NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of Hauser & Wirth Inc. 401(k) and Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees (the "Participants") of Hauser & Wirth AG's entities in the United States of America; these entities include Hauser & Wirth Inc. and Hauser & Wirth CA Inc. (the "Companies" and "Plan Sponsor"). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The executive management of the Companies control and manage the operation and administration of the Plan.

Eligibility - To be eligible for elective contributions, an employee must have completed one (1) year of service and be twenty-one (21) years of age or older. The Plan defines (1) year of service by the completion of 1,000 hours of employment in a calendar year.

Employee Contributions - Each year, participants may contribute up to the maximum amount limited by the Internal Revenue Service (the "IRS"). For the year ended December 31, 2024, employees can defer from one percent of salary up to \$23,000 (amount will increase to \$23,500 for the year ending December 31, 2025). Participants may also contribute amounts representing rollover distributions from other qualified retirement accounts. The Plan permits after-tax Roth 401K contributions.

The Plan has adopted an Eligible Automatic Contribution Arrangement which enrolls all eligible employees and allocates 3.0% of each employee's eligible compensation as a pre-tax contribution. Employees have the right to opt out, change their contribution percentage or change their investment allocation election at any time.

Participants who are aged 50 or older may make catch-up contributions to the Plan up to the maximum amount limited by the IRS. For the year ended December 31, 2024, this additional catch-up contribution is \$7,500 (amounts will remain at \$7,500 for the year ending December 31, 2025).

Employer Contributions - The Company provides Safe Harbor contributions to all participants, currently at the rate of 3.0% of the participant compensation. The Plan also provides that the employer may make discretionary profit-sharing contributions, which the Company made 3.0% profit sharing contributions during the current year. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company contributed total \$1,158,151 as Safe Harbor and profit sharing contributions. Employer contributions receivable of \$615,071 on December 31, 2024, consists of the profit sharing contribution.

Investment Options - Participants direct the investment of all contributions into the various investment options that are offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers approximately 29 registered investment companies as investment options. The Plan also offers a common collective trust administered that provides a stable value investment option. Participants may change their investment allocation at their discretion. The shares of the mutual funds (and investments in the common collective trust) are purchased at the direction of Participants through salary deferral and rollovers, Company safe-harbor contributions, and investment income reinvestments. Additionally, shares of the funds are sold whenever a participant withdraws from the Plan or transfers account balances among the funds.

Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's profit-sharing contribution and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Participants are immediately vested in their elective deferrals, rollover contributions, Safe Harbor contributions, and actual earnings thereon.

Vesting in the profit-sharing contributions plus earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. Vesting occurs ratably in 20% increments annually starting after two (2) years of credited service as follows:

0 to 1 year	0%
2 years	20%
3 years	40%
4 years	60%
5 years	80%
6 years	100%

Additionally, a participant becomes 100 percent vested in the employer's contribution upon the occurrence of (a) death and (b) total and permanent disability.

Participants' Loans - Except for provisions provided by the CARES Act, participants may borrow from their fund accounts the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the vested amount. Loan terms are in general up to 5 years, or a reasonable time would be determined if the loan is for the main purpose of purchasing the principal residence of the participant. Loans bear interest at the prime lending rate plus 1.00%. A participant is limited to one loan outstanding at any one time. There are four loans receivable outstanding as of December 31, 2024. The participant loans mature between November 2025 and May 2027. The loans are secured by the balance in the participants' accounts, and the current loans bear interest rates at 8.75% and 9.50%. Principal and interest are paid through payroll deduction. Additionally, participants who apply for loans are charged a small, one-time application fee.

Loans are segregated investments and to the extent a participant borrows, their account will not share in the earnings and gains in value attributable to other investments. The interest that participants pay on their loans will be directly credited to their account. If any losses are realized or expense incurred in the event of default, such losses and expense shall be allocated only to the participant's accounts. Unpaid principal balances on loans will be deemed a distribution if the participant terminates employment.

Payment of Benefits - Upon termination of employment due to retirement or death, a participant or his or her beneficiary will receive a single sum of the vested account balance. A participant shall choose to be paid in a single sum of their vested account balance or to be rolled over to a qualified retirement plan if he or she ceases to be an employee for any other reason. The Plan has adopted an automatic distribution policy for terminated participants whose accounts are below \$5,000. The Plan charges a small distribution fee for various types of distributions. The Plan permits hardship distributions.

Forfeited Accounts - Forfeited non-vested accounts are used to reduce future employer contributions or Plan fees. The following is a summary of forfeiture activity during the year ended December 31, 2024:

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting - The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("US GAAP").

Contributions by participants are recognized in the period the participants' wages are earned, but withdrawals from the Plan for participant distributions are recognized when the amounts are paid to the participant, except for cases where refunds are due to the participants in order for the Plan to conform to Internal Revenue Code (the "IRC") provisions. Plan expenses are recorded when incurred.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with US GAAP requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - Mutual fund values are based on the underlying investments. Mutual fund securities traded on security exchanges are valued daily at the latest quoted sales price. Securities traded on a national securities exchange are valued at the last reported sales price on the last business day of the Plan year. The Plan's investments are stated at fair value except for the investment in the Invesco Stable Asset Fund. This fund invests in investment contracts (also referred to as "wrap contracts") and seeks to produce a stable return while avoiding negative returns. This investment is valued at net asset values ("NAV") per share as of the close of business on the valuation date.

