Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

## **Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of Daily Harvest 401(k) Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.

- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Daily Harvest 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

#### **Other Matter – Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA**

The supplemental schedules of Schedule H, Line 4a – Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024 and Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024 are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

- The form and content of the supplemental schedules, other than the information in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The information in the supplemental schedules related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

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## 1. Description of Plan

The following description of Daily Harvest 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

### *General*

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering eligible employees of Daily Harvest, Inc. (the Company) that have attained 21 years of age and completed three months of service, excluding union employees, non-resident aliens, leased employees, and interns.

The Plan was originally established on January 1, 2019, and was most recently amended effective January 24, 2024, to clarify certain aspects of the Plan. The Plan Administrator is responsible for the oversight of the Plan, determining the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitoring investment performance.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (the Code) and the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

### *Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement (SECURE) Act and SECURE 2.0 Act*

The SECURE Act and the SECURE 2.0 Act had various provisions in effect during the year ended December 31, 2024. The most significant change required including long-term part-time (LTPT) employees who attained 500 or more hours of service in three consecutive 12-month eligibility computation periods beginning in 2021 as eligible employees for participant contributions. Due to the Plan's termination subsequent to December 31, 2024, the Plan was amended in June and July 2025 for the SECURE Act and the SECURE 2.0 Act.

### *Contributions*

Participants may elect to defer and contribute pre-tax or Roth contributions up to 90% or 50% of their eligible compensation, respectively, after taking into account required withholdings, as defined. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Plan provides for employer matching contributions for eligible participants. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the employer matching contribution was 50% of each participant's contributions up to 5% of each participant's eligible compensation, totaling \$259,932.

In addition to the employer matching contribution, the Plan provides for discretionary non-elective employer contributions (profit-sharing contributions). For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made no such contributions.

All contributions and compensation are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

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## 1. Description of Plan ...continued

### *Participant Accounts*

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, and employer matching contributions as well as allocations of the discretionary non-elective employer contributions (if any) and the Plan's earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on each participant's account balance, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

### *Notes Receivable from Participants*

The Plan permits its participants to obtain loans against their account balances. A participant may borrow from his or her vested account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000, reduced by the difference between the highest outstanding loan balance in the participant's account during the prior twelve month period and the outstanding balance of loans from the Plan on the date the loan is made, or 50% of his or her vested account balance. The notes receivable from participants bear interest at the prime rate reflected in the Wall Street Journal plus 1% on the date of the loan.

The maximum number of loans a participant may have outstanding at any one time is one. All loans must be repaid in level payments through payroll deductions each pay period over a period of no more than five years with the exception of loans used to purchase a primary residence, which are limited to ten years. The level repayment requirement may be suspended if a participant is on a leave of absence; however, the loan must still be repaid in full on the maturity date. The Plan Administrator shall consider a loan in default if any scheduled repayment remains unpaid as of the last business day of the calendar quarter following the calendar quarter in which a loan is initially considered past due. In the event of a default or termination of employment, the entire outstanding principal and accrued interest shall be immediately due and payable. As of December 31, 2024, the rate of interest on outstanding notes receivable from participants was 9.00% which have a maturity date of May 2026.

Certain other restrictions apply to notes receivable from participants as defined in the plan document.

### *Vesting*

Participants are immediately vested in all participant and employer contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

### *Payment of Benefits*

Withdrawals may be made from a participant's account upon retirement, death, disability, financial hardship, or termination of employment. The participant's vested account shall be distributed to the participant in a single lump-sum payment to withdraw all or a portion of his or her account. Distributions on account of the death of the participant allow all beneficiaries to receive extended payments, as defined. If a participant terminates service and the vested amount does not exceed \$1,000 (increased to \$7,000, effective April 1, 2024, as part of the SECURE Act and the SECURE 2.0 Act amendments), the vested benefit is to be paid to the participant in a single lump-sum as soon as practical without regard to the consent of the participant. A participant over age 59 1/2 may elect to withdraw all or a portion of his or her vested account while still employed at the Company. Distribution shall be made to an eligible participant from his or her vested account as soon as reasonably practicable following the date the participant's application for distribution is received by the Plan Administrator, but in no event later than the participant's attainment of age 73.

Certain other restrictions apply to benefit payments as defined in the plan document.

### *Investment Elections*

Each participant shall direct the investment of his or her account and shall elect among various mutual funds. Each participant has the ability to change his or her investment allocations at any time.

## 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

### *Basis of Accounting*

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting standards set by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB). The FASB sets generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America (GAAP) to ensure net assets available for benefits and changes in net assets available for benefits are consistently reported. References to GAAP issued by the FASB in these notes are to the FASB Accounting Standards Codification (ASC).

### *Use of Estimates*

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

### *Investment Valuation and Income Recognition*

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan Administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by investment advisers and Matrix Trust Company (Matrix), the trustee. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

### *Notes Receivable from Participants*

Notes receivable from participants are measured at amortized cost, which represents the unpaid principal balance plus any accrued, but unpaid interest. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, accrued, but unpaid interest has been deemed insignificant to the Plan. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, notes receivable from participants are reduced and a benefit payment is recorded within the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

### *Payment of Benefits*

Benefits are recorded when paid.

### *Administrative Expenses*

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to participant-initiated transactions are charged directly to the applicable participant's account and included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

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### 3. Fair Value Measurements

The Plan discloses the fair value of investments in accordance with FASB ASC Topic No. 820, *Fair Value Measurements* (ASC 820). The framework under ASC 820 provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means; and
- if the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual funds* – Mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the applicable mutual fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission, which are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

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## 4. Information Prepared and Certified by Plan's Trustee

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Matrix has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and the Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024 and the related investment activity reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

## 5. Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a pre-approved plan in which the IRS determined, by an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Code. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

GAAP requires management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

## 6. Plan Termination

The Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. Participants are fully vested in all contribution sources and therefore, the Plan was not analyzed for a potential partial plan termination. The Plan was terminated subsequent to December 31, 2024 (see Note 9) and since participants are fully vested in all contribution sources, the Plan's termination did not have an impact on the vested balance of participant accounts.

## 7. Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan issues notes receivable to participants, which are secured by the balances in participant accounts and represent party-in-interest transactions.

## 8. Risk and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities that are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

## 9. Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events for potential disclosure or recognition through October 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

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### 9. Subsequent Events...continued

Effective January 1, 2025, the SECURE 2.0 Act expanded LTPT provisions to include employees who attained 500 or more hours of service in two consecutive 12-month eligibility computation periods beginning in 2021 as eligible employees for participant contributions. Further, participants from ages 60 to 63 will be allowed to contribute catch-up contributions equal to 150% of the standard limit.

The Company was acquired on May 16, 2025 by Chobani. In conjunction with the acquisition, the Company elected to terminate the Plan effective May 15, 2025. As of October 15, 2025, the Plan has not yet been liquidated.
