Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Terra Millennium Corporation 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statement of changes in assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 6 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Basis for Opinion

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit* section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements, as a whole, are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Notes to Financial Statements

1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Terra Millennium Corporation 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document and summary plan description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution savings plan covering all eligible employees of Terra Millennium Corporation and its subsidiaries (the Plan Sponsor, Company, or Employer) as defined in the Plan document. Effective November 1, 2017, hourly and non-hourly employees age 18 and older may enroll in the Plan starting on the first day of the next month after six months of service during which 1,000 hours of service was rendered. Effective April 30, 2024, employees working under a qualified prevailing wage contract will be eligible for nonelective contributions immediately at the amounts stated in the contract. The Plan does not cover leased employees, reclassified employees, certain non-resident aliens, and those employees governed by a collective bargaining agreement. The Plan became effective November 1, 1997 and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

Contributions

Contributions to the Plan include: (i) salary reduction contributions authorized by participants, (ii) matching contributions made by the Company, (iii) nonelective discretionary contributions made by the Company; and (iv) participant rollovers from other plans.

Participants may contribute up to 100% of their pre-tax or post-tax compensation as defined by the Plan, subject to the limitations of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants who attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year were eligible to make catch-up contributions. Under the provisions of the Plan effective November 1, 2017, the Company makes a safe harbor matching contribution equal to 100% of participants' elective deferrals but not exceeding 4% of the participant's compensation. The Company may also make a nonelective discretionary contribution. The Company did not make any nonelective discretionary contributions during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participants may also contribute to the Plan amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans.

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each participant of the Plan. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, and an allocation of Company contributions and Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant compensation or account balances, as defined. Participants may direct the investment of their account balance into various investment options offered by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, the safe harbor matching contributions, nonelective contributions made under prevailing wage contracts, and actual earnings thereon. Participants become vested in the Company's nonelective discretionary contributions based on years of service and vest 100% after six (6) years of credited service according to the schedule below.

Nonelective discretionary contributions also become 100% vested when the participant reaches normal retirement age (60), when the participant incurs a disability as defined by the Plan, or upon the participant's death.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Effective November 1, 2017, a participant may borrow from his or her account up to an amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of his or her account balance, with a minimum loan amount of \$1,000. Loans are repayable over a period not to exceed five years, except for the purchase of a principal residence. Participant loans are collateralized by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with prevailing rates as determined periodically by the Plan Administrators. Interest repayments on notes receivable from participants are credited to the borrowing participant's account. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. The interest rate on outstanding notes receivable from participants as of December 31, 2024 ranged from 4.25% to 9.50%, and maturities ranged through 2039.

Administrative Expenses

Expenses related to administrative, investment advisory services, and management fees are paid by the Plan. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$171,644 of administrative expenses were paid by the Plan. Expenses related to maintenance of participant accounts and Plan administration are paid by the Company.

Payment of Benefits

Distributions and withdrawals are payable upon retirement, termination, disability, or death. If a participant's account balance is equal to or less than \$5,000, the balance is distributed as soon as administratively feasible in a lump-sum cash payment. Balances between \$1,000 and \$5,000 must be rolled over to an individual retirement plan designated by the administrator if the participant has not requested a distribution. If the account balance is over \$5,000, the participant can consent to either a distribution paid in the form of a lump-sum cash payment, a direct rollover into another qualified plan, installments over a period not longer than life expectancy, or postpone payment to a later date and remain in the Plan as described in the Plan document.

Participants are also eligible to make hardship withdrawals from their deferred contributions in the event of certain financial hardships.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures of non-vested participant account balances may be used to pay Plan administrative expenses or reduce future Employer contributions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested account balances totaled \$50,038 and \$35,545, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$2,905 was used to reduce employer contributions and \$49 was used to pay administrative fees. During the year ended December 31, 2024, amounts forfeited by participants totaled \$15,709, and investment gains were \$1,738.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants become 100% vested in their accounts.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared using the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with US GAAP requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for investments in securities that are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, currency exchange rate, credit, and the overall fluctuation in the market. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of assets available for benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are stated at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Investments in mutual funds are stated at fair value based upon quoted market prices. Investments in units of collective investment trusts are valued based on net asset value (NAV) as a practical expedient, which is based on the aggregate NAV of the account in relation to the total number of units outstanding. The fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract is recorded at contract value, which is calculated as contributions plus earnings, less participants withdrawals and administrative expenses, minus early withdrawal charges, which are contractually defined.

Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments includes realized and unrealized gains or losses on investments and is recognized in income currently. Amounts invested may earn interest and dividends, which in turn are reinvested. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Notes Receivable

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Defaulted notes receivable are recorded as distributions when the participant has a distributable event.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid by the Plan.

Reclassification

Certain amounts in the 2023 financial statements have been reclassified to conform with the current year presentation.

Subsequent Events

The Plan Administrators have evaluated events occurring subsequent to year-end through October 14, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Fair Value Measurements

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Financial Accounting Standards Board established a framework for measuring fair value in the form of a fair value hierarchy, which prioritizes inputs into valuation techniques used to measure fair value into three broad levels. This hierarchy requires assets to be classified by level in their entirety based upon the lowest level of input that was significant to the fair value measurement. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are as follows:

Level 1: Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.

Level 2: Observable inputs other than Level 1, including quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in less active markets or other observable inputs that can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3: Unobservable inputs supported by little or no market data for financial instruments whose value is determined using pricing models, discounted cash flow methodologies, or similar techniques, as well as instruments for which the determination of fair value requires significant management judgment or estimation.

4. Fully Benefit-Responsive Guaranteed Investment Contract

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract (GIC) with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (Empower). Empower maintains the contributions in a general account, which is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Accordingly, the GIC is considered a traditional investment contract.

Empower is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 0 percent. The contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date. Since the GIC is fully benefit-responsive, it is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA (5) premature termination of the contract. Management has concluded that no events are probable of occurring that would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

5. Federal Income Tax Status

The Plan is designed to constitute a qualified plan under Section 401(a) and Section 401(k) of the IRC and is, therefore, considered to be exempt from federal income taxes. The Plan has obtained a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated November 14, 2022, stating that the Plan is qualified under the appropriate sections of the IRC. The Plan Sponsor believes that the Plan continues to operate in accordance with the requirements to qualify for tax-exempt status. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

US GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by tax authorities. The Plan's management analyzed the tax positions of the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements.

The Plan is subject to routine audits in tax jurisdictions for tax years for which the applicable statutes of limitations have not expired; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

6. Information Certified by the Trustees

The Plan Administrators have elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under that election, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the following information certified by MassMutual, an affiliate of Empower Retirement, LLC and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and the Empower Trust Company, LLC, the trustees of the Plan, except for comparing such information certified by the trustees to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule:

- All investment assets held by the Plan
- Notes receivable from participants
- The recording of transactions related to all investment assets and notes receivable from participants, including related earnings (losses) and interest and dividends.

7. Exempt Party-In-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and the Empower Trust Company, LLC, the trustees of the Plan. These transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. The notes receivable from participants are also exempt party-in-interest transactions.
