**NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of Dentons Sirote PC Profit Sharing 401(k) Plan (the Plan), as amended, provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan adopted April 1, 1981 and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. During 2021, Sirote & Permutt P.C. combined with Dentons P.C., a national law firm, becoming Dentons Sirote P.C. (the Company). The Plan covers all full-time employees of Dentons Sirote P.C. The Company is the Sponsor and Plan Administrator of the Plan. Matrix Trust Company is the non-discretionary trustee and custodian of the Trust's assets. The custodians of the self-directed brokerage accounts are various national investment brokers.

**Plan Amendment**

Effective January 1, 2022, the Plan was amended and restated to incorporate the Plan name change to Dentons Sirote P.C. Profit Sharing 401(k) Plan and to formalize amendments made in previous years that were adopted to comply with regulations arising from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act. The restatement did not result in any changes to beginning net assets and there were no significant changes in the terms of the Plan from the previous year. There were no amendments during 2024.

**Eligibility**

Employees who are not specifically excluded and have completed at least one year of service as defined by the Plan are eligible for participation in the Plan.

**Contributions**

Each year, participants may contribute a percentage of pretax annual compensation, as defined by the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined contribution plans. The Company contributes a minimum amount of three percent of each employee's compensation defined as a non-elective safe harbor contribution. An additional discretionary employer amount may be contributed at the option of the Company's board of directors in the form of a profit-sharing contribution. Contributions are subject to certain regulatory limitations. Remittance of participant contributions coincides with the Company's payroll dates. The Company's contributions are funded within the first quarter of the following year.

**Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocation of (a) the Company's contribution(s), (b) Plan earnings and (c) administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

**Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in their salary deferral and the Company's safe harbor contributions plus actual earnings thereon. For discretionary employer contributions, participants are subject to a vesting schedule based on years of continuous service and are fully vested after six years.

**Forfeitures**

Terminated employees, whose account balances are not fully vested, forfeit their non-vested portion. These forfeited amounts are used to reduce the employer's contributions, if any, to the plan during the year. Forfeited non-vested accounts used to offset employer contributions were \$9,418 and \$7,684 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Unallocated forfeitures were \$0 at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Payment of Benefits**

On termination of employment for any reason, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of his or her account, or annual installments for a period not to exceed fifteen years. Additionally, participants may take an in-service distribution upon reaching 59½. Generally, certain minimum distributions are required for participants who have separated from service and have reached age 73.

**Administrative Costs**

Investment and advisory fees paid and fees paid to national broker-dealers for the maintenance and custody of Plan assets are paid from the assets of the Plan. The Company pays other costs on behalf of the Plan, including administrative and audit costs.

**Investment Options**

Participants in the plan can elect from among 16 different investment options. Plan participants may also direct their investments through trustee sponsored brokerage accounts. This option offers the opportunity to invest in a variety of individual stocks, bonds and mutual funds. Participants may change their investment options daily.

**NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements (and supplemental schedule) are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting which conforms to accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP). All contribution activity is reflected in participants' equity on an accrual basis.

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

The Plan values its investments in accordance with Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures* as well as subsequent guidance in Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2015-12 *Plan Accounting Defined Contribution: (Part I) Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contracts, Part (II) Plan Investment Disclosures, and Part (III) Measurement Date Expedient*. ASC 820 requires that investments held by the Plan be stated at fair value, which is defined as the price that the Plan would receive upon selling an investment in an orderly transaction to an independent buyer in the principal or most advantageous market of the investment (see Note 4 for disclosures related to fair market value measurements.) Parts I and III are not applicable to the Plan.

The Plan presents the net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of its investments which consists of the realized gains or losses and the unrealized appreciation (depreciation) on those investments in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest and dividend income is recorded when earned.

**Excess Employee Deferrals**

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. There were no excess employee deferrals at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Payment of Benefits**

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

**Administrative Expenses**

Plan administrative expenses are recognized when paid.

