- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Legend Pictures, LLC 401(k)

Retirement Savings Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Legend Pictures, LLC 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of Legend Pictures, LLC 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Legend Pictures, LLC 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note A - Description of the Plan

The following description of the Thomas J. Henry Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan was established effective January 1, 2018, as a defined contribution plan for the benefit of eligible employees of Thomas J. Henry Law Firm (the “Company”). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Administration

Transamerica Life Insurance Company acts as the plan’s custodian and Nova 401(k) Associates have been appointed third party-administrator (“TPA”).

Eligibility

Employees of the Company are generally eligible to participate in the Plan immediately. The entry date to the Plan for eligible participants is the first day of the plan year or the 7th month of the plan year. There is not an age requirement.

The plan excludes from participation collectively bargained employees, and non-resident aliens.

Contributions

Each year participants may contribute a percentage of their pre-tax annual compensation not to exceed the limitation (\$23,000 and \$22,500 in 2024 and 2023 respectively) set forth in Section 402(g) of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Participants may make after-tax Roth contributions. Participants who are (or will be) age 50 by the end of the calendar year may make pre-tax catch-up contributions that exceed the annual elective deferral limit. Participants’ total catch-up contributions during 2024 and 2023 cannot exceed \$7,500 and \$7,500, respectively.

The Company is required to make a qualified matching contribution to the Plan. The safe harbor matching contribution is a 100% (dollar-for-dollar) matching contribution on salary deferrals up to 4% of compensation. During 2024, the company made \$1,786,974 in safe harbor matching contributions.

The Company may contribute a discretionary matching contribution. During 2024 the Company made no discretionary matching contributions. The Plan also provides for discretionary Company profit sharing contributions. During 2024 the Company made no discretionary employer profit sharing contributions.

Note A - Description of the Plan, continued

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's matching contribution and an allocation of any non-elective contribution and earnings (losses) on the investments selected by the participant. Allocations are based on participant compensation or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested interest in his or her account.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants may direct the investment of their contributions and the Company's contributions into various investments offered by the Plan.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their elective contributions, safe harbor contributions and rollover contributions plus any earnings on such contributions. The vesting of discretionary Company contributions plus any earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service (as defined) accrued by the participant while in covered employment. Participants become 100% vested in discretionary Company contributions on a five-year graded vesting schedule.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts on a pro-rata basis from all contribution sources up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance. Loan terms must not exceed five (5) years unless the loan is to be used in the financing of the participant's homestead in which case the loan may be payable in terms of similar length provided by conventional lending institutions.

The loans are secured by the vested balance in the Participant's account and bear an interest rate of prime plus one percent. Principal and interest payments are made by means of payroll withholdings according to the terms of the promissory note and the Plan document. The interest rates on outstanding notes receivable from participants are 9.75% to 10.50% as of December 31, 2024. A participant may have only one loan outstanding at any time.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of employment due to death, disability, attainment of age 59 ½ or retirement, a participant (or his/her designated beneficiary in the event of death) may elect to receive a lump-sum amount. For termination of employment due to other reasons, the vested interest in his or her account may be distributed as rollover to another plan, a lump-sum distribution or it may be left in the Plan if the account balance is greater than \$5,000.

Note A - Description of the Plan, continued

Forfeited Accounts

All employer contributions credited to a participant's account, but not vested, are forfeited by the participant upon his/her termination from the Plan. Per the Plan document forfeitures may be used to first reduce the Company's contributions and then to offset future employer contributions. In addition, forfeitures may also be used to pay plan expenses. Forfeitures available on December 31, 2024, were \$2,006.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses incurred in the administration of the Plan are paid directly by the Company. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the plan paid fees of \$131,239.

Note B - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of net assets available for the benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risk and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options. These investment options are exposed to market risk, which generally means the risk of loss in value to certain investment securities due to changes in interest rates, commodity prices and general market conditions. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits and the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments in pooled separate accounts are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note D for discussion of fair value measurements. Investments in fully-benefit responsive investment contracts are reported at contract value as discussed in Note C. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are

Note B - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies, continued

recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 8, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued. No events have occurred subsequent after the date of the statement of net assets available for benefits that would require adjustment to, or disclosure in, the financial statements.

