Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Stillwater Mining Company Bargaining Unit 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Basis for Opinion



NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Stillwater Mining Company Bargaining Unit 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a qualified 401(k) defined contribution plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan became effective October 1, 1996, and was most recently restated January 1, 2022, and amended June 1, 2024. The Benefit Plans Committee is responsible for the oversight of the Plan and determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance, and reports to the Plan's Board of Directors.

Eligibility

The union employees of Stillwater Mining Company (the Company) are eligible to participate in the deferral and match components of the Plan upon the employee's date of hire. Eligible union employees enter the Plan on the first day of the month immediately following or coinciding with the date the eligibility provisions are met.

Contributions

The Plan includes a salary deferral arrangement allowed under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Eligible participants are permitted to elect a percentage, as limited by Plan provisions, of their compensation contributed as pre-tax 401(k) and Roth contributions to the Plan.

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all eligible participants are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they have in effect a salary deferral arrangement at least equal to the automatic deferral amount or unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 6% of eligible compensation, and their contributions are invested in the designated default fund until changed by the participant.

Participants may also make after-tax contributions to the Plan, as limited by Plan provisions. Participants who have attained age 50 by the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

The Company matching contributions are equal to 100% of each participant's elected deferral contribution, up to 8% of the participant's compensation, for the contribution period.

The Company may elect to make a discretionary nonelective contribution to the Plan. Nonelective contributions are allocated to participants based on the ratio of each participant's eligible compensation to the total compensation paid to all eligible participants for the Plan year. Participants must have at least 182 days of employment and be employed on the last day of the Plan year to receive nonelective contributions. There were no discretionary nonelective contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Contributions (Continued)

Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's voluntary contributions, the Company's matching contribution, an allocation of the Company's discretionary nonelective contribution, and an allocation of Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, or participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company contribution portion of their accounts, plus actual earnings thereon, is based on years of credited service. A participant is 100% vested after a cliff of three years of credited service. Notwithstanding the above, a participant is fully vested upon reaching normal retirement age, death, or permanent disability.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 (reduced by the excess, if any, of the highest outstanding balance of loans during the one-year period ending on the day before the loan is made, over the outstanding balance of loans from the Plan on the date the loan is made) or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear an interest rate of prime, as reported by the U.S. Federal Reserve on the last business day of a calendar quarter effective for loans made on and after the first business day of the subsequent quarter, plus 2%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account in the form of a lump sum distribution, partial withdrawal or installments. The Plan allows for in-service distributions if a participant reaches age 59½ and allows for hardship distributions subject to Plan provisions. If a participant terminates employment and the participant's account balance does not exceed \$5,000, the Plan administrator will authorize the benefit payment without the participant's consent. If the balance of the terminated participant's account is between \$1,000 and \$5,000, the Plan Sponsor may authorize that the benefit payment be rolled into an individual retirement account in the participant's name.

Forfeitures

The nonvested portion of terminated participants accounts are used to pay administrative expenses and fund future Company contributions. Forfeited nonvested accounts as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$75,129 and \$78,063, respectively. There were \$332,607 of forfeitures used for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Plan-to-Plan Transfers

The Company also sponsors the Stillwater Mining Company 401(k) Plan, which covers nonunion employees of the Company (as defined by the Plan document). Transfers to and from this Plan occur when the union membership status of an employee changes. There were net transfers out of the Plan of \$2,617,848 during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Plan Termination

Although the Company has not expressed any intent to do so, it has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the participants would become 100% vested in their Company contributions.

On September 12, 2024, the Plan sponsor provided notice of a layoff beginning on November 12th, 2024. In aggregate, the termination represents a partial termination of the Plan. As a result of this partial termination, all accumulated benefits of affected employees will be fully vested on the date on which the employees are terminated.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Presentation

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Benefit Plans Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance company. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the Plan year.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company. Expenses paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest.

Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. Delinquent notes receivable are recorded as distributions on the basis of the terms of the Plan document.

Distributions to Participants

Distributions to participants are recorded when paid by the trustee.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. These investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, liquidity and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 8, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 CERTIFICATION OF INVESTMENT INFORMATION

Empower Trust Company, LLC and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, the qualified institutions, have supplied the Plan administrator with a certification as to the completeness and accuracy of all investment information and notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

Prudential Bank & Trust, FSB and Prudential Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, the previous qualified institutions, have supplied the Plan administrator with a certification as to the completeness and accuracy of all investment information and notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2023.

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

The *Fair Value Measurement* topic of the FASB *Accounting Standards Codification* provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides for a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement. The unobservable inputs reflect the Plan's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used must maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used during 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective Investment Trusts – Valued at the NAV of units of the collective investment trust. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

Pooled Separate Accounts – Valued at the NAV of units as determined by the insurance company. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

NOTE 5 GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

Effective December 1, 2014, the Plan entered into a benefit-responsive evergreen group annuity contract with Prudential Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (PRIAC). Effective October 3, 2022, PRIAC was renamed Empower Annuity Insurance Company (EAIC). This product is backed by the full faith and credit of EAIC. EAIC maintains the contributions in a general account. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The general account balance as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$48,125,916 and \$63,217,058, respectively.

Interest is credited on contract balances using a single portfolio rate approach. Under this methodology, a single interest crediting rate is applied to all contributions made to the product regardless of the timing of those contributions. Interest crediting rates are reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 1.5%. The crediting interest rate was 2.1% as of December 31, 2024.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by PRIAC, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Generally, there are no events that could limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value paid within 90 days or in rare circumstances, contract value paid over time. There are no events that allow the issuer to terminate the contract, and which require the Plan Sponsor to settle at an amount different than the contract value paid either within 90 days or over time.

NOTE 6 INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan is placing reliance on an opinion letter from the IRS on the pre-approved plan indicating that the Plan is designed in accordance with the applicable section of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 7 PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by the qualified institutions of the Plan; therefore, the investment transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.