**Subsequent Events**

Subsequent events have been evaluated through the date of the Independent Auditor's Report, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

**NOTE 3 – INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY PLAN’S TRUSTEE**

For years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan sponsor’s annual reporting period in conformance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The trustee and custodian of the Plan, Matrix Trust Company, has certified that the investments held by the Plan’s Trust and related income from those investments are complete and accurate in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule. The totals for certified and uncertified investments and related income are as follows:

- Investments held by the Trust totaling \$86,086,750 and \$82,168,775 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively are certified as complete and accurate by qualifying institutions. Uncertified investments held in self-directed brokerage accounts totaled \$25,354,409 and \$27,163,098 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.
- Net appreciation and dividend and interest income on investments (investment income) on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024 is comprised of investment income from both the Trust and self-directed brokerage accounts. Certified trust investment income totals \$9,492,983 for 2024. Uncertified self-directed brokerage account investment income totals \$3,906,261 for 2024.
- The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) at December 31, 2024 and 2023 includes certified assets and uncertified assets totaling \$111,441,159 and \$109,331,873 respectively.

The Plan’s independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to the uncertified portion of investments and related income, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

**NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE OF ASSETS AND LIABILITIES**

In accordance with ASC 820, fair value is defined as the price that the Plan would receive upon selling an investment in an orderly transaction to an independent buyer in the principal or most advantageous market of the investment. ASC 820 established a three-tier hierarchy to maximize the use of observable market data and minimize the use of unobservable inputs, and to establish classification of fair value measurements for disclosure purposes. Inputs refer broadly to the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability, including assumptions about risk. Inputs may be observable or unobservable. Observable inputs are inputs that reflect the assumptions market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability developed based on market data obtained from sources independent of the reporting entity. Unobservable inputs are inputs that reflect the reporting entity’s own assumptions about the assumptions market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability developed based on the best information available. The three-tier hierarchy of inputs is summarized in the three broad levels listed below.

- Level 1 – quoted prices in active markets for identical investments
- Level 2 – other significant observable inputs (including quoted prices for similar investments, interest rates, prepayment speeds, credit risk, etc.)

The following is a summary of significant valuation techniques for assets and liabilities measured at fair value on a recurring basis:

**Level 1 measurements**

Mutual funds: Comprised of pools of money managed by an investment company that invest funds from many investors in stocks, bonds or other assets. Valuation is based on unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets in active markets that the Plan can access.

Self-directed brokerage accounts: Comprised of actively traded exchange listed U.S. and international equity securities, exchange traded funds and mutual funds. Valuation is based on unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets in active markets that the Plan can access

**Level 2 measurements**

Self-directed brokerage accounts: Comprised of U.S. Government treasury bonds, treasury bills and agency securities as well as corporate and municipal fixed income securities and preferred stocks.

- U.S Government securities: The primary inputs to the valuation include quoted prices for identical or similar assets in markets that are not active that the Plan can access.
- Fixed income securities:
  - Corporate bonds, including privately placed*: The primary inputs to the valuation include quoted prices for identical or similar assets in markets that are not active as well as contractual cash flows, benchmark yields and credit spreads.
  - Municipal bonds*: The primary inputs to the valuation include quoted prices for identical or similar assets in markets that are not active, contractual cash flows, benchmark yields and credit spreads.

**NOTE 5 – PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

During 2024 and 2023, certain Plan investments included shares of mutual funds managed by Matrix Trust Company, the trustee, and other national broker dealers managing the self-directed brokerage accounts. Therefore, transactions occurring during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 with these parties qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers and employees of the Company. No officer or employee received compensation from the Plan for these services.

**NOTE 6 – PLAN TERMINATION**

Although the Company has not expressed any intent to do so, it has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

**NOTE 7 – CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK**

At times, the Plan maintains cash balances at brokerage firms. These cash balances are insured by the Securities Investors Protection Corporation up to \$500,000 for each account.

**NOTE 8 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan provides for various investments that in general are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility risks. Due to the level of risks associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE 9 – TAX STATUS**

The Plan is designed to meet IRS guidelines under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The IRS has issued an opinion informing the Plan sponsor by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related Trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Since the date of the opinion letter, the Plan has been amended, but the Plan administrator and Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan, as amended, is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

**NOTE 10 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

The Plan Administrator evaluated its December 31, 2024 financial statements for subsequent events through the date the financial statements were issued.
