, termination, or financial hardship. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reports and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and subsequent laws.

An expansion of Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 ("SECURE 2.0") was signed into law on December 29, 2022 as part of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023. The effective dates of provisions within SECURE 2.0 vary through 2026. The Plan Sponsor has until the end of the first plan year beginning on or after January 1, 2026 to amend the Plan for the changes related to SECURE 2.0. The Plan has not been formally amended to adopt these provision as of the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Plan administration

The Company has appointed the Docker 401(k) Committee (the "Committee") as the administrator of the Plan and, as such, the Committee carries out the duties imposed by ERISA. The Company has contracted with Empower Trust Company, LLC and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (the "Custodians") to act as the Plan's asset Custodians and to perform record-keeping services.

Eligibility

All employees of the Company are immediately eligible to begin participating in the Plan upon hire with the exception of those who are union employees, nonresident aliens who do not receive any earned income from the Company which constitutes United States-sourced income, employees who gained employment through merger or acquisition, and employees classified as either interns or temporary.

Contributions

Participants are allowed to contribute up to 100% of their eligible compensation as pre-tax or after-tax (Roth) contributions, as defined in the plan document, up to the annual contribution limit as defined in the IRC. Participants are also allowed to make rollover contributions to the Plan from other qualified retirement plans.

Contributions (continued)

Plan participants who have attained age 50 before the end of a calendar year are allowed to make additional contributions called "catch-up contributions" to the Plan, up to the annual contribution limit as defined in the IRC.

The Plan allows the Company to make discretionary matching contributions and profit sharing contributions as defined in the Plan and as approved by the Board of Directors. All participants are eligible to participate in the Company's discretionary matching contributions and profit sharing contributions. The Company did not make any discretionary matching contributions or profit sharing contributions to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, plan earnings or losses, and an allocation of the Company's discretionary contributions, if any. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan, if any. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance. Participants direct the investment of contributions to their respective accounts into the investment options offered by the Plan.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Participants vest into the Company's discretionary matching contributions and profit sharing contributions, if any, ratably over a period of six years, with 0% vested in the first year, then 20% per year thereafter, as defined in the plan document.

Forfeitures

The Plan allows forfeited, nonvested account balances of terminated participants to be used to either offset future employer contributions to the Plan or to pay administrative expenses. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$2,235 and \$2,204, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, no forfeitures were used to pay administrative expenses.

Notes receivable from participants

Participants may borrow not less than \$1,000 and up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Notes receivable from participants ("participant loans") must be repaid within five years, unless the participant's loan is used to acquire a primary residence, in which case the repayment term may exceed five years. Participant loans are secured by the respective participant's vested account balance. Participant loans bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates for instruments with similar characteristics at the time of issuance. Principal and interest are generally paid ratably through payroll deductions with payments made each pay period. Outstanding participant loans at December 31, 2024 bear interest at annual rates of between 5.50% to 10.50% with maturities through December 2029.

Payment of benefits

Distributions and withdrawals are payable upon attainment of age 59 1/2, retirement, termination, financial hardship, disability or death. Upon termination, if a participant's vested account balance is equal to or less than \$1,000, the balance is immediately distributed as a lump-sum payment. Upon termination, if a participant's vested account balance is greater than \$1,000 and less than or equal to \$7,000, their balance shall be automatically rolled over into an individual retirement account designated by the Plan administrator, unless otherwise elected. Upon termination, if a participant's vested account balance exceeds \$7,000, the participant (or beneficiary) may elect to receive a distribution of their account balance as a lump-sum payment or postpone payment to a later date and remain in the Plan. Participants with an immediate and heavy financial need may be eligible for a hardship withdrawal, subject to certain restrictions as described in the plan document.

Administrative expenses

Administrative expenses are generally paid by the Company, but may, at the discretion of the plan administrator, be paid by the Plan. Transaction fees for certain participant-initiated activity are charged to the specific account of the participant initiating any such transaction. The Plan is not required to reimburse the Company for expenses paid on its behalf.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP).

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent liabilities. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities could occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and changes therein.

Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (see Note 4). Contract value represents contributions made under a contract, plus interest, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses (see Note 5).

