Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of The Chrysalis Center 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate

Qualified Opinion on the Financial Statements

In our opinion, except for possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion on the Financial Statements sections of our report, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Qualified Opinion on the Financial Statements

The Plan did not complete the annual compliance testing for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, as required by ERISA and the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS"). Management has not determined the impact this would have in the financial statements and in the compliance with certain requirements from the IRS. In our opinion, the annual compliance is required by ERISA and the IRS and must be completed by the Plan.

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion on the financial statements.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.

The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or are derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

1. Description of Plan

The following description of The Chrysalis Center 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established for the purpose of providing retirement benefits to substantially all full-time employees of Chrysalis Center, Inc. and Chrysalis Health Ohio (collectively, the “Employer” or the “Company”), who have completed one year of service. The Employer is the designated administrator of the Plan. The Plan became effective on January 1, 2011. Subsequently amended in 2012, the Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

The Plan’s assets were maintained by John Hancock Life Insurance Company (USA) (“John Hancock” or the “Qualified Institution”).

The Plan did not complete the annual compliance testing for the year ended December 31, 2024, as required by ERISA and the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”). Management has not determined the impact this would have in the financial statements and in the compliance with certain requirements from the IRS.

Investment Funds

Participating employees have the right to choose several investment options into which contributions to their accounts are invested and may choose to allocate and reallocate amounts credited to their accounts among all or any combination of the investment options. Earnings on investments are allocated among the participant accounts that have elected to invest in each such option. Recordkeeping for the Plan participants’ accounts is performed by John Hancock.

Eligibility

All eligible employees 21 years or older, are eligible to enter the Plan after one year of service (equivalent to 1,000 hours of service) to the Employer.

Contributions

Contributions to the Plan are made by the participant and the Employer. Participants have the right to elect to defer a portion of their compensation as defined in the Plan, subject to certain Internal Revenue Code limitations. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Employees may also rollover account balances from other plans into their account.

The Employer makes safe harbor matching contributions on a dollar-for-dollar basis, up to 4% of the participants’ gross compensation in each pay period.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow money from their fund accounts up to a maximum equal to the lesser of (i) \$50,000 or (ii) 50% of the present value of the vested benefits in the participant’s account from any source. The loans are secured by the participant’s vested account balance provided the outstanding balance of all participant loans made to the participant does not exceed 50% of the participant’s vested account balance under the Plan. The loans bear interest rates ranging from 4.25% to 8.00%. Participants may not request a loan for less than \$1,000.

Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions and must be repaid to the Plan within a 5 year period unless the notes receivable are used for the purchase of a principal residence, in which case the maximum repayment period may be longer, but not longer than 10 years.

1. Description of Plan (Continued)

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each Plan participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined in the Plan agreement. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures of Employer prior year's matching and non-elective contributions are included as part of any Employer current year matching contributions made to the Plan. Forfeitures of discretionary Employer contributions are allocated in the same manner as any discretionary Employer contribution made for a Plan year to those participants who are eligible to share in such discretionary Employer contribution. At December 31, 2024, there were no forfeited non-vested accounts.

Administrative Expenses

All of the administrative expenses of the Plan may be paid by the Company or the Plan. There were no forfeiture funds in 2024.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability or normal retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or annual installments. Upon termination of employment for reasons other than death, disability or normal retirement, a participant is entitled to distributions based upon the vested portion of his or her account. This distribution is made in one lump-sum or a participant can have any portion vested from their account balance transferred to an eligible retirement plan specified by the participant or the participant's beneficiary in a direct rollover.

In certain hardship situations, as described in the Plan Agreement, participants may withdraw part of their account balances while actively employed, but such withdrawals are limited to the amount dictated by the hardship. Due to the CARES Act, penalty free distributions are allowed if distributions are COVID-19 related.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and the Employer's matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates, including those regarding fair value, and assumptions that affect the reported amounts and disclosure of contingent liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could materially differ from those estimates.

Tax Status

The Plan adopted a prototype non-standardized plan developed by John Hancock Retirement Plan Services LLC, which obtained a favorable IRS determination letter on June 30, 2020, in which the IRS stated that the form of the underlying prototype plan was acceptable under provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (“Code”) and that any employer adopting this form of the Plan will be considered to have a plan qualified under the Code. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code, and therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the accompanying financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Fair Value Measurements

Fair values of financial instruments are estimated using relevant market information and other assumptions, as more fully disclosed in Note 6. Fair value estimates involve uncertainties and matters of significant judgement. Changes in assumptions or in market conditions could significantly affect the estimates.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan’s administrator determines the Plan valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisor and custodian. See Note 6 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year and unrealized gains when adjusting investments to fair value.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Investment income is recorded on the accrual basis. Delinquent participant notes receivable are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Benefit Payments

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Plan Expenses

Fees and expenses of the Plan are paid by the Employer or the Plan as provided by the Plan document. For the year ended December 31, 2024, expenses were paid by the Plan. Expenses paid by the Employer are excluded from these financial statements. Investment management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments in the various funds are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are reflected as a component of net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events from the date of the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits through October 14, 2025 which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Risk and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits and the accompanying Statements of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

4. Information Certified by the Qualified Institution

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted under such election, the Plan administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform auditing procedures with respect to the information certified by John Hancock, except for comparing such certified information to the related information included in the financial statements and the ERISA-required supplemental schedules. Accordingly, John Hancock, the qualified institution of the Plan, has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules are complete and accurate.

- Investments, at fair value, and notes receivable from participants as shown on the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Schedule of Assets (Held at Year End) – Form 5500, Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4i as of December 31, 2024.

5. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event the Plan terminates, each participant will become 100% vested in their Employer contributions.

6. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan can access at the measurement date.
- Level 2 Inputs other than quoted prices include within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:
 - quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
 - inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- Level 3 Inputs that are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Registered investment companies: Obtained from quoted prices in active markets for assets identical to the securities valued.

Interest-bearing cash: Relate to investment or participant transactions in process or residual amounts not otherwise invested.

The following table sets forth by level, within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan's assets at fair value on a recurring basis as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Classification within the fair value hierarchy table is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

9. Prohibited Transactions

For the year ended December 31, 2024, \$744,362 of employee contributions were not remitted to the Plan within the timeframe required by the Department of Labor. These transactions constitute prohibited transactions as defined by ERISA. The DOL requires that participant contributions be remitted to the Plan on the earliest date on which they can be reasonably segregated from the Company's general assets. Failure to remit participant contributions to the Plan in a timely manner result in a prohibited transaction which must be separately reported to the DOL and may result in penalties to the Plan. The accompanying supplemental Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions presents the prohibited transactions of the Plan. As of October 14, 2025, the Plan administrator is currently working with the Company to calculate the loss or earnings to make the corresponding corrective contributions to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024.
