## Notes to Financial Statements

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### **1. Description of Plan**

JTC USA 401(k) Plan (Plan) is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of JTC USA Holdings Inc. The Plan was established October 1, 2005, amended and restated January 1, 2023 and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The following are the adopting employers of the Plan: JTC USA Holdings Inc, JTC Trust Company (South Dakota) LTD., JTC Miami Corporation, New York Private Trust Company, South Dakota Trust Company LLC, and First Republic Trust Company of Delaware LLC (collectively, Companies). Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

During 2023, the Plan was managed by two custodians, Nationwide Trust Company, FSB (Nationwide) and John Hancock Trust Company LLC (Custodians). During 2024, the Plan transferred all assets to Fidelity Management Trust Company (Trustee), the transfer initiated a blackout period from October 21, 2024 to December 1, 2024.

#### ***Eligibility***

To be eligible to participate in the Plan, employees of adopting employers are eligible to participate after three months of employment. All classifications of the Companies are eligible to participate in the Plan upon completion of the eligibility requirements except for employees whose benefits are governed by a collective bargaining agreement, nonresident aliens with no income from a U.S. source, and leased employees.

#### ***Participant Accounts***

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Companies' contributions and allocations of the invested funds' earnings. Allocations of earnings are based on account balances as defined by the Plan. Certain administrative expenses may be charged directly to the participant's account incurring those expenses.

#### ***Contributions***

Participants may contribute a percentage of their eligible annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, limited to the maximum permitted under applicable Internal Revenue Code (IRC) regulations. Participants may also contribute after-tax contributions to Roth 401(k) options and amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. The Companies make safe harbor matching contributions equal to 100% of salary deferrals up to 5% of compensation and may make discretionary matching contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, no discretionary contributions were made to the Plan. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Companies made safe harbor matching contributions totaling \$1,471,588.

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### ***Vesting***

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants vest in safe harbor and discretionary matching contributions as follows:

### ***Forfeitures***

Forfeitures of unvested company contributions may be used to pay Plan expenses or to reduce future company matching contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2024, no forfeitures were used to reduce company matching contributions or expenses. Forfeitures available for future use at December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$104,501 and \$80,366, respectively.

### ***Payment of Benefits***

Distribution of a participant's vested account balance is available upon the participant's retirement, death, disability, termination of employment, attainment of age 59 1/2 or for a financial hardship meeting the requirements of the IRC. In the event of death, disability, retirement or termination of employment, the Company has the option to require those participants with account balances of less than \$5,000 to take lump-sum distributions, unless a directed rollover is elected. In-service distributions are only permitted if the participant is 100% vested in the source from which the withdrawal is taken.

### ***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Notes receivable from participants represent loans that are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when incurred. Plan participants may borrow from their accounts an amount generally not to exceed the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, except for amounts borrowed under the CARES Act. The repayment terms of loans may not exceed five years except for loans used to acquire a principal residence. Each loan bears interest at the prime rate plus one percent. Principal and interest are paid ratably through automatic payroll deductions. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the loan to be a distribution, notes receivable from participants is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

## **Notes to Financial Statements**

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### ***Plan Termination***

The Companies have the right to terminate the Plan in compliance with the provisions of ERISA. In the event the Plan is terminated, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts. The Companies, however, do not intend to terminate the Plan.

### ***Expenses***

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Companies and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

## **2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

### ***Basis of Accounting***

The financial statements have been prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

### ***Estimates and Assumptions***

Management uses estimates and assumptions in preparing financial statements in accordance with GAAP. Those estimates and assumptions affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could vary from the estimates used in preparing the accompanying financial statements.

### ***Investment Valuation and Income Recognition***

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements. The Plan presents the net change in fair value of investments, which consists of realized gains or losses, unrealized appreciation (depreciation), and any income or capital gain distributions from such investments, in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

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***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest.

***Payment of Benefits***

Benefits to participants are recorded when paid.

***Risks and Uncertainties***

The Plan provides for investment options in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**3. Financial Information Certified by the Plan’s Custodians and Trustee (Unaudited)**

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the Plan administrator instructed the independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the following information certified as complete and accurate by the Custodians and Trustee, party-in-interest as defined by ERISA as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, except for comparing such information certified by the Custodians and Trustee to information included in the Plan’s financial statements and supplemental schedule. 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### 4. Fair Value Measurements

Under the Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures topic of the Codification, ASC 820, disclosures are required about how fair value is determined for assets and liabilities and a hierarchy for which these assets and liabilities must be grouped is established, based on significant levels of inputs as follows:

- Level 1 quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; and model-derived valuations in which all significant inputs are observable in active markets.
- Level 3 valuations derived from valuation techniques in which one or more significant inputs are unobservable.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

#### ***Mutual Funds***

These investments are public investment vehicles valued using the net asset value (NAV) provided by the administrator of the fund. The NAV is based on the value of the underlying asset owned by the fund, less its liabilities and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. The NAV is a quoted price in an active market.

#### ***Collective Trusts***

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#### **7. Tax Status**

The Plan has received a determination letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020, stating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the IRC and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audit by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audit for any tax periods in progress. The Plan's Annual Return/Report of Employee Benefit Plan is subject to examination by the IRS for three years from the date of filing.

#### **8. Plan Corrections**

The Plan intends to correct operational errors related to distributions and Plan features for the year ended December 31, 2023.

#### **9. Subsequent Events**

Plan Management has evaluated subsequent events through October 10, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued and concluded that no additional disclosures are required.

