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## **INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT**

**To the Trustees of the Peckar & Abramson, P.C. Profit Sharing 401(k) Plan:**

### ***Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit***

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Peckar & Abramson, P.C. **NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

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**NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of Peckar & Abramson, P.C. Profit Sharing 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General**

The Plan, established January 1, 1998, is a defined contribution plan formed under Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 401(k) and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). The Plan covers substantially all employees excluding associate attorneys and other employees as defined in the Plan document, of Peckar & Abramson, P.C. (the “Employer” or “Company”). The Plan’s Trustees and Designated Plan Administrators determine the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings, monitor investment performance and are responsible for oversight of the Plan.

**Eligibility to Participate**

Each covered employee is eligible to become an active participant in the Plan provided the individual has completed three months of service. Upon satisfying this requirement, each employee shall become a participant in the Plan.

**Employee Contributions**

Individual participants may elect to defer pretax and post-tax Roth elective contributions subject to statutory Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limits. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). The Plan allows rollovers of loan balances from other qualified retirement plans.

**Employer Contributions**

The Plan provides for a discretionary profit sharing contribution which is determined by the Employer. Employees become eligible for discretionary profit sharing contributions on the first day of the first month and seventh month of the Plan year following the completion of one year of service. In addition, the participant must be employed on the last day of such plan year and must have completed at least 1,000 hours of service during the plan year.

**Employer Contributions (Continued)**

The Plan also provides for qualified non-elective safe harbor contributions to all non-highly compensated employees, as defined in the Plan document, who are eligible to make elective deferrals during the plan year. All eligible employees who have completed one year of service and have earned 1,000 hours of service within a twelve month period will receive the safe harbor contribution. Participants are eligible to receive safe harbor contributions on the first day of the first month and seventh month of the Plan year coincident with or next following the date the participant becomes eligible. The non-elective safe harbor employer contribution will be made in an amount no less than 3% of a participant's compensation in the Plan year. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") limitations.

The Employer contributed \$862,395 for the year ended December 31, 2024 as employer profit sharing and qualified non-elective safe harbor contributions. The Employer may also make a discretionary employer matching contribution and additional qualified non-elective contributions of which there was none in 2024.

Participants direct the investment of all contributions credited to their accounts into various investment options offered by the Plan.

**Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Employer's profit-sharing contributions and qualified non-elective safe harbor contributions as well as allocation of plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Vesting**

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions, including qualified non-elective safe harbor contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's profit sharing contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after three years of credited service. If a participant retires, becomes disabled, or in the event of death, the participant becomes fully vested.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms may not exceed five years unless the loan is for the purpose of acquiring a principal residence in which case the term of the loan may not exceed thirty years. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime rate plus 1%. Loans outstanding during the year had interest rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through bi-weekly payroll deductions or directly from the borrower and credited to the borrower's account balance.

**Payment of Benefits**

Upon termination of service due to disability, retirement and reasons other than death, the participants' vested account will be distributed in one lump sum payment. If participant dies before distribution of his account begins, distribution of the entire account must be completed by December 31 of the calendar year containing the fifth anniversary of participant's death unless an election is made by the beneficiary to receive distributions in accordance with the plan document. A retired participant can elect to defer the receipt of the distribution until April 1 of the calendar year following the Participant attaining age 73. Participants can elect to have their benefits which total in excess of \$5,000 distributed in one lump sum payment or installment payments. Benefits greater than \$1,000 but not greater than \$5,000 (not greater than \$7,000 effective April 1, 2024), as elected by the participant, are payable either in one lump sum or by a direct rollover. If the participant does not elect then the Plan administrator shall pay the distribution in a direct rollover to an individual retirement plan designated by the Plan administrator. Under certain circumstances (hardship), and with approval of the Employer, a participant can elect at any time to receive a portion of his or her vested account balance subject to the provisions of the Plan. In-service withdrawals are permitted once a participant has attained age 59½.

**Forfeited Accounts**

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$18,279 and \$18,015, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions, reallocate as employer contributions or pay reasonable Plan expenses.

**Plan Transfers**

Participant account balances may be transferred to and from the Peckar & Abramson, P.C. Associates Plan. Transfers occur as participants change positions within the Company.

**NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting**

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Designated Plan Administrators determine the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the third-party administrator, investment advisor, custodian and other service providers. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)**

**Contributions**

Contributions from Plan participants are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent notes receivable from participant are recorded as distributions to participants based upon the terms of the plan document.

**Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Expenses**

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments.

**NOTE 3 - CERTIFIED INVESTMENT INFORMATION**

Certain information in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule related to investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Empower Trust Company, LLC (“Empower”), a qualified institution.

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**NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (UNAUDITED)**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The Plan also utilizes a practical expedient to estimate the fair value of investments that have calculated net asset value (“NAV”) per share. Accordingly, the Plan estimates the fair value of an investment using the NAV of the investment (or its equivalent) without further adjustment unless the Plan determines that the NAV is deemed to be not reflective of fair value.

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the framework are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

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**NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (UNAUDITED) (CONTINUED)**

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. In evaluating the level at which the Plan's investments have been classified, the Plan has assessed factors including, but not limited to price transparency, the ability to redeem at NAV at the year-end and the existence or absence of certain restrictions at year-end.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There has been no change in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

***Mutual funds:*** Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

***Common collective trust and collective investment funds:*** Valued based on the NAV of the collective trusts'/investment fund's underlying investments. The common collective trust and collective investment funds include an investment in MetLife Series 25053 Stable Value Fund issued by Reliance Trust Company and Great Gray Trust Company IndexSelect funds. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. There are no unfunded commitments. Generally, there are no restrictions on a participant's ability to redeem their investment in the common collective trust or collective investment funds. However, withdrawals prompted by certain events may restrict a participant's ability to redeem the investment. The plan administrator does not believe that the occurrence of any such event is probable.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**NOTE 5 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

The Plan pays affiliates of the custodian, certain recordkeeping and investment management fees, which amounted to approximately \$26,600 for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan also pays for recordkeeping services to a third-party service provider and subservice provider based on a formula, as defined in the service agreements. The third-party service provider receives fees from certain underlying common collective trusts and collective investment funds.

Fees paid by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

**NOTE 6 - PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed an intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, or partial termination of the Plan, participants' accounts shall be fully vested as of the date of such termination. The Company determines the date and manner in which participants' accounts will be distributed in accordance with ERISA.

**NOTE 7 - TAX STATUS**

The Company has adopted a pre-approved plan document that has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") dated June 30, 2020, stating that the form of the pre-approved plan document was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the "IRC"). Although the Plan has been amended since adopting the pre-approved plan document, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require adjustment to or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

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**NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near-term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE 9 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 14, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
