Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Pride Capital Partners, LLC 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

DECEMBER 31, 2024

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Pride Capital Partners, LLC 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

The Plan has been restated effective September 27, 2023. The Plan changed its trustee to Empower Trust Company, LLC (“Empower Trust”) and designated Empower Life & Annuity Insurance Company of NY (“Empower Life”) as its recordkeeper.

General and Eligibility

The Plan is a defined contribution plan, covering all employees of Pride Capital Partners, LLC (the “Plan Sponsor”), except for certain Excluded Employees, who have attained age twenty-one or older, as defined in the Plan. Employees who are members of a collective bargaining unit, non-resident aliens, reclassified employees and residents of Puerto Rico, as defined in the Plan, are Excluded Employees and are not eligible to participate in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute at least 3% and up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, up to the maximum amount then permitted by tax laws. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. The employer may make a matching contribution equal to a uniform percentage of the participants’ elective deferrals. The employer will determine the amount of the discretionary matching percentage each year. The employer may also make discretionary non-elective contributions on behalf of eligible participants. Non-elective employer contributions are based on an amount designated by the employer allocated according to the ratio of each participant’s salary to total salary of all participants eligible to receive the contribution. Discretionary employer contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024 amounted to \$865,025. Forfeitures of \$169,623 were applied to reduce employer contributions during the year.

If an eligible participant is 50 years of age or older, they may contribute additional amounts permitted by the tax laws.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and allocations of (a) the Plan sponsor’s contribution and (b) Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant’s vested account.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN - CONTINUED

Participant Accounts - Continued

Participants direct the investment of their employee contributions and share of employer contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan, which includes registered investment companies (mutual funds), common collective trusts and guaranteed interest account.

Vesting

Participants are fully vested in their employee contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in employer contributions and earnings thereon is based on years of service and is determined as follows:

<u>Years of Service</u>	<u>Vested%</u>
Less than 3	0%
3 or more	100%

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 and up to \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest rates which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Loans currently outstanding bear interest at rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. The repayment period will not be longer than five years unless the loan is used to buy a participant's principal residence. The repayment period for a loan used to buy a principal residence will not be longer than 25 years or the repayment period currently in effect for a commercial home loan. Only one loan may be outstanding at a time. Unpaid notes receivable are reclassified as deemed distributions against the participant's account based on terms of the Plan document.

Benefit Distributions

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to his or her account, or installments over a period of not more than the participant's or the beneficiary's life expectancy. Normal retirement age under the Plan is 65; early retirement age is 55. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

Other Administrative Costs

Certain other administrative functions are performed by the Plan Sponsor at no cost to the Plan. In addition, the Plan Sponsor also absorbs certain professional fees incurred coincident to the audit of the Plan's financial statements and legal matters.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$76,153 and \$315,590, respectively. These accounts will be used to pay Plan expenses and reduce any employer contributions. In 2024, the Plan Sponsor's contribution was reduced by and the Plan expenses were paid in the amount of \$169,623 and \$94, respectively, from forfeited non-vested accounts.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan Sponsor and are, therefore, excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments. Administrative expenses of the Plan are allocated to participant accounts.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. CERTIFIED INFORMATION (UNAUDITED)

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 Code of Federal Regulations 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Trust, the trustee of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all the investments reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the supplemental Schedule H, Part, IV, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024 and the related investment activity reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

4. INVESTMENTS AND FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. The Plan Sponsor determines the Plan's valuation policies. Although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to measure the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most

reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if level 1 or level 2 inputs were not available. There are no Plan assets requiring the use of level 3 inputs for the periods presented.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

The Plan's mutual funds are classified within Level 1 of the fair value hierarchy. The fair value of these investments is valued based on quoted market prices in active markets. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The Plan's common/collective investment trusts ("CITs") invest in collective trust funds as well as target-date funds. The fair value of these investments are used in determining the Net Asset Value ("NAV") of the CITs, which are not publicly quoted. Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820 allows NAV per share to serve as a practical expedient to estimate the fair value of CITs as long as certain requirements are met. It is the Plan's assessment that the CITs meet those requirements. The CITs can be redeemed at NAV as of the measurement date. Based on the Plan's assessment, the CITs meet the requirements for the NAV practical expedient.

