(1) Description of Plan

The following description of the Smithfield Foods, Inc. Bargaining 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established by Smithfield Foods, Inc. The Plan is for the benefit of eligible bargained employees of Smithfield Foods, Inc. and affiliated employers that have adopted the Plan (collectively, the Company). Eligibility requirements for 401(k) and matching contributions are 90 days of service and attainment of age 18. Eligibility for discretionary profit sharing contributions varies based on the related bargaining agreement of the adopting affiliated employer. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The Smithfield Foods, Inc. Investment Committee (Investment Committee) is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and controls and manages the operation and administration of the Plan.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 50% of pre-tax annual compensation or elect after-tax (Roth) contributions, as defined by the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans and certain individual retirement accounts. The Company matching contribution varies based on the related bargaining agreement of the adopting affiliated employers. The Company may make a profit sharing contribution at the discretion of the Company's board of directors. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

The Plan includes automatic compensation reduction contributions for certain bargaining groups whereby a percentage of eligible employees' compensation is deferred unless a contrary election is made.

Investment Options

Participants direct the investment of their accounts into various investment options offered by the Plan, which include registered investment companies and common collective trust funds. In addition, participants may utilize an individual self-directed brokerage option, through which participants are able to invest in a variety of securities including stocks and registered investment companies in accordance with the plan document.

(1) Description of Plan, Continued

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of the Company's contributions and plan earnings, and charged with benefit payments, transaction fees related to participant notes receivable, and allocations of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of service, as defined, and varies based on the applicable collective bargaining agreement.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms extend to five years for general purpose loans and to ten years for the purchase of a primary residence. Participants are limited to one outstanding loan at any point in time. The loans are secured by the balance in the participants' accounts and bear interest at 2% above the prime rate at the preceding month in which the loan was taken. As of December 31, 2024, interest rates ranged from 5.25% to 10.50%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in either a lump-sum amount or various installment and annuity options as provided by the Plan. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. Amounts contributed on a pre-tax basis may only be withdrawn upon demonstration of financial hardship, disability, or after the participant reaches the age of 59.5 years.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$563,186 and \$357,838, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future Company contributions and pay administrative expenses of the Plan. During 2024, forfeitures in the amount of \$945,310 were used to reduce the Company's contributions.

(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates and assumptions.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Contributions from plan participants and the matching contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

The Plan's administrative expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company, as provided by the plan document. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participants' accounts and are included in administrative expenses. Certain administrative functions are performed by employees of the Company. No such employee receives compensation from the Plan. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

(3) Certified Investments

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules, including investments at fair value and notes receivable from participants at December 31, 2024 and 2023 and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Empower Trust Company, LLC (Empower), qualified institution.

(4) Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) *Accounting Standards Codifications (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Registered investment companies and self-directed brokerage accounts: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Registered investment companies held by the Plan are open end investments that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. Registered investment companies are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. Registered investment companies held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common collective trust funds: Valued at the closing NAV of the units held by the Plan at year end. The common collective trust fund NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

(5) Related Party Transactions and Party-In-Interest Transactions

During 2024, fees paid to Empower amounted to \$652,582 for investment management and administrative services. Empower is the plan trustee, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

(6) Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated January 17, 2018, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

(7) Transfers Among Retirement Plans, Net

Transfers of assets among plans occur when a change in the employment status of an employee, who participates in a Smithfield-sponsored retirement plan, causes the employee to change plans due to eligibility requirements. Transfer activity for the year ended December 31, 2024 was as follows:

(8) Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

(9) Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

(10) Prohibited Transactions

During 2023, the Company failed to remit to the Plan's trustee certain employee contributions totaling approximately \$755, within the period prescribed by DOL regulations. These delinquent contributions are considered prohibited transactions as defined by ERISA. The Company is in the process of correcting the 2023 delinquent contributions and related lost earnings in 2025.

During 2024, the Company failed to remit to the Plan's trustee certain employee contributions totaling approximately \$1,278,295 within the period prescribed by DOL regulations. These delinquent contributions are considered prohibited transactions as defined by ERISA. The Company corrected the 2024 delinquent contributions and related lost earnings in fiscal year 2024.
