We have performed audits of the financial statements of The Firestone Polymers Savings Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The Firestone Polymers Savings Plan (the “Plan”) is sponsored by Bridgestone Americas, Inc. (the “Company”), a wholly owned subsidiary of Bridgestone Corporation, a Japanese corporation.

The following description of the Plan is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan designed to provide eligible employees with tax-advantaged long-term savings for retirement. All employees of Firestone Polymers, LLC, a wholly owned subsidiary of the Company, who are covered by a collective bargaining agreement that incorporates the Plan and who have completed 1,000 hours of service, as defined, or six months of employment are eligible to become participants in the Plan.

The Plan is administered by the Company, and Fidelity Management Trust Company (the “Trustee” or “Fidelity”) serves as the Plan’s trustee. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (“ERISA”).

Contributions

The Plan provides for contributions by participants, through payroll deductions, and for matching contributions by the Company. Each participating employee elects to contribute to his or her participant account a percentage of eligible compensation, as defined, not less than 1% and not more than the maximum allowable under the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”), provided that the maximum allowable contributions do not exceed 50% of the participant’s eligible compensation prior to the contributions. Participants may elect to contribute to their account on a before-tax basis, on a Roth basis, or a combination of both. Participants may change their contribution percentages at any time. Rate changes are updated weekly. Rollover contributions, as they occur, represent contributions, and earnings thereon, that participants voluntarily transferred from another qualified plan.

The Company provides matching contributions equal to 100% of the first 3% of eligible compensation deferred by each participant, plus 50% of the next 2% of eligible compensation deferred. The Plan also provides for an additional Company contribution for eligible employees ranging from \$.02 to \$.18 per hour worked based on a participant’s years of service.

All participants who have elected to make contributions and have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions in accordance with, and subject to the limitations of the IRC. The catch-up contributions are not eligible for matching contributions from the Company.

Vesting

Each participant is immediately and fully vested in all participant and additional Company contributions and earnings thereon. Participants vest in matching contributions by the Company and the earnings thereon upon the first to occur of the participant’s (a) death, (b) termination of employment due to disability, (c) completion of three years of continuous service, or (d) the later of attainment of age 65 while employed or the third anniversary of participation in the Plan. If a participant’s employment with the Company is terminated for any reason other than those indicated in (a), (b), (c) or (d) above, the unvested portion of the participant’s account is forfeited on the earlier of (1) the date of distribution of the vested account balance or (2) the fifth anniversary of the termination date.

Forfeitures under the Plan are used to reduce Company contributions. There were \$19,200 of forfeitures used during the year ended December 31, 2024. Unused forfeitures as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$194 and \$7,724, respectively.

Investment Options

The investment options include registered investment companies, collective trusts, a money market fund, and a self-directed brokerage account. The Trustee maintains separate accounts for each Plan participant and invests such participant's contributions as directed by the participant, in one or more investment options offered by the Plan.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, a participant is eligible to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. The Plan also permits in-service distributions upon the attainment of age 59½ and hardship withdrawals. Hardship withdrawals are permitted up to amounts necessary to satisfy an immediate and heavy financial need. The Plan requires minimum distributions for participants upon reaching age 73. Account balances less than \$1,000 at termination will be distributed via check if a timely distribution request is not received.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is increased or decreased, as appropriate, with (a) the participant's contributions, (b) the Company's contributions, (c) investment earnings and losses based on the participant's account balance and composition, (d) distributions, (e) forfeitures, and (f) investment administration fees. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Subject to certain limitations, the Plan permits participants to borrow up to one half of the vested amount credited to a participant's account, subject to a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum of \$50,000, reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance within the past 12 months. A participant may have only one outstanding loan at any time, which may be repaid in advance without penalty. The period of repayment for a loan is one to five years, with a fixed interest rate equal to the prime rate for the last business day of the first month of the calendar quarter immediately preceding the calendar quarter in which the loan is made. Participants may borrow from the vested value of their balances invested in any of the various investment funds at their discretion. Loan repayments are invested on the same pro rata basis as the borrower has directed the investment of his or her current Plan contributions. Interest rates on outstanding notes receivable from participants ranged from 3.25% to 8.50% at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to alter, suspend or terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the rights of all participants to the amounts credited to such participants' accounts at the date of termination are non-forfeitable.

