Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of CoastHills Credit Union 401(k) and Profit Sharing Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America and for the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free of material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about CoastHills Credit Union 401(k) and Profit Sharing Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining whether the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free of material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of CoastHills Credit Union 401(k) and Profit Sharing Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about CoastHills Credit Union 401(k) and Profit Sharing Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audit.

Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including the form and content, is presented in conformity with the DOL Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- The form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the DOL Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by Fidelity agrees to or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following brief description of the CoastHills Credit Union 401(k) and Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of CoastHills Federal Credit Union (the Plan Sponsor) except employees covered by collective bargaining agreements. All employees of the Plan Sponsor are eligible to become participants in the Plan as of the first date of the quarter following completion of three months of credited service. Additionally, employees who have met the eligibility conditions are eligible for employer safe harbor matching contributions. Employees who have reached 500 hours of service with the Plan Sponsor by December 31 and are still employed as of that date are eligible for employer discretionary contributions. The 401(k) Committee is responsible for the oversight of the Plan. The 401(k) Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions: The Plan allows participants to contribute up to 100% of their eligible compensation as defined in the Plan, up to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) annual limits. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute rollover amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Starting in January 2019, the Plan automatically enrolls new employees with a 2% pretax contribution. The Plan Sponsor contributes a safe harbor matching contribution of 100% of the first 4% of participant deferrals. Additional discretionary employer contributions may be contributed at the option of the Plan Sponsor's Board of Directors. The Board of Directors approved discretionary contributions equal to 1% of participant eligible compensation for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the employer safe harbor matching contributions totaled \$840,699 and \$804,189, respectively, and discretionary contributions totaled \$239,637 and \$225,707, respectively, to be applied in 2025 and 2024, respectively.

Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Investment Options: Participants may direct both employee and employer contributions to be invested among various investment options as made available and determined by the Plan Administrator, which are more fully described in the plan literature. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds and common/collective trusts as investment options for participants. Participants may change their investment options at any time throughout the year via direct phone or internet access with the recordkeeper.

Participant Accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the employer safe harbor matching contribution and an allocation of the employer discretionary contribution. Plan earnings are allocated based on participant account balances, as defined. The benefits to which a participant is entitled are the benefits that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting: Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and employer safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings or losses thereon. Vesting in the employer discretionary contribution portion of participants' accounts plus earnings or losses thereon is based on years of continuous service.

Notes Receivable from Participants: Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balances. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates equal to the prime interest rate as published in *The Wall Street Journal* at the time the loans are funded, which is commensurate with local prevailing rates. Loan terms may range from one to five years or longer if used to purchase the primary residence of the participant. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits: Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement from the Plan Sponsor, a participant may elect to receive the vested interest in their account in the form of installments, a single sum cash payment or a combination of the two. Upon termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in their account as a lump-sum distribution. If the balance of the terminated participant's account is between \$1,000 and \$5,000, the Plan Sponsor may authorize the benefit payment to be rolled into an individual retirement account in the participant's name. The Plan also allows in-service distributions from the vested portion of a participant's account once the participant reaches the age of 59½.

Forfeitures: As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeitures from nonvested accounts totaled \$66,659 and \$49,279, respectively. These amounts can be used to reduce employer safe harbor matching contributions or employer discretionary contributions, or to pay reasonable plan expenses. Plan Sponsor safe harbor matching contributions were reduced by \$0 and \$25,000 in 2024 and 2023, respectively, from forfeited nonvested accounts.

Administrative Expenses: Certain expenses of the Plan are paid by the Plan Sponsor as provided in the plan document. Expenses paid directly by the Plan Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits. Certain administrative functions are performed by employees of the Plan Sponsor. No officers or employees receive compensation from the Plan.

Plan Termination: Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of the Plan's termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements of the Plan were prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP).

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with US GAAP requires the trustee to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Benefit Payments: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: The Plan's investments are held by the Plan's trustee and reported at fair value except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The 401(k) Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and the trustee.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis, and dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains or losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Fair Value Measurements: The Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) establishes a framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The guidance also establishes a three-level fair value hierarchy that describes the inputs used to measure assets and liabilities.

- Level 1 asset and liability fair values are based on quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities.
- Level 2 asset and liability fair values are based on observable inputs that include quoted market prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted market prices that are not in an active market, or other inputs that are observable in the market and can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities.
- Level 3 assets and liabilities are financial instruments whose value is calculated by the use of pricing models and/or discounted cash flow methodologies, as well as financial instruments for which the determination of fair value requires significant management judgment or estimation.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following are descriptions of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 compared to December 31, 2023.

- *Mutual Funds* – Mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.
- *Common/Collective Trusts* – The common/collective trusts are valued at the NAV of the underlying investments expressed in units. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the trust less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the trusts will sell the investments for an amount different from the reported NAV.

- *Collective Trust Funds* – The collective trust funds are valued at the NAV of the underlying investments expressed in units. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the trust less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the trusts will sell the investments for an amount different from the reported NAV.

Subsequent Events: The Plan Administrator has evaluated subsequent events through October 13, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

The Plan’s policy is to recognize transfers between Levels 1 and 2 and into and out of Level 3 as of the date of the event or change in circumstances that caused the transfer. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no transfers between Levels 1 and 2 and no transfers into or out of Level 3.

NOTE 5 – INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan holds a Great Gray Trust Stable Value Fund, designed to be fully benefit responsive, which is a standard feature of stable value funds that allows for daily liquidity, or withdrawals, to the extent of principal and credited interest. It is structured to provide principal preservation and steady returns through a combination of an investment contract and a fixed-income portfolio, backed by the issuer. These contracts meet the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and are therefore reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with the fully benefit-responsive contracts is dependent upon the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

The stable value fund amounts of \$1,227,105 as of December 31, 2024, respectively, were disclosed at contract value. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer but may not be less than 0%.

NOTE 6 – RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain investments of the Plan are shares of mutual funds and common/collective trust funds managed by institutional trustees and custodians, which qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. Fees paid to the trustee for recordkeeping services amounted to \$34,537 for each of the year ended December 31, 2024.

The Plan Sponsor provides certain accounting and administrative services to the Plan for which no fees are charged. These services constitute exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS

The Plan had previously adopted a nonstandardized prototype plan document sponsored by Great-West Trust Company, LLC. The IRS issued an opinion letter, dated June 30, 2020, stating that the prototype plan document adopted by the Plan meets the requirements of Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and is exempt from federal income tax. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan was designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes is included in the Plan's financial statements.

NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS (CONTINUED)

US GAAP requires the Plan Administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities, which are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for plan benefits.

The Plan is required to disclose significant concentrations of credit risk regardless of the degree of such risk. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the financial instruments that potentially subject the Plan to a concentration of credit risk consist principally of cash, investments and participant loans.

NOTE 9 – TRUSTEE CERTIFICATION

The investment balances and related investment information included in the financial statements, accompanying notes and supplemental schedule were derived from statements certified by Fidelity as of December 31, 2024 and Empower Trust Company, LLC, formerly Great-West Trust Company as of December 31, 2023 as complete and accurate in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
