NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
DECEMBER 31, 2024 and 2023

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the R.B. Jergens Contractors, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by R.B. Jergens Contractors, Inc., (the Company and Plan Sponsor) and covers substantially all eligible employees of the Plan Sponsor and its affiliated company, Journey, LTD. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Eligibility

Under the terms of the Plan, covered employees are eligible to become participants and may begin deferring immediately upon reaching age 21. Employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement are excluded from participation. Additionally, participants are eligible to share in any discretionary non-elective profit sharing contributions or qualified employer matching contributions on the first day of the month following or coincident with the completion of 6 months of service.

Contributions

- (a) *Elective deferrals.* Eligible employees who have attained age 21 may elect to make voluntary pre-tax or Roth 401(k) contributions up to the limits prescribed by the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has an automatic deferral feature (3% default rate) with an opt-out provision for all newly-eligible employees and participants without an existing affirmative election. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollover contributions). The Plan also provides for catch-up contributions for participants age 50 or older.

- (b) *Safe harbor contributions.* The Plan is designed to permit the Plan Sponsor to satisfy the nondiscrimination requirements of the Internal Revenue Code using the safe harbor provisions. As defined by the Plan, the Plan Sponsor may elect on an annual basis to provide a safe harbor nonelective contribution equal to 3% of eligible compensation to all Non-Highly Compensated Employees who satisfy the Plan's eligibility requirements. Such contributions, if made, are 100% vested when allocated. Employees who have not attained age 21 or completed six months of service are excluded from receiving safe harbor contributions. Highly Compensated Employees are also excluded unless specifically included by the Plan Sponsor, in which case such contributions may not exceed the rate provided to Non-Highly Compensated Employees. The Plan Sponsor authorized a safe harbor contribution of \$251,074 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Contributions (Continued)

- (c) *Discretionary matching contributions.* The Plan Sponsor may also make discretionary matching contributions to eligible participants. The timing and amount of any discretionary match is determined annually by the Plan Sponsor and allocated to participants who satisfy the applicable eligibility conditions. There was no additional discretionary employer matching contribution authorized for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- (d) *Profit-sharing contributions.* The Plan Sponsor may, at its discretion, make non-elective profit-sharing contributions to eligible participants. The amount, if any, is determined annually and allocated to participants who satisfy the Plan's service requirements. The Plan Sponsor authorized a profit sharing contribution of \$674,385 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited or charged with the above contributions, rollover contributions, Plan earnings thereon, and an allocation of Plan expenses.

Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Investment Options

Participants direct the investment of all contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers mutual funds, collective funds, exchange traded funds, and a money market account as investment options for participants.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Only one loan may be outstanding at a time and refinancing is not permitted. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime rate plus 2.0%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Vesting

Participant vesting is based on service years. A year of service is defined as at least 1,000 hours worked (or equivalent as defined by the Plan). Participant's contributions and safe harbor contributions plus actual earnings are 100% vested immediately. Participants also become fully vested upon death, total and permanent disability, early retirement date (age 60), or termination of the Plan.

The discretionary employer matching contributions vest according to the following schedule:

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$2,039 and \$8,556, respectively. These accounts are used to reduce future employer contributions. In 2024, forfeitures of \$12,283 were used to offset 2023 plan year employer contributions.

Payment of Benefits

Participants become eligible for benefit payments upon retirement, termination of employment, disability or death. Additionally, the Plan provides for in-service distributions after a participant has reached normal retirement age (65) up to their fully vested account balance. Participants may also receive distributions for qualified financial hardships. Distributions may be made as a single lump-sum payment. The Plan allows for automatic payment of a participant's vested balance upon termination, provided that the vested balance is less than \$5,000 (excluding rollovers).

Amendments

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan was amended and restated to provide immediate eligibility at age 21 for all contributions, to require a mandatory 3% safe harbor nonelective contribution, and to modify the vesting schedule for discretionary employer matching contributions. The restatement also clarifies provisions related to participant loans, involuntary cash-outs, and the use of forfeitures. These changes do not affect the accompanying 2024 financial statements.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The Plan prepares its financial statements using the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note D for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Capital gain distributions are included in interest and dividends. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan payments and the Plan Administrator deemed the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses of the Plan

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of the Plan are allocated to the participants' accounts and are included in administrative expenses. Certain withdrawal expenses are paid for by the affected participant. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments.

NOTE C - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S CUSTODIAN

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in the fair value of investments and interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Matrix Trust Company (the Custodian of the Plan).

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NOTE D - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

FASB ASC 820-10, Fair Value Measurements, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820-10 are described below.

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets, inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level with the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds/Exchange Traded Funds: Valued at the daily closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

Common/Collective trust fund: Valued based on the Net Asset Value (NAV) of units of the collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the Custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based upon the fair value of the underlying investments comprising the trust less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE E - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain administrative services are provided by the Plan Sponsor at no cost to the Plan, and certain administrative costs incurred by the Plan are paid by the Plan Sponsor.

The Plan's administrative expenses result from services rendered by parties-in-interest.

Certain Plan investments are held in an interest-bearing cash account managed by Matrix Trust Company. Matrix Trust Company is the Plan's Custodian; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE F - INCOME TAX STATUS

The Company has adopted the Ascensus LLC Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing/Money Purchase/CODA Plan which has obtained an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stated that the restated prototype Plan Document was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has been amended and restated since receiving the determination letter; however, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in accordance with the IRC. Therefore, no income taxes have been provided for in the financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the Plan Administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE G - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination of the Plan, participants will become one hundred percent (100%) vested in their accounts.

NOTE H - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE I - OPERATIONAL DEFECT

Subsequent to December 31, 2024, it was discovered that certain provisions of the Plan Document were not properly applied in the daily operation of the Plan. The definition of compensation for participant and employer contributions, as per the Plan Document, was not properly applied when calculating contribution amounts. Plan Management is in the process of determining the impact on participant account balances and will take corrective action if needed. Based on management's evaluation, the potential impact on participant accounts and the accompanying financial statements is not expected to be material to the December 31, 2024 financial statements.

NOTE J - RECONCILIATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS TO FORM 5500

Due to differences in the methods used in the preparation of the 2023 Form 5500 and the financial statements, there are variances between amounts reported in the two documents. These differences relate to the basis of accounting used for participant and employer contributions. The 2023 Form 5500 is prepared on a cash basis, and the financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis for participant and employer contributions.