## Notes to Financial Statements

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### **1. Description of Plan**

JTC USA 401(k) Plan (Plan) is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of JTC USA Holdings Inc. The Plan was established October 1, 2005, amended and restated January 1, 2023 and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The following are the adopting employers of the Plan: JTC USA Holdings Inc, JTC Trust Company (South Dakota) LTD., JTC Miami Corporation, New York Private Trust Company, South Dakota Trust Company LLC, and First Republic Trust Company of Delaware LLC (collectively, Companies). Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

During 2023, the Plan was managed by two custodians, Nationwide Trust Company, FSB (Nationwide) and John Hancock Trust Company LLC (Custodians). During 2024, the Plan transferred all assets to Fidelity Management Trust Company (Trustee), the transfer initiated a blackout period from October 21, 2024 to December 1, 2024.

#### ***Eligibility***

To be eligible to participate in the Plan, employees of adopting employers are eligible to participate after three months of employment. All classifications of the Companies are eligible to participate in the Plan upon completion of the eligibility requirements except for employees whose benefits are governed by a collective bargaining agreement, nonresident aliens with no income from a U.S. source, and leased employees.

#### ***Participant Accounts***

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Companies' contributions and allocations of the invested funds' earnings. Allocations of earnings are based on account balances as defined by the Plan. Certain administrative expenses may be charged directly to the participant's account incurring those expenses.

#### ***Contributions***

Participants may contribute a percentage of their eligible annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, limited to the maximum permitted under applicable Internal Revenue Code (IRC) regulations. Participants may also contribute after-tax contributions to Roth 401(k) options and amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. The Companies make safe harbor matching contributions equal to 100% of salary deferrals up to 5% of compensation and may make discretionary matching contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, no discretionary contributions were made to the Plan. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Companies made safe harbor matching contributions totaling \$1,471,588.

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### ***Vesting***

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants vest in safe harbor and discretionary matching contributions as follows:

### ***Forfeitures***

Forfeitures of unvested company contributions may be used to pay Plan expenses or to reduce future company matching contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2024, no forfeitures were used to reduce company matching contributions or expenses. Forfeitures available for future use at December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$104,501 and \$80,366, respectively.

### ***Payment of Benefits***

Distribution of a participant's vested account balance is available upon the participant's retirement, death, disability, termination of employment, attainment of age 59 1/2 or for a financial hardship meeting the requirements of the IRC. In the event of death, disability, retirement or termination of employment, the Company has the option to require those participants with account balances of less than \$5,000 to take lump-sum distributions, unless a directed rollover is elected. In-service distributions are only permitted if the participant is 100% vested in the source from which the withdrawal is taken.

### ***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Notes receivable from participants represent loans that are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when incurred. Plan participants may borrow from their accounts an amount generally not to exceed the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, except for amounts borrowed under the CARES Act. The repayment terms of loans may not exceed five years except for loans used to acquire a principal residence. Each loan bears interest at the prime rate plus one percent. Principal and interest are paid ratably through automatic payroll deductions. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the loan to be a distribution, notes receivable from participants is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

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#### ***Plan Termination***

The Companies have the right to terminate the Plan in compliance with the provisions of ERISA. In the event the Plan is terminated, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts. The Companies, however, do not intend to terminate the Plan.

#### ***Expenses***

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Companies and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

## **2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

#### ***Basis of Accounting***

The financial statements have been prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

#### ***Estimates and Assumptions***

Management uses estimates and assumptions in preparing financial statements in accordance with GAAP. Those estimates and assumptions affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could vary from the estimates used in preparing the accompanying financial statements.

#### ***Investment Valuation and Income Recognition***

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements. The Plan presents the net change in fair value of investments, which consists of realized gains or losses, unrealized appreciation (depreciation), and any income or capital gain distributions from such investments, in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

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***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest.

***Payment of Benefits***

Benefits to participants are recorded when paid.

***Risks and Uncertainties***

The Plan provides for investment options in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**3. Financial Information Certified by the Plan’s Custodians and Trustee (Unaudited)**

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the Plan administrator instructed the independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the following information certified as complete and accurate by the Custodians and Trustee, party-in-interest as defined by ERISA as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, except for comparing such information certified by the Custodians and Trustee to information included in the Plan’s financial statements and supplemental schedule. 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#### **4. Fair Value Measurements**

Under the Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures topic of the Codification, ASC 820, disclosures are required about how fair value is determined for assets and liabilities and a hierarchy for which these assets and liabilities must be grouped is established, based on significant levels of inputs as follows:

- Level 1 quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; and model-derived valuations in which all significant inputs are observable in active markets.
- Level 3 valuations derived from valuation techniques in which one or more significant inputs are unobservable.

These investments are public investment vehicles valued using the net asset value (NAV) provided by the administrator of the fund. The NAV is based on the value of the underlying asset owned by the fund, less its liabilities and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. The NAV is a quoted price in an active market.

#### ***Collective Trusts***

These investments are valued using NAV of shares held by the Plan at year end, as determined by the investment managers. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

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#### **7. Tax Status**

The Plan has received a determination letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020, stating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the IRC and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audit by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audit for any tax periods in progress. The Plan's Annual Return/Report of Employee Benefit Plan is subject to examination by the IRS for three years from the date of filing.

#### **8. Plan Corrections**

The Plan intends to correct operational errors related to distributions and Plan features for the year ended December 31, 2023.

#### **9. Subsequent Events**

Plan Management has evaluated subsequent events through October 10, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued and concluded that no additional disclosures are required.
