- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about YNAP 401(k) Savings Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

A. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the YNAP Corporation (the "Company") 401(k) Savings Plan ("the Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

1. General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established to provide retirement benefits to all eligible employees, as defined, of the Company. An eligible employee of the Company must be 21 or older in order to participate in the Plan. In order to receive non-elective contributions, employees must complete one year of service and be employed on the last day of the Plan Year. A year of service is defined as at least 1,000 hours of service. The effective entry date for employees who become eligible to participate is the immediate date of meeting eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The benefits under this plan are not insured by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation.

The Plan investments are administered and held in trust by the Plan's trustee, Voya Institutional Trust Company. Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company is the recordkeeper of the Plan.

In April 2021, certain provisions under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security ("CARES") Act relating to participant distributions and participant loans were enacted. The CARES Act allows for utilization of these provisions immediately but requires formal adoption of the amendment no later than the last day of the Plan year beginning on or after January 1, 2022. The Plan formally adopted the terms under the CARES Act related to participant distributions as an amendment to the Plan document in 2021.

2. Contributions

a. Each participant may contribute through payroll deferral up to 100% of pre-tax annual earnings, subject to the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") Rules and Regulations.

b. The Company has elected to make a safe harbor traditional basic matching contribution to the accounts of each eligible participant. The Company will contribute an amount equal to the sum of 100% of the participant's elective deferrals that do not exceed 3% of the participant's compensation plus 50% of the amount of the participant's elective deferrals that do not exceed 5% of the participant's compensation. The Company may also make a discretionary non-elective contribution in the same ratio as each participant's compensation bears to the total of all participants' compensation.

c. The Company may also make a discretionary nonelective profit sharing contribution to the Plan that will be allocated based on compensation to all eligible employees on an annual basis. In order to share in the profit sharing contribution for year an employee would need to have completed at least 1,000 hours of service during the plan year and be employed as of the last day of the plan year.

2. Contributions (cont.)

d. A participant or an employee, who has not satisfied the age or service eligibility requirements, may transfer funds in from other qualified plans. The transferred amount shall be invested and administered as a part of the trust fund and this transfer is 100% vested as defined in the Plan document. The Plan may accept such "rollovers" provided the "rollover" will not jeopardize the tax-exempt status of the Plan or create adverse tax consequences for the Company.

e. A participant who is projected to reach age fifty (50) before the close of a taxable year will be permitted to make a catch-up contribution at any time during that Plan year. Catch-up contributions are contributions that exceed either the statutory limit as defined by the IRC Rules and Regulations, or the limit as defined by the Plan or any restrictions on contributions for certain highly paid employees. The limit on catch-up contributions for the year 2024 was \$7,500 per individual.

3. Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited with his/her contributions, the allocation of the Company's safe harbor contribution and non-elective contribution, the Plan earnings (losses), and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses during the Plan year. Each participant will have full responsibility for the investment results of his/her investment choices as offered by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Investment options include mutual funds and unallocated insurance company contracts.

4. Vesting

A participant is immediately 100% vested in his or her own deferral and rollover contributions as well as the Company's safe harbor match contributions. Also, a participant will always be automatically 100% vested in his or her Company contribution account upon the earlier of reaching retirement age (65), at death or disability, or upon termination of the Plan.

A participant vesting in the Company's discretionary nonelective profit sharing contributions is based on years of continuous service as determined under the schedule set forth below:

5. Payment of benefits

A participant may elect to receive the full amount of his or her vested amount balance in the event of normal retirement, termination of service, death or disability. Early withdrawals are permitted at the request of a participant after the age of 59-1/2. All distributions of benefits under this plan shall be made by the company holding the investments in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in the group contract. Hardship withdrawals are also permitted, as defined in the Plan document.

Benefits will be distributed by a single lump-sum payment, or any other optional form of distribution available under the Plan. Distributions shall be made as soon as reasonably practicable following a distribution request. Participant consent is required only for distributions over \$7,000, the cash-out limit.

6. Loans and withdrawals

A participant may elect to receive a loan in an amount that may not exceed the lesser of \$50,000 or one-half of the participant's vested account. No loan in an amount less than \$1,000 will be made. All loans bear a reasonable rate of interest as determined by the Plan administrator based on the prevailing interest rate charged by persons in the business of lending money. Each loan amount (principal and interest) must be completely paid within five (5) years with the exception of loans used for the purchase of a principal residence which may exceed five years if permitted by the administrator. Loan repayments and interest are deducted ratably from the participant's compensation in each payroll period.

Only two loans per participant are allowed to be outstanding at one time.

A participant may elect to withdraw from his or her account by demonstrating an immediate and heavy financial hardship and that the money can not be obtained from any other source. Immediate and heavy financial hardships are: post-secondary tuition payments for the education of the participant and immediate family members; the purchase of a principal residence; non-elective medical expenses; funeral or burial expenses; repair expense to a principal residence that would qualify as a casualty loss deduction; and payments to prevent the eviction of the participant from a principal residence.

7. Forfeiture accounts

The portion of a participant's account balance that is not vested upon termination of employment will be forfeited. Any forfeitures may be used by Employer to pay Plan expenses, or reduce amounts otherwise required to be contributed to the Plan.

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$66,839 and \$66,094, respectively, and were included in the statement of net assets available for benefits. If the forfeited credits were excluded from the investments, the total net assets available for benefits would be \$25,194,853 and \$22,251,922 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

B. SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are valued at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note C for a discussion of fair value measurement.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Investment contracts held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. See Note D for discussion of contract value measurement.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Notes receivable from participants

Loans to participants are reported at their unpaid principal balances plus accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

Administrative expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments.

Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid. However, as of December 31, 2024, \$9,675,964 of allocated balances for terminated participants was not paid because the participants did not request the withdrawal of their balances.

Date of management's review

Subsequent events were evaluated through October 10, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

C. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. The method used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The fair value measurement hierarchy established under Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820 prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels:

- Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority,
- Level 2 inputs are inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the assets or liabilities, either directly or indirectly, including quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the assets and liabilities; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means, and
- Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority.

The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 and 2 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 3 inputs were only used when Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

Mutual Funds - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

D. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACTS

At December 31, 2024, the Plan maintains an investment contract with Voya Institutional Trust Company ("Voya"), via an investment in the Voya Fixed Account. Voya maintains the contributions in a general account. This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by the participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

D. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACTS (CONT.)

The contract held by the Plan is a guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 1%. The crediting rate is reviewed on an annual basis for resetting. After five completed contract years, Voya has the right to pay out the current value of the contract to the Plan, subject to 90 days written notice to the Company.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. These events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

- Discontinuance of the contract.
- Any other non-benefit surrender.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

The contract value of the investment contracts at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$904,559 and \$881,333, respectively.

F. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its non-elective contributions, if any, at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.

G. TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020 that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

G. TAX STATUS (CONT.)

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

H. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan issues loans to participants that are secured by participants' account balances. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, however, they are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules under ERISA.

The Plan engages Voya Institutional Trust Company ("Voya") as the Plan's Trustee and accordingly invests in funds managed by them. Transactions in such investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions, however, they are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules under ERISA.

The Plan invested in a Guaranteed Investment Contract managed by Voya, the Plan's Trustee, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

The Plan engages Voya as the recordkeeper of the Plan.

The Company pays for most of the expenses incurred in the administration of the Plan. Certain fees, to the extent not paid by the Company, are paid by the Plan. These transactions are not deemed prohibited party-in-interest transactions because they are covered by statutory and administrative exemptions from the IRC and ERISA rules on prohibited transactions.

I. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
