Note 1 - Description of Plan

The following description of the GEM Equipment of Oregon, Inc. Employees' 401(k) Salary Reduction Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of GEM Equipment of Oregon, Inc. (the Company) except employees covered by collective bargaining agreements, nonresident aliens, or Puerto Rico residents. The Plan is a safe harbor plan, which exempts the Plan from anti-discrimination requirements on the accounts of highly compensated employees while mandating that the Company make minimum contributions to all participant accounts making elective contributions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). The Board of Trustees determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to Plan management.

Eligibility

Employees may enter the Plan and make elective contributions on the first day of the month following eligibility. Employees are eligible upon reaching 18 years of age and completing six months of employment. Employees are eligible for the safe harbor match upon making elective contributions to the Plan.

Contributions

A participant may elect to contribute the lesser of 90% of eligible compensation or the maximum allowed under the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), each year instead of receiving that amount in cash. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Contributions include employee pre-tax salary deferral contributions, after-tax Roth deferral contributions, or a combination of both. The amount deferred pre-tax will not be subject to income tax until it is actually distributed to the participant. The amount deferred is, however, subject to Social Security tax at the time of deferral. The participant may change their deferral election on the beginning of each payroll period. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans (rollover). New participants will be automatically enrolled in the Plan with a 1% deferral rate after becoming eligible unless they choose to opt out.

The Company contributed a safe harbor match in 2024 to all participants in an amount equal to 100% of deferrals up to 4% of eligible compensation, which is automatically 100% vested. The Plan provides a discretionary profit sharing contribution, which is allocated to participants who are employed by the Company on the last day of the Plan year. There was no profit-sharing contribution made in 2024.

The Company had a duplicate deposit of deferral and matching contributions in 2024 for \$48,828. These funds were transferred to the forfeiture/suspense account and are being used to offset future employer contributions.

Investment Elections

The participant may choose from several combinations of investments offered by Fidelity Management Trust Company (the Trustee) as selected by the Plan Administrator. Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants may individually direct their investments. The Fidelity Flex Freedom Blend Target Date Funds (based on estimated participant retirement date) are currently the Plan designated default funds for those participants who have not selected an investment option otherwise. Employees have the opportunity to change their investments daily.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and the Company's safe harbor match as well as an allocation of the Company's discretionary profit sharing contributions and Plan earnings. Allocations are based on participant wages or account balances, as defined by the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Asset management fees are deducted from the earnings of the various funds.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance of the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with rates charged by commercial lenders for loans made under similar circumstances. The interest rates on outstanding loans at December 31, 2024 and 2023, range from 4.25% to 9.50%. Participants make monthly principal and interest payments to the Plan.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions, employer safe harbor match, and qualified nonelective contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the remainder of their account is based on years of service and occurs gradually. A participant becomes 20% vested at the end of two years of credited service, with the vested amount increasing gradually until the participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service. Participants shall become 100% vested upon attainment of early retirement age (55 years), death, or permanent disablement.

Forfeited Accounts

As of December 31, 2024, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$13,186 (\$860 at December 31, 2023). These accounts are used to reduce employer contributions and pay Plan expenses. In 2024, \$16,424 was used to offset employer contributions and forfeitures used to pay Plan expenses were \$21,201.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or termination of employment, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of his or her account or an installment as specified by the Plan. For termination of service for other reasons, or if the vested account balance does not exceed \$1,000, a participant may receive the value of their vested interest in their account as a lump-sum distribution.

Note 2 - Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Plan investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Board of Trustees determines the Plan's valuation policies using information provided by the Plan's Trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Trustee deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Custodial fees are deducted from participant accounts and when available, certain expenses are paid out of forfeitures available to the Plan. Fees related to the payment of benefits and administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 2, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - Information Certified by the Trustee

The Plan's investments are held by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the Trustee of the Plan. Investment decisions are made at the direction of the participants. The investments are credited for earnings thereon and charged for withdrawals and expenses charged by the Trustee. The Plan Administrator has obtained a certification from the Trustee as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, that the following information provided to the Plan Administrator by the Trustee is complete and accurate:

- Noninterest-bearing cash
- Investments, at fair value
- Notes receivable from participants
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments
- Interest and dividends
- Interest on notes receivable from participants

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements

Fair value is the price that would be received from selling an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. When determining the fair value measurements for assets and liabilities required to be recorded at fair value, the Plan considers the principal or most advantageous market in which it would transact and considers assumptions that market participants would use when pricing the asset or liability, such as inherent risk, transfer restrictions, and risk of nonperformance.

The Plan follows a fair value hierarchy to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. A financial instrument's categorization within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Three levels of input may be used to measure fair value:

Level 1 - quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.

Level 2 - inputs other than Level 1 that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices in active markets for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities.

Level 3 - unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

Interest Bearing Cash and Equivalents: Includes a money market account. Valued at the closing balance, plus accrued interest.

Registered Investment Companies (Mutual Funds): Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. Mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts: Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5 - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

Note 6 - Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined by an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan With CODA sponsored by FMR, LLC, which has been adopted by the Plan, is acceptable pursuant to section 401 of the IRC and in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan has not requested its own determination letter from the IRS. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 7 - Party in Interest Transactions

Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity) provides custodian services to the Plan. Aldrich CPA's + Advisors, LLP provides auditing services and Prime Pensions Northwest, LLC provides accounting services to the Plan. Transactions with these entities qualify as party-in-interest transactions and are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules under ERISA. For the year ended December 31, 2024, fees paid by the Plan to these entities were \$91,311.

Note 8 - Delinquent Employee Deferral Transmittals

During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan Sponsor failed to transmit to the Plan participant contributions within the time period described in 29 CFR 2510.3-102.

Delinquent contributions for the year ended December 31, 2022, were \$23,506. Those contributions were remitted in 2022 and the remaining lost earnings were remitted in 2025.

Delinquent contributions for the year ended December 31, 2023, were \$28. Those contributions and the related lost earnings were remitted in 2024.

Delinquent contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024, were \$1,317. Those contributions and the related lost earnings were remitted in 2025.
