Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the Financial Statements

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Lone Star Industries, Inc. Union Retirees' Supplemental Benefits Plan (Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion on the Financial Statements

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section

As discussed in Note 11, the 2023 financial statements have been restated to correct a misstatement. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Lone Star Industries, Inc. Union Retirees' Supplemental Benefits Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Lone Star Industries, Inc. Union Retirees' Supplemental Benefits Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a contributory, defined benefit health and welfare plan established on April 11, 1994, as a result of the settlement agreement (the Agreement) between Lone Star Industries, Inc. and certain subsidiaries (the Company) and various unions (as defined in the Agreement) (the Unions) dated March 11, 1994. Pursuant to the Agreement, the Plan was established to provide monthly retirement benefits to eligible Company union retirees and their eligible dependents. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Contributions

In 1994, the Unions received a general unsecured claim in the Company's bankruptcy proceedings in the amount of \$10,750,000. The claim was subsequently settled for proceeds of \$10,857,500, which was contributed to the Plan. The Company is not obligated to make additional contributions to the Plan. However, while the Plan document does not require retirees to make any contributions to the Plan, under certain Union agreements, retirees are required to make contributions to help subsidize their post-retirement benefits. Contributions are made to the Company and are used to reduce the cost of benefits.

Benefits

The Company is obligated under certain collective bargaining agreements to provide certain benefits to Company eligible union retirees, and their eligible dependents, which retired and were covered under certain premium reimbursement programs prior to December 10, 1990. Eligible retirees receive monthly premium and healthcare expense reimbursements from the Plan, commencing at age 65.

In connection with the actuarial and financial analysis of the Plan in 2006, it was noted that the Plan authorized State Street Bank and Trust Company, N.A., the trustee of the Plan, to fund payment of supplemental benefits, and/or benefits that may be provided by the Company, in consultation with the Unions, pursuant to the terms of the Plan. It was agreed by all parties that the Plan would continue to fund the supplemental benefits and would fund the retiree medical benefits for those retirees covered under the plans noted in the plan document. Medical benefits and life insurance premiums paid on behalf of participants and administrative fees paid by the Company are reimbursed to the Company and are recorded as a liability in the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)

On June 13, 2013 the Company notified the Unions to expand plan benefits payable to include those retirees of the Unions who retired on or after December 10, 1990 as permitted by the terms of the Agreement.

On December 19, 2024, the Company further expanded plan benefits payable to include those retirees of the Unions who were eligible for the Pre-65 medical plan and from the Post 65 retirement reimbursement account plan. This change was effective for claims paid starting January 1, 2024.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, benefit obligations, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Investment income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Administrative Expenses

Audit fees and other fees incident to the management of the Plan are paid by the Company. Trustee fees, investment management fees, and third party claim administration fees are paid by the Plan.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution by the trustee. Benefit payments paid on behalf of participants by the Company are recorded annually.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. No events or transactions occurred subsequent to this date that would require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.

NOTE 3 CERTIFICATION OF INVESTMENT INFORMATION

State Street Bank & Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan (Trustee), has supplied the Plan administrator with a certification as to the completeness and accuracy of all investment information reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, and the supplemental schedule of reportable transactions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

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NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS (CONTINUED)

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at December 31, 2024.

Money Market Mutual Fund: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. The money market mutual fund held by the Plan is an open-end mutual fund that is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. The fund is required to publish its daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The money market mutual fund held by the Plan is deemed to be actively traded.

Common Trusts: Valued at the NAV of units of such funds held by the Plan at year-end.

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methodologies are appropriate, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 6 POSTRETIREMENT BENEFIT OBLIGATIONS

A postretirement benefit obligation has been recognized for certain retiree medical and supplemental benefits for eligible participants and their dependents. These benefit obligations represent the actuarial present value of the cost of those estimated future benefits that are attributed by the terms of the Plan to employee service rendered to the date of the financial statements. The obligations represent the amounts that are expected to be funded from existing assets of the Plan. Postretirement benefits include future benefits expected to be paid to or for currently retired or terminated employees and their beneficiaries and dependents.