Participant loans included under investments are recorded at cost plus accrued interest.

Purchases and sales of shares are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends from the mutual funds are recorded when reported by the registered investment companies. Security transactions are accounted for on the date securities are purchased or sold (trade date). Net realized and unrealized gains and losses are recorded in the accompanying financial statements as net realized and unrealized gains in fair value of investments. Contributions are invested as reasonably close to payroll dates as the plan administrator can segregate payroll funds and amounts are accrued, if applicable.

Risk and Uncertainties - The Plan utilizes various investment instruments. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term. Such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Participant loans represent loans that are recorded at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest. Related fees are recorded as administrative expense and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses have been recorded as of December 31, 2024. Delinquent participant loans, if any, are classified as distributions based on the terms of the plan agreement.

Plan Termination - Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right to terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA. Upon termination of the Plan, the entire amount of each participant's account, with respect to the Plan, shall become 100% vested and non-forfeitable.

Plan Administrator Costs - The Company absorbs a portion of administration costs related to the Plan. Administrative expenses and fund fees incurred by the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024 totaled \$1,475. This amount consists of direct transaction fees charged for participant loans and distributions. These amounts are charged directly to the participants on a per transaction fee basis.

Related Party Transactions - Certain Trustee, accounting, and administrative expenses relating to the maintenance of participant records and the Plan's administration are absorbed by the Company and certain administrative expenses are charged against Plan assets and allocated to Participants on a pro-rata basis. Certain Plan investments are held in shares of common collective trust accounts. These transactions and participant loans qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Subsequent Events - Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 9, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. The Plan measures, monitors and discloses its assets on a fair value basis in accordance with ASC 820. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurement) and the lowest to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB 820 are described as follows:

- *Level 1*: Inputs to the valuation methodology are quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan can access.
- *Level 2*: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
 - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.
- *Level 3*: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The assets or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Mutual funds - Valued at the net asset value of shares of the mutual funds held by the Plan at year-end based on actively traded market daily prices of the underlying securities. The funds themselves trade on a daily basis.

Stable value fund - This investment is presented at contract or net asset value.

In regard to the classification of investment options offered by the Plan, there were no reclassifications in or out of levels 1, 2 or 3 during the years ended December 31, 2024, and 2023. The nature, risks, and investment objectives of the level 2 and 3 investment categories described above, for which fair value is estimated at NAV, can be found in the Plan's enrollment literature. These investments can be redeemed immediately and without a redemption notification period. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no unfunded commitments associated with any of these investments.

NOTE 4 - TAX STATUS

The Plan follows the provisions of the Automatic Data Processing Defined Contribution Plan, a Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan. The IRS has determined and informed the Trustee by letter dated October 6, 2020, that the prototype plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan may have been amended since receiving the determination letter. The Company's management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC.

US GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements.

The plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2020.

NOTE 6 - STABLE VALUE FUND

Invesco Stable Asset ADPZ ("Stable Value Fund") units are issued and redeemed daily at the Stable Value Fund's constant net asset value of \$1.00 per unit. Stable value funds seek to provide income while preventing price fluctuations. The most common stable value funds invest in a diversified portfolio of bonds and enter into wrapper agreements with financial companies to guarantee against fluctuations in their share prices. The safety of these funds therefore depends on both the fund's investments as well as the financial strength of the insurance companies and banks that back the wrapper agreements. It is the policy of the Stable Value Fund to use its best efforts to maintain a stable net asset value of \$1.00 per unit; although there is no guarantee that the fund will be able to maintain this value.

Interest-crediting rates are typically reset on a monthly or quarterly basis. The current crediting rate is 3.0%. Because changes in market interest rates affect the yield to maturity and the fair value of the underlying fixed-income securities, they can have a material impact on the interest crediting rate. In addition, withdrawals and transfers from the Stable Value Fund are paid at contract value but may be funded through fair value liquidation of the underlying fixed-income securities, which could impact the interest-crediting rate. During the year ended December 31, 2024, 76% of bonds earned AAA ratings and AA ratings.

NOTE 7 - TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTIES-IN-INTEREST

A related party is any party who can control or significantly influence Plan management or operating policies. Parties-in-interest are defined under DOL Regulations as any employees of the Plan, fiduciaries of the Plan, service providers to the Plan, the employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, and certain significant owners of the employer and their relatives. Service providers may include, but are not limited to, the custodian, trustee, third party administrator (the TPA), investment managers, investment advisors, legal counsel, and Plan auditor.

During 2024, the Plan made direct payments of \$1,475 to certain parties-in-interest for administration and investment advisory fees, as allowed by ERISA. The Plan Sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the operation of the Plan.

Fees incurred by the plan for the investment management services are included in the net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of the related investment, as they are paid using investment earnings rather than a direct payment.