Transfer of Assets

Certain employees participate in the Plan or other affiliated Bridgestone Americas, Inc, sponsored plans. Participation in the Plan or the Bridgestone Americas, Inc. Tax-Efficient Savings Plan (the "Tax-Efficient Plan") or the Bridgestone Americas, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (the "Retirement Savings Plan") or the Bridgestone Americas, Inc. Incentive Savings Plan (the "Incentive Savings Plan") or the Bridgestone

Americas, Inc. Employee Savings Plan for Bargaining Unit Employees (the “Bargaining Plan”) is based upon the employee’s job classification. Consequently, transfers of assets between the Plans listed occur as participants change job classifications. The assets are transferred at fair value.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“US GAAP”).

Use of Estimates

The presentation of financial statements in conformity with US GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan’s investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received upon the sale of an asset, or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note C for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments in registered investment companies are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of investment return for such investments.

Administrative Expenses

Investment administration fees, recordkeeping fees, and audit fees are paid by the Plan. The Company pays certain other costs of administering the Plan, such as legal fees and other related costs. Expenses paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments are recorded upon distribution.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred and charged to the participant’s account. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

NOTE C - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Financial Accounting Standards Board (“FASB”) Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) 820 establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are identified below.

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Money Market Fund

Valued at a net asset value (“NAV”) of \$1.00 per share held by the Plan at year end, based on quoted prices in active markets.

Registered Investment Companies

Valued at the NAV of shares held by the Plan at year end, based on quoted prices in active markets.

Collective Trust Funds

Valued at the NAV of units held by the Plan at year end, as determined by the fair value of the underlying assets. Underlying assets include commingled pools of exchange traded equity, fixed income and/or short-term investments and index funds of exchange traded equity, bond and debt securities.

Stable Value Fund

Valued at the NAV of the fund which represents the Plan’s fair value. The NAV is calculated by the trustees of the fund based on fair value of the fund’s underlying assets, which includes investment contracts at contract value. This NAV represents the Plan’s fair value since this is the amount at which the Plan transacts with the fund.

Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts

Assets primarily include investments in common stocks valued at the closing price per share in active markets, and registered investment companies measured at fair value using the methodology previously discussed.

The NAV, as provided by the Trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value for the collective trust funds and the stable value fund.

The T. Rowe Price Stable Value Common Trust Fund (the "Fund") is stated at fair value, which reflects the NAV of the fund. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying securities plus the contract value of the fully benefit-responsive wrapper contracts. The NAV represents the Plan's fair value since this is the amount at which the Plan transacts with the Fund. The Fund represents a collective trust fund with underlying investments in Guaranteed Investment Contracts, Bank Investment Contracts, Synthetic Investment Contracts, and Separate Account Contracts. These investment contracts are designed to provide principal stability and a competitive yield.

Certain events can limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with the Fund, and the Fund itself may be subject to circumstances that affect its ability to transact at contract value. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value are probable of occurring.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions used to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE D - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE

The Plan administrator has elected to have the audits performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. The Plan administrator determined that the certifications received from the Trustee meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The Trustee certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule are complete and accurate:

- Investments, at fair value and notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023;
- Investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024; and
- Schedule H, line 4i - schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

NOTE E - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and market risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE F - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of a money market fund, registered investment companies and collective trusts managed by Fidelity. Fidelity is the Trustee as defined by the Plan and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions. All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE G - TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") has determined and informed the Company by letter dated March 3, 2014, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance, in all material respects, with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

US GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by the IRS; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