The actuarial present value of the expected postretirement benefit obligation is determined by an actuary and is the amount that results from applying actuarial assumptions to historical claims-cost data to estimate future annual incurred claims costs per participant and to adjust such estimates for the time value of money (through discounts for interest) and the probability of payment (by means of decrements, such as those for death, disability, withdrawal, or retirement) between the valuation date and the expected date of payment.

For measurement purposes, a 6.00% weighted-average annual rate of increase in the average per capita cost of covered health care benefits was assumed for 2024; the rate was assumed to decrease gradually to 4.50% for 2031 and to remain at that level thereafter. The methodology is consistent with that used to measure the benefit obligation at December 31, 2023.

The weighted-average health care cost trend rate assumption could have a significant effect on the amounts reported as postretirement benefit obligations. If the assumed rates increased by 1 percentage point in each year, it would increase the obligation as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, by \$814,000 and \$51,000, respectively.

The plan's estimated percentage cost of providing postretirement benefits funded by retiree contributions was 21% and 18% for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 7 PLAN TERMINATION AND BENEFIT OBLIGATIONS

Pursuant to the Agreement, the Plan provides for certain retirement benefits to eligible union retirees and their dependents until Plan assets are exhausted. The Plan will terminate when Plan assets are exhausted. The Agreement provides benefits to specified union retiree health and welfare plans that were negotiated and in place at the time the Agreement was established. Based on past investment results and benefit trends, management has projected that the Plan assets will be exhausted prior to obligations pursuant to the Agreement having ended. The Company expects to continue to pay the benefits agreed to pursuant to the Agreement after the exhaustion of Plan assets.

NOTE 8 TAX STATUS

The Voluntary Employees' Beneficiary Association (VEBA) trust funding certain benefits of the Plan received an exemption letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated November 3, 1995, stating that the trust is tax-exempt under the provisions of Section 501(c)9 of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). However, as a result of the Plan's funding policy, from time to time the trust may be subject to income taxes. No federal or state income taxes have been recorded in 2024 or 2023 for unrelated business taxable income.

NOTE 8 TAX STATUS (CONTINUED)

In addition, the Plan and the trust are required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain the tax-exempt status of the trust. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if it has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions. The Plan is currently not involved in an audit by the IRS. The statute for assessment is closed through 2021.

NOTE 9 PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Trustee of the Plan manages and holds the Plan's assets and invests interest and dividend income and cash received, and initiates benefit payments to eligible retirees and their eligible dependents; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from prohibited transaction rules.

Certain administrative functions of the Plan are performed by employees of the Company. No such employee receives compensation from the Plan.

The Company receives reimbursement from the Plan for certain medical expenses, life insurance premiums, and administrative fees paid on behalf of eligible union retirees and their eligible dependents; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 10 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and those changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

The actuarial present value of benefit obligations is report based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, health care inflation rates and participant demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term could be material to the financial statements.

NOTE 11 PRIOR PERIOD RESTATEMENT

During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan identified that contributions received by the Company from participants whose union agreements require them, were not accounted for in previous reimbursements made to the Company from the Plan. This oversight resulted in the Company being reimbursed by the Plan for benefit payments at a higher amount than what was necessary for multiple years. As such, the Plan restated the balances of the related activity to reflect reimbursement from the Company of those contributions, including related investment returns. The effect of this restatement was to increase net assets available for benefits as of January 1, 2023 by \$552,312. The effect on the Plan's previously issued 2023 financial statements is summarized as follows:

NOTE 12 NONEXEMPT TRANSACTION

As disclosed in Note 11, the Plan reimbursed the Company for benefit payments at a higher rate than what was necessary due to not reducing the benefit payments by contributions received from participants. The Plan performed a historical analysis of contributions received, including related investment returns and determined that a total of \$648,809 was due from the Company to the Plan. This is considered a nonexempt transaction and is reported in the supplemental schedule, Schedule G – Schedule of Nonexempt Transactions. As of the date of this report, the Company has reimbursed the Plan \$648,809.