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on sale of investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as deemed distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Contributions and receivables

Contributions from participants are recorded based on the date the contributions or repayments have been separated from a participant's pay by the Company, which is the pay date. Company contributions, if any, are recorded in the year earned to coincide with the year in which the Company records the contributions in its general ledger. The Plan records receivables for contributions based upon contributions recorded in the Plan year but received by the Plan subsequent to year end. Rollover contributions from participants are recorded based on the date the contributions are received by the Custodians.

Payment of benefits

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses

Administrative expenses are recorded when incurred.

3. INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIANS (UNAUDITED)

The plan administrator, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of ERISA. Accordingly, the Custodians, determined to be qualified institutions by the plan administrator, have certified to the completeness and accuracy of:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Net investment income, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Investments and notes receivable from participants reflected on the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024 ("supplemental schedule").

Accordingly, as requested by the Plan administrator, the Plan's independent auditor performed no audit procedures on the certified information other than to agree the certified information to the related information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting standards establish a framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to measurements involving significant unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of fair value hierarchy are as follows:

- *Level 1* - inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.

- *Level 2* - inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- *Level 3* - inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: registered investment companies (mutual fund investments) are valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year-end which are quoted in active markets. Investments are valued using market quotations or prices obtained from independent pricing services. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to have a readily-determinable fair value and are classified within Level 1 of the fair value hierarchy.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Plan's investment in the Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund (the "Fund") is a fully benefit-responsive investment contract which is unconditionally guaranteed by the Custodians and is held in its general account. The Plan's balance in the Fund at December 31, 2024 and 2023 are \$90,395 and \$80,863, respectively.

Because the investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the Fund. The Fund is included in the Plan's financial statements at contract value, as reported by the Custodians. Contract value represents accumulated cash contributions made under the contract, interest credited to the contract, less participant withdrawals and transfers and Fund expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk for the contract issuer or otherwise. The average crediting interest rate for the contract was 1.41% for the year ended December 31, 2024. The crediting interest rate range is determined and reset by the Custodians each calendar quarter, but may not be less than 0%. Additional interest is not guaranteed for future periods.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the Plan's trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value of the Plan or with participants are probable of occurring.

The contracts above do not permit the respective issuer to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

6. TAX STATUS

The Plan adopted the non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan with CODA (the "pre-approved plan"), sponsored by Professional Benefit Services, Inc.. The Internal Revenue Service has issued an opinion letter dated November 30, 2020, stating that the pre-approved plan is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC and is appropriate for use by employers for the benefit of their employees. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although the Company has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the Plan is terminated, amounts allocated to a participants' accounts become fully vested.

8. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

ERISA defines parties-in-interest similarly to the definition of a related party under U.S. GAAP, except that ERISA's definition is broader and includes all entities and individuals that provide services to the Plan; however, these entities may not necessarily be related parties. Management did not identify any related parties to the Plan that were not also considered to be parties-in-interest. The Plan did not enter into any material related party transactions during the Plan year related to compensation arrangements, expense allowances, or similar items.

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, and an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association or relatives of such persons.

The Custodians may earn credits and/or interest on Plan assets awaiting investment or pending distribution. Any credits or interest earned are aggregated with credits and/or interest earned by affiliates of the Custodians and are used to defray the aggregate expenses for the maintenance of bank accounts. The Custodians and their affiliates will not retain credits and/or interest earned in excess of such maintenance expenses. Earnings of credits and/or interest are at the rate provided to the Custodians by third party financial institutions.

Certain fund level fees incurred by the funds in which the Plan invests for such services as investment management and shareholder services are paid through fund level revenue sharing arrangements. These fees can be allocated as earnings to participants or used to pay Plan expenses.

The Plan's investment in the Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund is managed by affiliates of the Custodians. Certain fees paid to the Custodians and others for investment management services are incorporated into the expense ratios of the Plan's individual funds and paid directly from fund earnings, thus impacting Plan earnings.

9. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Effective June 9, 2025, the Plan was amended to permit In-Plan Roth rollovers and transfers of amounts held in a fully vested pre-tax participant account.

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 9, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. No other subsequent events have occurred that would have a material impact on the presentation of the Plan's financial statements.



Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Docker 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Docker 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of Docker 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan documents for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan, a defined contribution plan sponsored by Docker, Inc. (the "Company" or "Employer"), is designed to qualify under Section 401(a) and related provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan was established on October 1, 2013, and restated effective January 1, 2022, and is designed to provide eligible participants with a means to defer a portion of their compensation for retirement and to provide benefits in the event of disability, death, termination, or financial hardship. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reports and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and subsequent laws.

An expansion of Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 ("SECURE 2.0") was signed into law on December 29, 2022 as part of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023. The effective dates of provisions within SECURE 2.0 vary through 2026. The Plan Sponsor has until the end of the first plan year beginning on or after January 1, 2026 to amend the Plan for the changes related to SECURE 2.0. The Plan has not been formally amended to adopt these provision as of the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Plan administration

The Company has appointed the Docker 401(k) Committee (the "Committee") as the administrator of the Plan and, as such, the Committee carries out the duties imposed by ERISA. The Company has contracted with Empower Trust Company, LLC and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (the "Custodians") to act as the Plan's asset Custodians and to perform record-keeping services.

Eligibility

All employees of the Company are immediately eligible to begin participating in the Plan upon hire with the exception of those who are union employees, nonresident aliens who do not receive any earned income from the Company which constitutes United States-sourced income, employees who gained employment through merger or acquisition, and employees classified as either interns or temporary.

Contributions

Participants are allowed to contribute up to 100% of their eligible compensation as pre-tax or after-tax (Roth) contributions, as defined in the plan document, up to the annual contribution limit as defined in the IRC. Participants are also allowed to make rollover contributions to the Plan from other qualified retirement plans.

Contributions (continued)

Plan participants who have attained age 50 before the end of a calendar year are allowed to make additional contributions called "catch-up contributions" to the Plan, up to the annual contribution limit as defined in the IRC.

The Plan allows the Company to make discretionary matching contributions and profit sharing contributions as defined in the Plan and as approved by the Board of Directors. All participants are eligible to participate in the Company's discretionary matching contributions and profit sharing contributions. The Company did not make any discretionary matching contributions or profit sharing contributions to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, plan earnings or losses, and an allocation of the Company's discretionary contributions, if any. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan, if any. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance. Participants direct the investment of contributions to their respective accounts into the investment options offered by the Plan.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Participants vest into the Company's discretionary matching contributions and profit sharing contributions, if any, ratably over a period of six years, with 0% vested in the first year, then 20% per year thereafter, as defined in the plan document.

Forfeitures

The Plan allows forfeited, nonvested account balances of terminated participants to be used to either offset future employer contributions to the Plan or to pay administrative expenses. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$2,235 and \$2,204, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, no forfeitures were used to pay administrative expenses.

Notes receivable from participants

Participants may borrow not less than \$1,000 and up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Notes receivable from participants ("participant loans") must be repaid within five years, unless the participant's loan is used to acquire a primary residence, in which case the repayment term may exceed five years. Participant loans are secured by the respective participant's vested account balance. Participant loans bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates for instruments with similar characteristics at the time of issuance. Principal and interest are generally paid ratably through payroll deductions with payments made each pay period. Outstanding participant loans at December 31, 2024 bear interest at annual rates of between 5.50% to 10.50% with maturities through December 2029.

Payment of benefits

Distributions and withdrawals are payable upon attainment of age 59 1/2, retirement, termination, financial hardship, disability or death. Upon termination, if a participant's vested account balance is equal to or less than \$1,000, the balance is immediately distributed as a lump-sum payment. Upon termination, if a participant's vested account balance is greater than \$1,000 and less than or equal to \$7,000, their balance shall be automatically rolled over into an individual retirement account designated by the Plan administrator, unless otherwise elected. Upon termination, if a participant's vested account balance exceeds \$7,000, the participant (or beneficiary) may elect to receive a distribution of their account balance as a lump-sum payment or postpone payment to a later date and remain in the Plan. Participants with an immediate and heavy financial need may be eligible for a hardship withdrawal, subject to certain restrictions as described in the plan document.

Administrative expenses

Administrative expenses are generally paid by the Company, but may, at the discretion of the plan administrator, be paid by the Plan. Transaction fees for certain participant-initiated activity are charged to the specific account of the participant initiating any such transaction. The Plan is not required to reimburse the Company for expenses paid on its behalf.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP).

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent liabilities. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities could occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and changes therein.

Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (see Note 4). Contract value represents contributions made under a contract, plus interest, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses (see Note 5).

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on sale of investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as deemed distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Contributions and receivables

Contributions from participants are recorded based on the date the contributions or repayments have been separated from a participant's pay by the Company, which is the pay date. Company contributions, if any, are recorded in the year earned to coincide with the year in which the Company records the contributions in its general ledger. The Plan records receivables for contributions based upon contributions recorded in the Plan year but received by the Plan subsequent to year end. Rollover contributions from participants are recorded based on the date the contributions are received by the Custodians.

Payment of benefits

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses

Administrative expenses are recorded when incurred.

3. INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIANS (UNAUDITED)

The plan administrator, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of ERISA. Accordingly, the Custodians, determined to be qualified institutions by the plan administrator, have certified to the completeness and accuracy of:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Net investment income, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Investments and notes receivable from participants reflected on the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024 ("supplemental schedule").

Accordingly, as requested by the Plan administrator, the Plan's independent auditor performed no audit procedures on the certified information other than to agree the certified information to the related information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting standards establish a framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to measurements involving significant unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of fair value hierarchy are as follows:

- *Level 1* - inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.

- *Level 2* - inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- *Level 3* - inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: registered investment companies (mutual fund investments) are valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year-end which are quoted in active markets. Investments are valued using market quotations or prices obtained from independent pricing services. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to have a readily-determinable fair value and are classified within Level 1 of the fair value hierarchy.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Plan's investment in the Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund (the "Fund") is a fully benefit-responsive investment contract which is unconditionally guaranteed by the Custodians and is held in its general account. The Plan's balance in the Fund at December 31, 2024 and 2023 are \$90,395 and \$80,863, respectively.

Because the investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the Fund. The Fund is included in the Plan's financial statements at contract value, as reported by the Custodians. Contract value represents accumulated cash contributions made under the contract, interest credited to the contract, less participant withdrawals and transfers and Fund expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk for the contract issuer or otherwise. The average crediting interest rate for the contract was 1.41% for the year ended December 31, 2024. The crediting interest rate range is determined and reset by the Custodians each calendar quarter, but may not be less than 0%. Additional interest is not guaranteed for future periods.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the Plan's trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value of the Plan or with participants are probable of occurring.

The contracts above do not permit the respective issuer to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

6. TAX STATUS

The Plan adopted the non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan with CODA (the "pre-approved plan"), sponsored by Professional Benefit Services, Inc.. The Internal Revenue Service has issued an opinion letter dated November 30, 2020, stating that the pre-approved plan is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC and is appropriate for use by employers for the benefit of their employees. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although the Company has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the Plan is terminated, amounts allocated to a participants' accounts become fully vested.

8. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

ERISA defines parties-in-interest similarly to the definition of a related party under U.S. GAAP, except that ERISA's definition is broader and includes all entities and individuals that provide services to the Plan; however, these entities may not necessarily be related parties. Management did not identify any related parties to the Plan that were not also considered to be parties-in-interest. The Plan did not enter into any material related party transactions during the Plan year related to compensation arrangements, expense allowances, or similar items.

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, and an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association or relatives of such persons.

The Custodians may earn credits and/or interest on Plan assets awaiting investment or pending distribution. Any credits or interest earned are aggregated with credits and/or interest earned by affiliates of the Custodians and are used to defray the aggregate expenses for the maintenance of bank accounts. The Custodians and their affiliates will not retain credits and/or interest earned in excess of such maintenance expenses. Earnings of credits and/or interest are at the rate provided to the Custodians by third party financial institutions.

Certain fund level fees incurred by the funds in which the Plan invests for such services as investment management and shareholder services are paid through fund level revenue sharing arrangements. These fees can be allocated as earnings to participants or used to pay Plan expenses.

The Plan's investment in the Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund is managed by affiliates of the Custodians. Certain fees paid to the Custodians and others for investment management services are incorporated into the expense ratios of the Plan's individual funds and paid directly from fund earnings, thus impacting Plan earnings.

9. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Effective June 9, 2025, the Plan was amended to permit In-Plan Roth rollovers and transfers of amounts held in a fully vested pre-tax participant account.

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 9, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. No other subsequent events have occurred that would have a material impact on the presentation of the Plan's financial statements.
