Opinion

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following brief description of the Inline Electric Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for complete information.

General

Inline Electric Supply Co., Inc. (the Company) established the Plan as of December 20, 2012, with an effective date of January 1, 2012. The Plan operates as a leveraged employee stock ownership plan and is designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (IRC), as amended. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Company has authority to control and manage the operation and administration of the Plan and has all powers necessary to enable it to carry out its duties. The Company is responsible for oversight of the Plan. ESOP Partners is the Plan's Trustee. The Plan was amended and restated in July 2022.

Eligibility

Employees of the Company are generally eligible to participate in the Plan after one year of service, provided they are employed as of the end of the Plan year and worked at least 1,000 hours during the Plan year. Participants who do not have at least 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year are generally not eligible for an allocation of Company contributions for that year. Eligibility for the safe harbor employer contribution is based on required participation in the Company's 401(k) plan.

Contributions

The Company makes annual contributions to the Plan for the benefit of eligible employees. The amount of the contribution is determined solely by the Company. The Company is obligated to make contributions in cash to the Plan, which, when aggregated with the Plan's dividends and interest earnings, equal the amount necessary to enable the Plan to make its regularly scheduled payments of principal and interest due on its term loan. The Company, at its discretion, may also make a safe harbor employer contribution to all eligible participants. The amount of the safe harbor contribution to the Plan is equal to the amount of the employer match contribution in the Company's 401(k) plan for the respective participant. Employee contributions are not permitted.

Payment of Benefits

Distributions on account of death, disability or retirement are made either in a lump-sum amount or in installments over a certain period in the Plan year following the event. The method of payment will be at the sole discretion of the Plan administrator and may be made in either cash or as a stock distribution.

During 2024, the Company redeemed 22,192.6665 shares of Company common stock.

Administrative Expenses

As provided in the Plan agreement, administrative expenses may be paid either by the Plan or by the Company. The Company has historically paid the operating expenses for the Plan.

Participant Accounts

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant's account is credited as of the last day of each Plan year with an allocation of shares of the Company's common stock released by the Company from the unallocated account and forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts. Only those participants who are eligible employees of the Company will receive an allocation. Allocations are based on a participant's eligible compensation relative to total eligible compensation. Plan earnings are allocated to each participant's account based on the ratio of the participant's account balance.

Vesting

Participants are vested in their accounts based on years of service. Full vesting is obtained after six years of service or by reaching the normal retirement date as defined by the Plan document, death of a participant or total and permanent disability as defined by the Plan document.

Put Option

Under federal income tax regulations, the Company stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradeable on an established market or is subject to trading limitations, includes a put option. The put option is the right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the current appraised value of the stock. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

Diversification

Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Company common stock into investments that are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 with at least 10 years of participation in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a six-year period. In each of the first five years, a participant may diversify up to 25 percent of the number of post-1986 shares allocated to his or her account, less any shares previously diversified. In the sixth year, the percentage changes to 50 percent. Participants who elect to diversify receive a cash distribution, unless eligible for floor price protection, in which case, shares are distributed. The election to diversify is made subsequent to year end based upon the shares of employer stock in the participant's account at year end.

Forfeitures

Plan forfeitures are allocated to each participant's account based upon the relation of the participant's eligible compensation to total eligible compensation for the Plan year. Forfeitures allocated to participants during December 31, 2024, totaled \$40,540. Forfeited nonvested accounts to be allocated to participant accounts in future years as of December 31, 2024 **and 2023**, were \$43,748 and \$39,039, respectively.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Allocations

The financial statements of the Plan present separately the assets and liabilities, and changes therein, pertaining to (1) the accounts of employees with rights in allocated stock (allocated), and (2) stock not yet allocated to employees (unallocated), including shares that are committed to be released. Shares are released from collateral and become allocated generally in the period in which debt service is actually paid.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The shares of Company common stock are reported at fair value. See Note 4 for a discussion of the fair value measurements. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Realized gains and losses from security transactions are reported on the average cost method. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include: (1) quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; (2) quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; (3) inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; (4) inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The Inline Electric Supply Company, Inc. common stock held by the Plan is reported at fair value based upon an appraisal. This appraisal was based upon a combination of the market and income valuation techniques consistent with prior years as illustrated in the following table.

The valuation process involves Plan management's selection of an independent appraiser. Plan management accumulates the data for the appraiser from the reviewed financial statements of the Company. The appraiser prepares a preliminary report which Plan management, along with the Trustee, reviews in detail, discusses and approves.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

5. ESOP LOAN PAYABLE

The ESOP was funded primarily by a loan of \$18,350,000 entered into by the Trustee of the trust created under the Plan on December 21, 2012. The proceeds of the loan were used to acquire all of the issued and outstanding capital stock of the Company. The loan bears interest at a fixed rate of 3.5%.

The loan is secured by a pledge of unallocated shares of the common stock of the Company. The capital stock will be released as collateral on a pro-rata basis as payments of principal and interest are made. The number of shares released in any year will be the number of shares held as collateral, times the ratio of the current year's principal and interest payments, divided by the total of this year's principal and interest payments, plus all future years' principal and interest payments. This resulted in 40,233.652 and 40,233.652 shares being released and allocated in the Plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The lender has no right against shares that have been released and allocated under the ESOP. Accordingly, the financial statements present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein, related to: (1) stock already released and allocated to participants' accounts and (2) stock not yet allocated to participants' accounts (unallocated).

The agreement provides for the loan to be repaid over 25 years. Maturities of the ESOP loan payable are as follows:

The Company is obligated to make contributions in cash to the Plan, which equal the amount necessary to enable the Plan to make its regularly scheduled payments of principal and interest due on its loan payable.

6. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan invests in Company common stock and has indebtedness guaranteed by the Company. These are related party and party-in-interest transactions. As described in Note 10, the Company paid all Plan expenses. The Plan has a number of service providers. Such providers are parties-in-interest under ERISA.

7. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan investments consist primarily of the Company's common stock, which is exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks, as well as valuation assumptions based on earnings, cash flows and other such techniques. Due to the level of risk associated with the investment in the common stock and to uncertainties inherent in estimates and assumptions, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of the common stock will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

8. PLAN TERMINATION

The Company reserves the right to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to Plan provisions. Upon termination of the Plan, the Plan's Committee directs the Trustee to pay all liabilities and expenses of the ESOP and to sell shares of financed common stock held as collateral to the extent it determines such sale to be necessary in order to repay the loan. Subsequently, the interest of each participant in the trust fund will be distributed to such participant or his or her beneficiary at the time prescribed by the Plan terms and the IRC.

9. TAX STATUS

The Plan has received a determination letter from the IRS dated June 8, 2014, stating that the Plan is qualified under the IRC and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualification. The Plan has been amended and restated since receiving the determination letter; however, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan was qualified, and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions, including the IRS; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

10. ADMINISTRATION OF PLAN ASSETS

The Plan's assets, which consist principally of Company common shares, are held by the Trustee of the Plan. Company contributions are managed by the Trustee, which invests cash received and makes distributions to participants. The Trustee also administers the payment of interest and principal on the loan, which is reimbursed to the Trustee through contributions as determined by the Company.

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Administration expenses for the Trustee's fees are paid directly by the Company. The Company may, at its discretion, require the Plan to reimburse it for administration expenses.
