Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Empire State Highway Contractors Association, Inc. Retirement Plan for the Employees of Tri-City Highway Products, Inc. (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). NOTE A--DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Empire State Highway Contractors Association, Inc. Retirement Plan for the Employees of Tri-City Highway Products, Inc. (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all non-leased and non-union employees of Tri-City Highway Products, Inc. (the Company). Employees are eligible to participate on commencement of employment. Employment with all employer members of the Empire State Highway Contractors Association, Inc. (ESHCA) is credited as service when determining a year of vesting service and eligibility for early retirement. The Plan is subject to the provisions of ERISA. The Board of Governors (BOG) is responsible for the oversight of the Plan. The Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investments, monitors investment performance and reports to the BOG.

All of the Plan's investments are held in a bank-administered trust fund. None of these investments are participant directed.

Contributions: The Company makes contributions to the Plan in an amount equal to the sum of:

- (1) any specified prevailing pension supplement as indicated by wage schedules issued by the New York State Department of Labor under Article 8, Section 220 of the New York State Labor Law, or by the U.S. Department of Labor under the Davis-Bacon Act,
- (2) 1.5% of compensation of participants for whom no contribution is made under (1) above, and
- (3) any additional amount determined by the Company's Board of Directors in its discretion.

Additionally, each participant may elect to voluntarily make employee after-tax contributions, not to exceed amounts which would cause the Plan to violate certain nondiscrimination requirements, or limitations on benefits, through a payroll withholding agreement, or by a lump sum payment to the trust.

NOTE A--DESCRIPTION OF PLAN--Continued

Participant Accounts: Each participant's account is credited with an allocation of (a) the Company's contribution, (b) Plan earnings, and (c) forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts and charged with Plan losses and an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on specified formulas which consider participant earnings and account balances, as defined in the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. In order to be eligible for an allocation of annual Company contributions and forfeitures, a participant must either complete 1,000 hours of service (or such adjustment of hours downward in order to obtain 70% employee eligibility), have attained age 59 ½, retire, die, or become disabled during the Plan year.

Vesting: Vesting of a participant's account is based upon years of service in which a participant is credited with at least 1,000 hours of service (or such adjustment of hours downward as previously noted). Vesting is graded as follows:

	<u>Vested Percentage</u>
After 2 years of vesting service	20%
After 3 years of vesting service	40
After 4 years of vesting service	60
After 5 years of vesting service	80
After 6 years of vesting service	100

Participants always own 100% of their employee after-tax accounts and rollover transfer accounts.

Forfeitures: When termination of employment with the Company occurs, the nonvested portion of a participant's account represents a forfeiture. Forfeitures are held in the participant's account until the participant has incurred 5 consecutive one year breaks-in-service from all employer members. As of the end of each Plan year, forfeitures, which have become available for distribution during such year, are then reallocated to currently active participants in the same manner as the Company's regular contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeitures being held totaled \$153,310 and \$163,382, respectively; forfeitures reallocated in 2024 and 2023 totaled \$24,485 and \$25,079, respectively.

Payment of Benefits: On termination of service due to death, disability or normal retirement (age 65 or age 55 and completion of 6 or more years of vesting service), a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the participant's account balance in either a lump-sum amount, or in periodic payments over a period of up to 15 years.

Payment of Benefits--Continued: In the event of the termination of a participant's employment for any reason other than normal retirement, death or disability, the participant's vested account balance will become payable at his or her normal retirement date. The participant may request that his or her benefits commence as of the beginning of any month after the participant has incurred 3 consecutive one year breaks-in-service from the employer member. A participant that has terminated employment from all employer members and has a vested balance of \$1,000 or less will receive a mandatory lump sum distribution to close out the participant's account. The 3 consecutive year waiting period does not apply to these mandatory distributions. A participant who has not severed employment with the employer member may also request a distribution once they attain age 55 and have completed 6 or more years of vesting service.

NOTE B--SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: The Plan's investments are stated at fair value (see Note D). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The investment in the collective trust is valued at the redemption price of the units of participation as determined by NBT Bank, N.A., the trustee and fund sponsor, and is based on the quoted market value of the underlying investments in the trust. The BOG determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Plan's investment advisors and trustee.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a settlement-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis.

Employer Contributions Receivable: Employer contributions receivable are presented in the statements of net assets available for benefits net of any allowance for credit losses. The Plan Administrator believes that no allowance for credit losses is necessary at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Payments of Benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Events Occurring After Report Date: The Plan Administrator has evaluated events and transactions that occurred between December 31, 2024 and October 7, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued, for possible disclosure and recognition in the financial statements. There were no such events or transactions identified by the Plan Administrator.

NOTE D--FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification Topic 820, "Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures", are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments measured at fair value.

Money market fund: The fair value of the money market fund approximates carrying value due to the nature of the instrument.

Collective trust: The Plan's interest in the collective trust is based on periodic valuations performed by the trustee using current market values of the underlying assets of the fund.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair value. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE E--TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Company by letter dated October 24, 2023 that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

NOTE F--PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE G--RELATED PARTY AND PARTIES IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan has not considered Company contributions to the Plan or benefits paid by the Plan to participants as party in interest transactions.

Tri-City Highway Products, Inc., sponsor of the Plan, is an employer member of ESHCA, a trade association of non-union heavy highway construction contractors. ESHCA acts as third-party contract administrator. Fees paid by the Plan for administrative, accounting, legal, investment management, and other professional services are allocated to the Plan based on its pro rata share of the collective trust's investments. The Plan's administrative expenses amounted to \$18,685 and \$24,939 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The Plan Administrator and legal counsel to the Plan believe all party in interest transactions qualify for either statutory or administrative exemption from the prohibited transaction rules under ERISA.

NOTE H--RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests primarily in a collective trust. The collective trust's underlying securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