(b) The common collective trusts are valued at their December 31, 2024 and 2023 NAV per share as provided by the investment managers. The investment strategy of the funds is to seek the preservation of capital and to provide a competitive level of income over time that is consistent with the preservation of capital.

Gains and losses (realized and unrealized) included in net increase in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024 is reported in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

5. GUARANTEED INTEREST ACCOUNT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan entered into a fully benefit-responsive investment contract, the Empower Investments Fixed Account (“EIFA”), with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (“EAICA”). EAICA maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and certain administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contract meets the criteria to be considered fully benefit responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. The guaranteed investment contract is presented on the face of the statements of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by EAICA, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. Guaranteed interest account at December 31, 2024 and 2023 amounted to \$1,636,047 and \$1,671,857, respectively.

EIFA guarantees principal and credited interest for eligible participant-initiated withdrawals and transfers. Any guarantees are subject to the terms and conditions of the contract and the claims-paying ability of the insurer.

5. GUARANTEED INTEREST ACCOUNT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY - CONTINUED

The determination of credited interest rates reflects a number of factors, including mortality and expense risks, interest rate guarantees, the investment income earned on invested assets and the amortization of any capital gains and/or losses realized on the sale of invested assets. The EIFA credits interest daily to the group contract holder on a portfolio basis. The crediting interest rate may change or stay the same quarterly. The quarterly crediting rate applies to all money deposited in the group contract holder's EIFA account regardless of when it was deposited.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (a) if the plan sponsor selects a termination option in which there is market value adjustment or the payout is at market value, (b) if the plan sponsor initiates one or more events that result in significant withdrawals from the fund or, (c) if the plan sponsor engages in activities or direct or indirect communications that encourage participants to withdraw from the fund. The plan administrator does not believe that the occurrence of any such value event, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Plan participants or the issuer, is probable.

The EIFA represents approximately 4% of the Plan's net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024, and represents an obligation from EAICA to repay as amounts come due.

6. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

7. TAX STATUS

Effective September 27, 2023, the Plan has adopted a Non-standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing/Money/Purchase/CODA (the "Empower Plan"). On November 14, 2022, the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") stated in an opinion letter that the Empower Plan sponsored by Empower Retirement, LLC and adopted by the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. The Plan has been amended since receiving the letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

7. TAX STATUS - CONTINUED

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

8. PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Parties in interest are defined under Department of Labor regulations as any fiduciary of the plan, any party rendering service to the Plan, the employer, and certain others. Certain Plan investments are managed by Empower Trust, the trustee of the Plan. Any purchases and sales of these funds are performed in the open market at fair value. Empower Life is the Plan's recordkeeper. Accordingly, these transactions, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA regulations, are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are specifically exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA. Empower Life received direct compensation from the Plan for services provided amounting to \$134,626 for the year 2024.

Certain employees of the Plan Sponsor, who may also be participants in the Plan, perform administrative services to the Plan at no cost to the Plan.

Participants who are active employees may borrow from their accounts and such loans qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA. These loans are recorded as notes receivable from participants in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

10. EXCESS CONTRIBUTIONS PAYABLE TO PARTICIPANTS

The Plan is subject to certain compliance requirements of non-discrimination rules under ERISA and IRS guidelines. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan failed the Actual Deferral Percentage/Actual Contribution Percentage tests due to excess contributions by highly compensated eligible Plan participants. The excess contributions payable to participants is reflected as a liability on the statements of net assets available for benefits. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, excess contributions payable to participants

amounted to \$3,649 and \$1,938, respectively. Excess contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024 amounted to \$1,711. The plan distributed the excess contributions on April 5, 2025. Excess contributions for the year ended December 31, 2023 amounted to \$1,938. The Plan distributed the excess contributions on February 21, 2025.