Contributions

Contributions from employees and the Company are recorded in the period in which the Company makes the payroll deductions from participant accounts.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Note C - Guaranteed Investment Contract with Reliance Trust Company

On December 31, 2024, the Plan had a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract, in the amount of \$473,136, with Reliance Trust Company.

The Stable Value Option investment choice is a non-tradable obligation of Transamerica. The investment's contract or proceeds cannot nor will not be assigned or sold to another party without the consent of Transamerica. The repayment of principal and interest credited to participants holding the investment is a financial obligation of Transamerica. However, if an event should ever occur such that realization of full contract value for a particular investment contract is no longer probable— for example, a significant decline in creditworthiness of Transamerica, the Stable Value Option investment choice may no longer be considered fully benefit-responsive. The terms of Transamerica's Group Annuity Contract require all permitted participant-initiated transactions involving the investment to occur at contract value with no conditions, limits or restrictions. Permitted participant-initiated transactions are those allowed by the underlying defined contribution plan such as withdrawals for benefits, loans or transfers to other investment choices within the plan. Since the Stable Value Option investment choice is an obligation of Transamerica, the occurrence of an event that limits the ability of the investment to transact at contract value between Transamerica and a participant holding the investment is not probable. The Stable Value Option investment choice allows a participant reasonable access to their assets.

Prior to January 1st and July 1st, the effective annual rate of interest is established for the corresponding six-month period. Interest is credited, based upon the daily balance, at a rate that is the daily equivalent of the effective annual rate of interest applicable for the six-month period. There is no stated minimum or maximum interest rate for the Stable Value Option investment choices. The Transamerica Stable Value Option investment choices are backed by the general account of TLIC or TFLIC. While TLIC or TFLIC declare rates periodically and back the principal and interest of these investment choices, any guarantees are subject to the claims paying ability of the insurance company.

Note C - Guaranteed Investment Contract with Reliance Trust Company, continued

This investment choice is not guaranteed by the FDIC or any other government agency. Although plan participants generally may withdraw assets from the Stable Value Option investment choice without restrictions, TLIC or TFLIC may impose a hold period at the contract level in the event of a full contract discontinuance or partial contract discontinuance. These investment choices seek to protect against any loss of principal while providing returns in excess of money market funds and one-year U. S. Treasury bills. The investment choices have a portfolio investment rate design in which all deposits in the particular investment choice are credited with the same interest rate on a daily basis, and with no set maturity. The effective guaranteed credited interest rate is set on a semi-annual basis and announced at least 45 days in advance of the date the new rate becomes effective. The guaranteed rate of interest shall not change during the six-month period for which it is effective. The declared monthly and semi-annual Interest rates for at least the last completed plan year and prior plan year are provided for the Stable Value Option investment choice held under the Group Annuity Contract. In addition, the Average, Lowest and Closing Interest Rates are provided in the Stable Value Rates Report. This report is accessible online with an audit package under the header Asset Reporting.

Note D - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below.

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the best level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following are descriptions of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used on December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the plan at the end of the year.

Transamerica Life Insurance Company also certified to the completeness and accuracy (including gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year) of \$1,733,962 of net appreciation in the fair value of investments for the year ended December 31, 2024, \$12,470 in other income \$309,306 in dividends, \$234,250 in capital gains, and \$29,899 in participant loan interest.

Note F – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, Participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note G – Tax Status

The IRS has determined and informed the Company’s document provider by an opinion letter dated March 31, 2014, that the Volume Submitter Profit Sharing Plan with CODA is acceptable under section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code for use by employers for the benefit of their employees. Although the Plan has not received a determination letter and has been amended since the date of the opinion letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been made in the financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note H– Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan invests in participant loans. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. However, such transactions are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

Certain Plan investments are funds managed by the trustee and the custodian as defined by the Plan, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services and certain administrative fees related to the administration of the Plan were paid by the Plan or by the Company. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Note I – Benefit Claims Payable

On December 31, 2024, there were no benefit claims payable for distributions requests made prior to year-end.

Note J – Recent Accounting Pronouncements

Recent accounting pronouncements issued by the FASB did not or are not believed by management to have a material impact on the Plan’s present or future financial statements.
